RESOLUTION OF NOTICE OF DISMISSAL VISION CARE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the 2005 Appropriations Act of the General Assembly included legislation requiring that every child in the state obtain a comprehensive eye examination conducted by a North Carolina licensed optometrist or ophthalmologist within six months prior to the first day of the school year; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education joined the North Carolina School Boards Association and local school boards across North Carolina to challenge the constitutionality of this legislation in litigation captioned, *North Carolina School Boards Association, et al., v. State of North Carolina, et al., 06 CVS 002544*; and

WHEREAS, in July 2006 the General Assembly enacted and the Governor approved H.B. 2699, "An Act to Make Changes to the Vision Care Program;" and

WHEREAS, H. B. 2699 removes the requirement that every incoming kindergarten child obtain a comprehensive eye exam and limits the requirement to children who receive and fail to pass a prescribed eye screening; and

WHEREAS, H.B. 2699 provides that "no child shall be excluded from attending school for a parent's failure to obtain a comprehensive eye examination" required under state law; and

WHEREAS, H.B. 2699 provides that any required comprehensive eye examination be conducted by a duly licensed optometrist or ophthalmologist, but does not limit the providers to professionals licensed in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, due to the changes in the Vision Care Program resulting from enactment of H.B. 2600, the constitutional issues raised in North *Carolina School Boards Association, et al. v. State of North Carolina, et al.* have been resolved.

WHEREAS, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Randolph County Board of Education hereby agrees to join in filing a Notice of Dismissal of North Carolina School Boards Association, et al. v. State of North Carolina, et al., 06 CVS 002544.

Offer to Purchase and Contract for Property

P. Guthrie made a motion seconded by B. Coltrane that the Board approve an Option to Purchase Contract with Cranford A. Jones, Clark M. Pierce, and Nancy J. Keeter, Trustees, for a 125 acre tract located at 4118 Finch Farm Road, Trinity, North Carolina, with a \$1,000 deposit.

NCSBA Voting Delegates

Board Chair, LaVerne Williams, appointed Paul Guthrie, Grady Lawson, Tommy McDonald, and Becky Coltrane as voting delegates to the 2006 NCSBA Annual Conference.

Testing Update

Vicki Moss, Director of Testing and Accountability, reviewed the ABC performance and growth models. For performance students are tested in reading and math (new test added to model) grades 3-8, writing grades 4, 7, and 10 (added to the model), alternate assessments, computer skills test grade 8, End of Course High School Algebra I grade 8, Civics and U. S. History (added to the model). New growth formulas (which determine teacher bonuses) have been developed for this year. Individual student growth will be based on two-year prior test scores. Reading and math growth is calculated independently. Growth is measured based on academic change. We can expect to see lower performance composites and fewer schools make growth.

Resolution Authorizing Emergency Budget Amendment

Finance Officer Todd Lowe presented a Budget Resolution authorizing an emergency budget amendment to move \$1.5 million from the Current Expense Fund Balance to the Capital Outlay Budget for 2006-2007 for science lab upgrades, cultural arts improvements, air conditioning for three high school gymnasiums, additional buses, and facilities for staff development. G. Lawson made a motion seconded by G. Cook that the Board approve the budget resolution as presented. The motion carried: 7-0. The budget resolution as follows will be submitted to County Commissioners for approval:

RANDOLPH COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EMERGENCY BUDGET AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, students entering the ninth (9th) grade for the first time in 2006-2007 and beyond will be required to meet new high school exit standards by the State; and whereas Biology, Physics, Physical Science and Chemistry are tested as end-of-course (EOC) assessments in the ABC's guidelines promulgated by the State Board of Education; and whereas existing high school science labs need to be upgraded in order to meet the challenges of these new directives from the State; and

WHEREAS, the Randolph County Board of Education does not have exclusive access to a large meeting room in the McDowell Center; and whereas space must also be leased for staff development and other training sessions; further, that efforts to remedy the abovesaid issues long term have been unsuccessful; and whereas, due to the critical space needs at Central Office, the Randolph County Board of Education is in need of an additional meeting facility; and

WHEREAS, due to substantial reduction in energy costs in recent weeks, the construction climate is currently more favorable for seeking bids to install air conditioning for the three county high schools gymnasiums that currently lack the same, to wit: Eastern Randolph High School, Southwestern Randolph High School and Trinity High School; and

WHEREAS, the four (4) high schools have immediate need for funds to pay for capital improvements planned or already incurred by the respective booster clubs of each school; and whereas cultural arts are also in need of theatre and band upgrades, including but not limited to, facility improvements, uniforms, instruments and other equipment; and

WHEREAS, due to increased enrollment of students, many school buses are having to perform double routes to transport children to and from county schools; and whereas, an immediate need for additional bus(es) is imperative to alleviate long delays in the double route areas; and

WHEREAS, the sum of \$1.5 million is needed to address the above-referenced needs of the Randolph County Schools in the areas of facilities, transportation and equipment.

THEREFORE, THE RANDOLPH COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION resolves that:

- 1. Pursuant to N. C. G. S. § 115C-433 the Randolph County Board of Education can seek budget amendments to transfer money to or from the capital outlay fund to or from any other fund with approval of the Randolph County Board of Commissioners.
- 2. The sum of \$1,500,000.00 be transferred from the Current Expense Fund Balance to the Capital Outlay Budget of the Randolph County Board of Education.
- 3. The Chairperson of the Randolph County Board of Education, Superintendent and/or his designated agent be authorized to execute all documents necessary to accomplish this budget amendment.

Wide Area Network

Nan York, Director of Technology, and her staff presented information on the Wide Area Network (WAN), explaining its use for web hosting, internet access, on-line testing, curriculum programs, cafeteria management, and computer skills integration. The band width of the WAN is extremely small for the needs of the system, especially in light of the fact that additional on-line testing, NC Wise, on-line databases, surveillance cameras, back-up tapes, and additional web hosting will be needed in the future. The WAN costs \$248,244 yearly. An estimated \$640,000 will be needed to provide the amount of bandwidth needed.
