

Admission Requirements For Pharmacy Technician Requirements:

All Applicants:

1. Must have a high school diploma or the equivalency thereof (GED) or be a Dual Enrolled High School Junior who will turn 17 years old before completing the Pharmacy Technician Program. All high school Juniors must be on track to meet all high school graduation requirements. All applicants under 18 must have parent/legal guardian consent to enroll.
2. Must be able to read, write and speak the English language.
3. All Dual Enrolled High School students must have a GPA of 2.0 or higher
4. All Dual Enrolled High School students will have to take an entrance test.
5. **ATI-TEAS TEST (for Adult Applicants Only):**
Practical nursing applicants must take the nursing entrance exam (ATI-TEAS). The desired proficiency level score is a minimum of 48%. All test results should **not** be older than one (1) year from the date of application submission.

Remotely proctored TEAS scores will not be accepted. Only scores from an official testing site/facility will be accepted.

A copy of your ATI-TEAS results must be uploaded into your nursing application.

**This exam is offered at Gadsden Technical College (GTC), for a fee of \$85.00.
You must register for testing in advance.**

Current registration will begin April 1st.

6. HEALTH & IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants are required to be in good mental and physical health.

Applicants are required to provide proof of the following current immunizations:

- Tetanus, within the past 10 years (Td or Tdap).
- MMR x2 (given on or after the applicant's first birthday). Official documentation of immunity (titer results; must submit actual numerical value) is also acceptable.
- Hepatitis B series or titer. (titer results; must submit actual numerical value)
- Varivax x2. Official documentation of immunity (titer results; must submit actual numerical value) is also acceptable.
- PPD/Tuberculin test within past 12 months (a TB blood test is preferred)
*PPD/Tuberculin skin testing is valid for one (1) year from date of administration. Students who test positive for tuberculosis must show proof of a negative chest x-ray to satisfy this requirement.
- COVID Vaccine (at least 2 doses) is *recommended*.
- Flu Vaccine (within 12 months) is *recommended*.

Once these forms are completed, they must be uploaded into your nursing application.

7. REFERENCES (For Dual Enrolled High School Students):

High school students are required to submit **two (2)** reference letters from: Their current or past high school teacher, their guidance counselor, or a high school administrator. Each reference letter must contain **contact information** and a **signature from the individual who provided the reference**.

8. REFERENCES (For Adults):

Applicants must submit **three (3)** current reference letters: two professional references (recent employers, former teachers, counselors, etc...) and one personal reference (**not** a family member). All three reference letters should be **typed**, must contain **contact information** and a **signature from the individual who provided the reference**. **Preferably all references should be on a letterhead.**

Once all three (3) reference letters have been obtained, they must be uploaded into your nursing application.

9. TRANSCRIPT:

Applicants must submit an official **sealed/unopened** high school transcript and transcripts from any college(s) attended.

Transcripts may be sent electronically via the FASTER system (*preferred method*)

10. BACKGROUND SCREENINGS:

This screening process will be directed by the Program's staff at a later date. No action is required by the applicant at this time.

A Level II criminal background screening is required once accepted into the program. Students must have a clear background in order to participate in the mandatory clinical rotation, as well as to obtain licensure.

11. DRUG SCREENING:

This screening process will be directed by the Program's staff at a later date. No action is required by the applicant at this time.

All students must submit to random drug screenings after entering the Pharmacy Technician Program and prior to having access to the clinical health care facilities utilized in the Program. This is a Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO) requirement demanded of all acute care facilities.

12. INTERVIEW:

After all documents have been uploaded and submitted (and the applicant has met minimum qualifications), an interview with the designated faculty member(s) will be scheduled. All interviews will be completed before acceptance into the program.

ACCEPTANCE:

Meeting the criteria for selection does not guarantee admission to the Program. Final selection will be based on the qualified applicant pool and space available. Applicants who have met the requirements for admission will be selected based on a defined point system and the number of available seats.

Successful application submission is dependent upon meeting all the requirements.



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

LENGTH OF PROGRAM:

The program is 1,050 hours and takes approximately 10 months to complete for full-time students and 20 months to complete for part-time students.

CLASS/CLINICAL TIMES:

Pharmacy Technician classroom days and hours are: Monday -Friday

There is a full-time section that attends class in the morning and afternoon. There are two different part time sections, one in the morning and the other in the afternoon.

COST OF PROGRAM:

The cost of the Pharmacy Technician Program is approximately \$ 4,550.00. (**Note: This amount is subject to change**). Payments are divided into three-payment blocks and are due at the beginning of each payment block without exception. Uniforms and supplies costs are not included into the cost of the program.

Most cost for Dual Enrolled High School Students is waved.
