Hearing and Vision Screening Midland County Health Department

Michigan Law requires hearing and vision screening at least once between the ages 3-5 before your child enters kindergarten. The Public Health Code Act 368 of 1978, Section 9307 states that "a parent, guardian, or person in *loco parentis* applying to have a child registered for the first time in a kindergarten or first grade in a school in this state shall present to school officials, at the time of registration or not later than the first day of school, a certificate of hearing and vision testing or screening or statements of exception under Section 9311".

Children are also screened for hearing in kindergarten, 2nd, and 4th grades. Vision is screened in 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, and 9th grades. These screenings are provided by the Midland County Health Department **at no cost to families.**

We are required by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services to follow up on all students who have been referred.
