Parent Tips & Resources

Why Empathy Matters?

- Improves social skills
- Reduces risk of emotional and behavioral problems.
- Strengthens family bonds and connection, particularly during difficult moments.
- Helps develop internal
 motivations for kindness rather
 than relying on rewards and punishments

Model Empathy

- Practice Empathy with Your Child: you might say, "I see you're really disappointed that the game was canceled. It's okay to feel sad about that."
- Show Empathy for Others: Let your children see you expressing concern and kindness towards family, friends, and even strangers.
- Discuss Your Own Feelings and Empathy: When you feel an emotion, label it and explain how you reached an understanding of someone else's perspective. After being cut off in traffic, you might say, "I felt angry when that car cut me off, but I tried to think that maybe they are having an emergency."
- Volunteer Together: Expose your children to different life experiences helping people in your community.


