Attendance Expectations and Procedures

Attendance is expected everyday of a program. Take a look at the program calendar to ensure a good fit with your family's summer schedule. If a student enrolls in a program and doesn't show up for summer programming, the school will make efforts to contact the family. If contact is unsuccessful, the school will open the spot for a student on the waiting list to attend.
