PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Parishioners of St. Therese,

Christ is Risen, Alleluia! Indeed, He is Risen, Alleluia!

May you always seek "the Living One" and the new life that awaits you in this Easter season!

Below is **St. John Paul II's last Easter message** ("*Urbi et Orbi*") delivered by him as Pope on March 31, 2002—still a very relevant plea for peace for our world right now! **A Blessed Easter to all of you! —Fr. Peter**

"Resurrexit, alleluia—He is risen, alleluia! This year, too, the joyous proclamation of Easter, which echoed powerfully at last night's vigil, strengthens our hope. 'Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen' (Luke 24:5-6). Thus, the angel encouraged the women who had hastened to the tomb. The Easter liturgy repeats to us, the men and women of the third millennium: Christ is risen, Christ is alive among us! His name now is 'the Living One,' death has no more power over Him (Romans 6:9).

"Resurrexit! Today you, O Redeemer of mankind, rise victoriously from the tomb to offer to us, troubled by many threatening shadows, your wish for joy and peace.

Those who are tempted by anxiety and desperation turn to you, O Christ, our life and our guide, to hear the proclamation of the hope that does not disappoint. On this day of your victory over death, may humanity find in you, O Lord, the courage to oppose in solidarity the many evils that afflict it.

"May the work of national and international institutions hasten the overcoming of the present difficulties and favor progress toward a more effective and peaceful world order. May world leaders be confirmed and sustained in their efforts to resolve satisfactorily the continuing conflicts that cause bloodshed in certain regions of Africa, Iraq, and the Holy Land. You, firstborn of many brothers, grant that all who consider themselves children of Abraham may rediscover the brotherhood that they share and that prompts in them designs of cooperation and peace.

"Take heed all of you who have at heart mankind's future! Take heed, men and women of good will! May the temptation to seek revenge give way to the courage to forgive; may the culture of life and love render vain the logic of death; may trust once more give breath to the lives of peoples. If our future is one, it is the task and duty of all to build it with patient and painstaking farsightedness.

"Lord, to whom shall we go? You who have conquered death, you alone 'have the words of eternal life' (John 6:68). To you we raise with confidence our prayer which becomes an invocation of comfort for the families of the many victims of violence. Help us to work ceaselessly for the coming of that more just and united world that you have inaugurated with your resurrection. Accompanying us in this task is 'she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord' (Luke 1:45). Blessed are you, O Mary, silent witness of Easter! You, O Mother of the Crucified One now risen, who at the hour of pain and death kept the flame of hope burning, teach us also to be, among the incongruities of passing time, convinced and joyful witnesses of the eternal message of life and love brought to the world by the Risen Redeemer."



A Modern Saint for a Modern World Carlo Acutis to Be Canonized

Next Sunday, April 27, the Catholic Church will celebrate the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis, a remarkable young man who is widely recognized as the first millennial to be declared a saint. Carlo was born in 1991 in London and raised in Milan, Italy. From a young age, he had an extraordinary devotion to the Eucharist and a deep love for God. He attended daily Mass, prayed the Rosary regularly, and showed great kindness to the poor and marginalized—even offering his own meals to those in need.

What makes Carlo especially relatable to today's youth is how he embraced holiness in the modern world. A gifted tech whiz, he used his computer skills to create an online catalog of Eucharistic miracles from around the world—believing firmly that “the Eucharist is my highway to Heaven” (his site is still running! Go to <https://www.miracolieucaristici.org/> and click “English”). His life combined faith and technology in a way that speaks powerfully to our teens and young adults today.

On October 12, 2006, Carlo died of leukemia at just 15 years old, having offered his suffering for the Pope and the Church. When his body was exhumed as part of the canonization process, it was found to be incorrupt—a sign of his sanctity and the grace of God. His canonization is a significant event, especially for our Catholic youth. Carlo is proof that sanctity is not out of reach—it is possible, even in sneakers and with a laptop in hand. May his life inspire our young people to walk boldly in faith, using their own gifts to serve Christ.




"The Mystery of the Church": Classes with Fr. Stephen Watson

GIVING OUR CONTEMPORARIES REASON FOR HOPE." During the class we will look at Pope Benedict XVI's encyclical on hope, called ***Spe Salvi (Saved in Hope)***. The title comes from a quote in St. Paul's letter to the Romans, "In hope we were saved". All are welcome to attend!



The Tomb is Empty... Our Hearts are Full!

The tomb is empty! He Is Risen! Easter morning dawns with a joy that cannot be contained. The Gospel of John tells us that Mary Magdalene arrived at the tomb early, only to find the stone rolled away. Peter and the beloved disciple ran to see, and though the tomb was empty, they began to believe. The Resurrection is not just a moment in history—it's the heart of our faith. "He is not here," the angels said in another Gospel, "He has risen." Today, we echo that truth in joyful chorus. What they saw wasn't just a mystery—it was the dawning of hope, the breaking of a new and eternal day.

Peter, who once denied Christ, now boldly proclaims in Acts (10:34,37–43) that Jesus, crucified and risen, has been appointed judge of the living and the dead. And yet, this Judge comes not with condemnation, but with mercy and salvation. "Everyone who believes in Him will receive forgiveness of sins through His name." Easter is not just a celebration of one event long ago—it is a declaration of God's mercy alive and active in our own lives today. Psalm 118 sings the joy of the Resurrection with exultant praise: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad!" The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone of our faith.



St. Paul's words in Colossians remind us that the Resurrection is not just about Jesus rising—it's about our own rising too. "Seek what is above," Paul urges, "where Christ is seated at the right hand of God." Easter challenges us to leave behind what is earthly and broken and to live as people of hope. The tomb is empty, but our hearts are full. Let this Easter renew our trust in God's promises and fill our lives with resurrection joy!

Easter invites each of us to rise with Christ—to seek what is eternal, to be transformed by grace, and to live as witnesses of His victory over death. Let our alleluias ring out in every heart and home today. Christ is risen—and so is our hope!
