

Dear Parishioners,

Recently, I started reading a new book *The Rise of the Occult* by Charles Fraune. His first book that I read was *Slaying Dragons* – *What Exorcists Want You to Know*. These books serve as a stark warning, first that the demons are real and causing harm to those not protected by their faith in Jesus Christ, but how the occult is tempting and a doorway into such problems. He would include in the occult things we of course would recognize as evil – Wicca, witchcraft, Satanism – but also 'tools' and practices that seem innocuous at first but how the demonic lures deeper – tarot, horoscopes (star charts and such), Ouija and spirit boards, transcendental meditation, mindfulness and centering prayer (eliminating thoughts and emotions, as opposed to the Christian practice of centering one's attention on God) Reiki and yoga.

Some of these I am certain will cause concern. Yoga is a spiritual practice in which the various poses are to invoke various deities in the Hindu pantheon, and unwittingly are 'prayers' to those gods. The book gives a stark warning against these practices as they too often lead into other occult practices.

I have seen the fruits of such lenient attitudes of acceptance and tolerance of these practices as rage when they are warned against – if they were good and holy, why the rage? I met a practitioner of Reiki, a form of energy healing, who was so angry when I simply warned her that the philosophical and theological background was inconsistent with the Catholic or Christian faith – it was a healing that the person claimed to do through their own power, not God's.

Let me be clear that Church issues a strong warning against participating in certain practices because they are not of God and lead into deeper trouble. People leave the practice of the faith having been drawn away by something that seems so good as centering prayer. They have some positive experiences with it, start researching and more practice, and delve deeper into the non-Christian realities that undergird the practice.

This is because there is an ambiguity between praying centering on the Lord and perhaps scripture, taking time to be mindful of our breath and the presence of Christ. This is good. But there is also a centering prayer that shuts out all thoughts, purposely excludes considering the presence of Christ, avoids thoughts and emotions.

Yoga, too, is touted as a great way to stretch and exercise, which is good, but again unwittingly it is a prayer to pagan gods and rooted in a philosophy and theology that is very different. There are solid alternatives — https://aleteia.org/2018/07/07/5-alternatives-to-yoga-that-catholics-can-try/ lists five, and I have

heard wonderful things about SoulCore that provides stretching exercises while praying the rosary.

Why do I share this? Not only because I am concerned by how innocuous the doorway is, but I am concerned by its ubiquitous nature. Reiki, yoga, and centering prayer are often now promoted in hospitals, and people are being led astray. Further, we are seeing a further secularization that rejects God but desires something beyond us – so many turn to the occult.

Exorcists are reporting a rise in problems – those afflicted with demonic obsessions and processions. We do not have to fear, as those who are in Christ are protected by Him, but it takes diligence to avoid the pitfalls. We know that Christ has conquered, and we are more than conquerors in Him, and He is the only place we find freedom and happiness.

LITURGY MATTERS #25

After the assembly sings the Holy, Holy, Holy, all the people kneel, while the priest alone remains standing and, with outstretched arms, again takes up the prayer directly addressed to God the Father.

The people kneeling and the priest alone standing and saying the prayer is meant to indicate even more clearly that the whole body directs its prayer to the Father only through the head, Christ. Kneeling here is meant also as a gesture of adoration.

In the Roman rite since the time of the reform of the liturgy mandated by the Second Vatican Council, one of four different Eucharistic prayers is chosen for any given celebration of Mass. All of these prayers begin with the dialogue, a preface, and the singing of the angelic song. Now as the priest continues, he "confesses" God.

In acknowledging God, we recall before Him the wonders of creation and the great deeds He worked in history for our salvation. The priest's words recognize this and celebrate it with the words:

"We come to you, Father, with praise and thanksgiving." Alternatively, "Father, you are holy indeed, and all creation rightly gives you praise." Or, "We acknowledge you, Holy Father, for you are great, and you have fashioned all your works in wisdom and love."

Poetic language manages to express a lot with a little. The language here is dense and evocative. A single phrase, word, or concept will represent before God whole epochs of what He has done for us. If we acknowledge to the Father what He has done for us, we will come quickly to the Son and the Spirit He has sent to us.

"And you so loved the world, Holy Father, that when the fullness of time had come, you sent your only begotten Son to us as Savior." Or, "All life, all holiness comes through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, by the working of the Holy Spirit." Of course, God already knows these things. But He wants to hear from us that we know, and this is exactly what we say to Him. This is the biblical sense of confessing.




