School Responsibilities

Meadowlake Elementary School will:

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, each teacher will hold parent-teacher conferences relating to student academic achievement on an annual basis. Conferences will also be held at the parents' or teacher's request as needed.
3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows: Progress reports will be sent home at least twice during each quarter and student progress will be available for review on PowerSchool.

- Make sure my child follows Meadowlake's adopted uniform policy.
