implementation of the science lab will support the ELA standards, specifically
those related to writing, as the students will have to write up reports. The
instructional assistant will support the students with addressing specific skill
deficits and the math interventionist will work with teachers. The home to school
coordinator will be the liaison between home and school to identify and address
any needs/barriers that are preventing a student from being successful.

Teachers will differentiate instruction using the workshop model, technology, the
reading specialist, and instructional assistants. They will also make decisions
based off data collected from their class and discussed in data team meetings.
The Instructional Coach will also support the teachers by collecting and sharing
resources and materials with them as well as provide strategies to improve
instruction. The instructional assistant will work in partnership with the
classroom teacher to identify deficits in the students' learning and work with
those students to address the deficits. The instructional coach, instructional
assistant, and math interventionist will all work to address the needs of the
teachers in order to enhance instruction and student learning.

The use of the Home to School Coordinator will be to assist with bridging the gaps that may take place between home and school and work with parents to eliminate barriers to success. Also, with the large amount of trauma that our students may have experienced during the time out of school, it is necessary to meet their social-emotional needs along with their academic needs. The use of the calming room will be used as a response to intervention for those students that may display behaviors that suggest that an alternative space in the school setting may be beneficial. The math interventionist will work specifically with teachers on how to improve instructional practices in math to ultimately see an increase in the academic performance of the students.
