Parking Lot Repairs

Our parking lot will be undergoing crack repair. It is scheduled for the week of October 4 - 8. The areas will need to be roped off from 8:30 AM to about 1:30 PM. No one can park in those areas during the scheduled days. If the weather cooperates, the repair can set up in 30 to 45 minutes allowing us to re-open the lots quicker.

Monday 4 October - southern half of the Main Lot (next to the field)

Tuesday 5 October – northern half of the Main Lot (next to church lot). This will impact midday pickups.

Wednesday 6 October - church lot and front of the church

Thursday 7 October – overflow day for driveway areas and buffer for any unexpected weather.

Friday 8 October – side lot and parking up against the building. No one can park up against the building this day until completed.

Note: This work will not impact the arrival and departure process. However, if you come to the school campus during the day you may see different traffic patterns.
