### From the Principal

Hello Everyone,

We are excited to see all of our Aggie Achievers tomorrow 1/16/24! We are ready for another exciting week of instruction!

Parents - thank you for your patience last week in dealing with the weather days that we experienced. Please trust that we will always strive to make the safest decisions for the students and staff at SGSC. Thank you for your support.

Parents - please stay on top of your child's academic grades by checking the Infinite Campus Parent Portal to see their grades. If you do not have a login, please email me (galmon@sowegastemcharter.org) or Dr. Heather Page (hpage@sowegastemcharter.org) to get your login information for your child.

As we begin the second half of the school year, we are excited to announce that we now have a School Resource Officer on staff - Officer Kyle Williams. He will be attending SRO training and Chief School soon. We are excited to have him on board.

Please speak with your child about behavior as we begin the third quarter of school. We would like to have a lesser amount of referrals as we work toward the end of the year. Some of the most prominent behaviors that we saw during the first nine weeks included - vapes, disrespect toward others, and disruption of the classroom and learning. There are some non-negotiable behaviors that will not be tolerated on the first offense to include drugs and creditable threats to others. It is imperative that we speak about these behaviors, so students will understand that consequences will be applied.

Parents of students that ride buses - PLEASE adhere to the requirements at each location because we cannot afford to lose the places that we are allowed to drop off and pick up at! If you cannot follow the rules, your child will not be able to ride the bus:

- Do not park on the grass or drive on the grass (already received a warning from Miller Supply Co in Cuthbert)
- Do not park near the gas pumps or block entrance of customers (already received 2 warnings from LocStop in Dawson)
- Do not speed through the location
- Be mindful of students exiting the buses
- Do not use profanity or disrespectful language to the drivers, monitors, or other parents and students
- Do not liter

We will be monitoring the weather for Tuesday and will keep you all informed if there are any changes to the school day.

We are having so many Achievers that are being checked out early throughout the week - especially on Fridays. Please remember - EARLY CHECKOUTS ARE DISCOURAGED AFTER 2:30 PM. Early checkouts after 2:30 PM are discouraged due to ongoing instructional practices that include remedial and acceleration opportunities for Achievers. In addition, students are also transitioning to various areas to prepare for dismissal. Please remember that unexcused 5 unexcused tardies and early checkouts will be counted as an absence as well. Although early checkouts are discouraged, we do realize that extenuating circumstances such as doctor's appointments and family emergencies will occur. We will make every effort to accommodate, but please do not come to check your child out to simply avoid waiting in the car rider line.

If you need a change in transportation, you must provide this IN WRITING. This can be through a note sent to school with your child or you can email <a href="mailto:transportation@sowegastemcharter.org">transportation@sowegastemcharter.org</a> to request the change. These requests should be in place no later than 1:30 pm on the day of the request.

Attendance - We are beginning our new attendance policy this year. The basics from this policy are as follows:

- 5 unexcused absences you will receive a letter and attend a conference about attendance
- 7 unexcused absences you will receive a letter with a reminder that your child can only miss 3 more days before he/she may be withdrawn from the school
- 10 unexcused absences your child may be withdrawn from Southwest Georgia STEM Charter School

#### Reminders:

- If your child is absent, he/she will have 3 days to bring in their excuse after returning to school
- You may write up to 3 parent notes during the school year
- Your child will have 3 days to make up any missing assignments while he/she was absent from school










# From the MTSS Coordinator

This coming Thursday, students will bring home their MAP Growth reports for Reading and Math. MAP is a diagnostic test that all students in grades K - 12 take in order to best plan for meeting their academic needs. These reports are specific to your child's academic progress, and will inform you of their fall 2023 score, their winter 2023 score, and if your child is performing above, on, or below grade level.
