To Partners And Local Businesses




















On October 23, Gateway welcomed partners and local businesses to the Marino Center in Bridgeton to learn more about the agency's housing development and the Neighborhood Revitalization Tax Credit (NRTC) Program. The agenda included remarks from Albert B. Kelly, President and CEO of Gateway Community Action Partnership; Ed Bethea, Executive Vice President and COO; and a presentation by Tracey Harris, Gateway Housing and Community Development Manager. The presentation included an overview of Gateway's development work, including plans for new single-family homes for first-time homebuyers in the Southeast Gateway (SEG) neighborhood, and NRTC. NRTC is a Department of Community Affairs program that offers businesses tax credit for supporting Gateway's housing and economic development initiatives.

During the event, Kelly presented Bethea with a Leading Neighborhood Revitalization Partnership Award, awarded by the Governor's Conference on Housing and Economic Development to Eastern Pacific Development for our partnership in the River Grove Apartments project.

Other speakers included Susan Catlett, NRTC Program Manager, Esaul Martin, Southeast Gateway Coordinator, and Mae Woodley, Program Lead at the Greater Bridgeton Family Success Center. Partners in attendance included Donovan Architects, which has been working diligently with Gateway to design the plans for the new townhomes, and John Restrepo, President of Restrepo Associates and consultant on this housing project. On Child Abuse Prevention And Fire Safety




