Dear Parishioners,

Our continued prayers for healing for Cynthia Moorse who

had a serious heart attack last week. Rest well, Cynthia.

On Monday of this week, I will be traveling back to the Heart Hospital to consult with the electrophysiologist again. There has been little improvement of the heart since the last visit, and I am certain that the topic of invasive intervention in the form of a pacemaker or ICD will be discussed. I am a little surprised that there is no improvement or that I feel as good as I do being as compromised as the tests suggest. On another note, the results from the endoscope came back inconclusive. At this time, I continue to be in medical limbo. Thankfully, I have not had an incident involving stomach pain since November (and even then I was able to keep it from getting seriously painful.)

This weekend, we have the last of the Search Series, entitled "Why a Church?" The synopsis: How do I access this man who lived 2000 years ago? How do I live this call of love? We uniquely encounter the love of God in His church. But really? The church? There are so many negative views of the church. It's out of touch. It's full of bad people. It's iust too boring.

Maybe when we say "The Church" we mean a little more. The church is the family of God that's been lovingly gathered through our entire story. It's the place we were meant to encounter His grace that prepares us for every step of life. The God that is love knows how we're made - materially and spiritually – we need tangible ways to live our faith. We can't be spiritual but not religious.

This is where we'll find ultimate happiness in life. This is where the God that has been seeking humanity, who wrote the deepest desires onto our human hearts, encounters us. Jesus' first words to humanity in the Gospel of John are "what do you seek?" The one that asked the question not only knows the answer, He is the answer. The answer to everything. And, you find him most profoundly here in His church.

In the next weeks, we will look at a few topics including Blessed Michael McGivney as we prepare for the 140th anniversary of the founding of the Knights of Columbus. Please watch for more information.

REMINDER – Participate in the Mass Experience

The saintly Pope who conceived the phrase "active participation in the Mass" and used it first was Pope Saint Pius X. This is how he explained it: "If you wish to participate in the Mass actively, you must follow with your eye, heart and mouth all that happens on the altar. Further, you must pray with the Priest the holy words said by him in the Name of Christ and which Christ says by him.

First, active participation means the interior participation of all the powers of the soul in the mystery of Christ's

Sacrificial Love. It also means, that the mind and heart are awake, alert and engaged during the Eucharistic celebration. Secondly, Participation involves exterior action: saying things and doing things. We are talking about the bodily gestures and sacred signs we use during the course of the Mass, that is, the relationship between soul and body in liturgical prayer. In other words, it must be the whole person who carries out the liturgical activity. Full, active participation at the Eucharistic liturgy involves conscious presence, praying, singing, acting in union with the whole assembly.
