Ada City Schools is pleased to announce summer school enrollment is now open for students at Ada Junior High for both class/credit recovery and for advancement by earning high school credits during the summer.

<u>Class/Credit Recovery for current 7th-8th-9h (for failed/incomplete courses) complete this</u> <u>application:</u>

- * Session 1: May 28 June 21 (no school June 19)
- * Session 2: June 24 July 19 (no school July 4-5)
- * Time: 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
- * 7th-8th attends M-TH.
- * 9th grade meets daily.

Note: 7th-8th grade students have an option to transition to the C3 Summer Program: Cougars, Curriculum & Camp on the campus of Ada High School *during the month of June only*. C3 provides an opportunity for students to transition from curriculum in the morning to exploring extracurriculars in the afternoon. If you are interested in the afternoon C3 program please let Mr. Lowrance know and complete the application form for the C3 program.

For students seeking high school credit advancement, we are offering Algebra II, Geometry, and Spanish I on the campus of Ada High School. Classes will meet daily from 8:00 a.m. - 12 p.m., May 28 - July 19. Students must attend and pass the course to earn credit. *Please complete the Ada High School Summer Enrollment Form rather than this one.*

Descriptions of high school courses available to JH students:

Algebra II - currently enrolled 9th graders who have completed Algebra I and Geometry. Note: taking Algebra I as an 8th grader does not count towards 3 math credits required in 9th-12th grade. By taking it as an 8th grader this allows the student to earn four math credits for the student's HS transcript (grades 9-12).

Geometry - currently enrolled 9th grade students who have already taken Algebra I

Spanish I - currently enrolled 9th graders

Note -Students may take only one high school credit course.

There is no charge for summer school. Meals for breakfast and lunch as well as transportation will be available.
