Course Description:		This is an advanced acting course. In this course, students will continue to build upon the foundation introduced in Acting 1-2. During this year students will be exposed to advanced acting techniques based on principles ranging from technical to method. In addition, the goal of this course is to acquaint students with all major phases of production necessary for the successful staging of a play. Students are required to participate in one major production each semester as well as monologue preparation. This course is designed to take students from a state of "Artistic Instinct" to "Artistic Intelligence."					
Prerequisite:		Acting 1-2 & Instructor Approval					
Course Learning Units:		 As a continuation, the learning units for this course will include those aspects needed for a fully realized production process of two plays as well as individual monologues. Students will reinforce and learn new elements of: creative state, discovering physical actions, defining objectives, observation, relating to the stage environment, creating character, interpretation of lines, communicating subtext, monologue preparation and performance, scene work. 					
Major Course Assignments and Projects:		 This course will produce 2 fully realized productions. Students must be available for all tech week rehearsals and performances. NO CONFLICTS! This is a project score that is heavily graded for this course. THERE IS NO EXTRA CREDIT OR MAKE UP ASSIGNMENT FOR THIS PROJECT. PLEASE PLAN ACCORDINGLY WITH YOUR SCHEDULES. YOU HAVE PLENTY OF NOTICE. Each student will be responsible for a fully realized monologue performance that is competition ready (this does not mean you must go to a competition). Assignment Policies:

Assignments shall be completed on time in a neat and organized manner utilizing the directions for the assignment.

Attendance & Absence:

Tardiness:

A student not in his/her assigned seat when the tardy bell rings is considered tardy. Absent Work:

Purpose:

- Homework should be purposeful, intentional, and relevant to instruction.
- All types of homework should promote high-quality learning and achievement.
- Teachers introduce new concepts, information, and skills in school, **not** in homework.

Time:

- Time spent on homework should be purposeful in terms of learning and skill acquisition.
- Homework may be assigned on a daily or long-range basis where students can expect an average of 70 to 120 minutes per night encompassing all subject areas.

Academic Dishonesty:
