
leaders and represent Northside with pride. FCCLA gives students the chance to grow as individuals and build skills that last a lifetime."



PMS FBLA Attends Fall Motivational Rally





PMS Computer Science and Technology Classes Learn About Career Opportunities with the Federal Bureau of Investigation



On October 21, 2025, Agent Thomas Clark and Agent Scott Sengenberger of the Federal Bureau of Investigation visited Perry Middle School to speak with students about career opportunities within the FBI. Hosted by Dr. Diana Phillips, FBLA Adviser, and Lindsey Levie, the agents presented to 8th grade Computer Science and Technology classes. They explained the wide variety of career paths available in the FBI, including roles in criminal investigation, intelligence, forensics, behavioral analysis, and especially cybersecurity. Agent Clark and Agent Sengenberger emphasized the importance of education, leadership, and integrity for anyone interested in a future with the FBI and encouraged students to start building their skills now through programs like FBLA and TSA.

In addition to discussing careers, the agents gave a powerful presentation on cybercrime and how students can stay safe online. They shared real-world examples of online threats such as identity theft, phishing, and social media scams, and emphasized the need for students to protect their personal information. The agents stressed the

importance of responsible digital citizenship and thinking before posting or sharing online. Their visit not only inspired students to consider future opportunities in law enforcement and cybersecurity but also reminded them of the serious responsibilities that come with using technology in today's world.
