The day of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico celebrates its independence today and Chile celebrates its independence days on September 18. Noah Wall also had one receiving touchdown. Eli Kell went 7 for 8 for 118 yards and 2 TDs. Defensively Zach Buschlen had a game high 7.5 tackles and a sack. Zach Stegger hit a career long 37-yard field goal. Come out and support the Chemics as they take on Bay City Central this Friday under the lights.

Girls Cross-Country - The varsity ladies took third place in Division II this past Saturday at the Holly Invitational. The Chemics earned this podium finish by a thrilling 1 point over the 4th-place team. Emma McLaughlin led Midland with an 8th-place finish. Sawyer Collins, Addy Jones, and Avery Shepard also earned medalist honors with Hannah Murtha rounding out the scoring runners for Midland. Midland took 2nd place in the JV race led by Emily Gallant's 5th-place finish. Also scoring team points were Ava Kontranowski, Hailey Gordon, Michaela Quinn, and Ella Riddle.

Boys Cross-Country - The varsity boys earned second place in Division I at Saturday's Holly Invitational. Andrew Worsley led the way with an 11th-place finish. Logan Bellinger, Cameron Cochran, and Spencer Porritt also earned medalist honors with Landon Ferren rounding out the scoring runners for Midland. The JV team also

In the semi-finals of bracket play, Midland defeated Montrose 25-22 and 25-18. Facing Lapeer again in the championship finals of the silver bracket the Chemics came away victorious 25-12, 25-18. The Chemics are 6-2-4 on the season and 1-1 in the league. Their next match is home this Tuesday again Saginaw Heritage.
