Rebel wrestlers made a big impact at state as both of our competitors earned hardware.

Senior Trinity Barrus earned a silver at the last meet of her high school career. She pinned her way into the finals where she lost to a girl from Florence-Carlton. This is her third state wrestling medal for the Rebels. Trinity is currently talking to several colleges about continuing her education and wrestling career.

Junior Maisie Barrus brought home a fifth place medal. She pinned her opponents in the first two matches in Billings, lost in the consolation and semifinals, and battled her way back to fifth. Her overall record of the season was 18-6. She was also noted as the "quick pin" of the girls' tournament, beating her opponent in eleven seconds in the fifth-sixth match. (Trinity held that honor until Maisie wrestled her final match.)

On Thursday, the basketball teams went to Harlowton where the JV girls won by four (38-34), the varsity girls won 64-32, and the varsity boys lost 52-32. On Friday, the teams held senior night in Hysham vs. Broadview-Lavina. The JV girls won 53-22, the varsity girls won 36-28, and the varsity boys lost 66-56. Saturday night ended the regular season for the teams; varsity girls won 47-14, and varsity boys won 52-46.

Rebels head into districts in Lockwood this weekend. The girls are ranked second and have a first-round bye, and the boys are ranked third and will meet Northern Cheyenne again on Thursday.


