- The CSA and BA reported that there is a backlog in production of the generator's
 automatic transfer switch because the third-party manufacturer that Eaton uses has gone
 out of business. Eaton is now producing the controllers itself. The CSA remains in contact
 with Foley's manager who most recently stated that although production of the controllers
 has begun, an ETA is still unknown at this time.
- The Business Administrator stated that she received confirmation that the district can use ESSER funds to finance purchases through NJ regional/local/county co-ops. National co-ops cannot be used for public works or construction contracts which is the category under which the air conditioning in the gym project falls. The district may have to go out to bid for this project.
- Samantha Boonstra, Remington & Vernick Engineers, met with Mr. Schenck on September 14 to make a final determination on the placement of the future pole barn, sheds, and dumpsters. The final drawing of the parking lot expansion project will include these items and allow for lips in the pavement for vehicles to be driven into the pole barn and sheds and gain close access to the dumpsters as needed.
