## Nurses Notes:

With the end of the school year fast approaching, it is time to think about physicals for the next school year. Illinois Law states that all children entering pre-school, kindergarten, sixth grade, and ninth grade, as well as new students from out of state, must have a current physical exam, dated no less than one year from the start of the new school year. Immunizations need to be updated at that time also.

For any ongoing health problems (allergies, Asthma, Diabetes, A.D.D., A.D.H.D., Migraines, seizures, intestinal disturbances, and so on) please remember if your child takes medication during the school day, the medication forms need to be filled out by your child's doctor and yourself on a yearly basis. The medication, whether prescription or non-prescription, must be brought to the school in the original package. Medication must be left in the school office. No medication is to be kept in students' possession or lockers.

Dental examinations are required by law for grades kindergarten, second, sixth, ninth grade, as well as new students from out of state. Vision examinations are required by law for kindergarten and all new students from out of state.

Sport physicals need to be filled out on an "IHSA" form. You may pick these up in the school offices. School physicals can be used for sports; however, sports physicals cannot be used for school.

## Dental Exams Due

All students in grades Kindergarten, 2nd, 6th, and 9th need to have dental exams completed and forms turned into the office by May 16th!
