# This week's reading selection: Give Me Liberty!

**Summary**: During the sweltering summer of 1776, the Continental Congress met in Philadelphia to debate the relationship between the colonies and Great Britain. Many believed that the time for independence had come, so it was agreed that they would draft what would become the historic declaration of our independence.

**DISCUSS** with your child the purpose and importance of the Declaration of Independence.
