All students should remain in the classroom until their dismissal time.

Dual enrollment students do not have to report to the school until 2nd block, even on the days they do not have class at JSCC.

MORNING DROP-OFF

All K-12 riders will enter through the main door by the office. Please stay in the right lane, pull to the crosswalk, and allow students to exit on the passenger side (sidewalks side). Please BE PATIENT. Do NOT change lanes until you have passed the crosswalk and given the okay. Please have students ready to exit quickly. All elementary students will be directed to the cafeteria instead of being allowed to go down the high school hall. If they do not eat breakfast, they can walk through the cafeteria and exit into the courtyard to go to their buildings. There will be staff on duty in various areas to supervise and direct students.

PreK will drop off at the elementary gym, located behind the school, via an access road. Please drop students off on the sidewalk connecting to the gym. Stay on the LEFT side so that your student will not have to walk around the vehicle. Siblings of Pre-K students are allowed to be dropped off in the back with Pre-K but will not be allowed to enter the building until 7:25 am. For the safety of our Pre-K students, it is VITAL that you arrive on time to drop your child off with their class in the elementary gym. After the 2nd late dropoff, a parent contact will be made by administration to discuss the issue.

LATE ARRIVALS

If the main entrance door is no longer open, that means the bell has rung and school has officially begun. The student is tardy. You will need to escort the student inside and sign them in before the student can enter. Only students who drive are allowed to sign themselves in, however, if tardies become an issue for the student driver, the administration can revoke driving privileges on campus.

Dual Enrollment Students are given ample time to get back to campus from JSCC. However, the dates that they are not attending JSCC and are not required to be on the MHS campus until 2nd Block if they do not arrive in time, they will need to check in through the office as a tardy for class.

AFTERNOON PICK-UP

Pre-K students will be picked up in front of the school at the gates near the High School Gym 2:00 pm. All Pre-K should be picked up no later than 2:15pm. There are no exceptions for afternoon pick-up for siblings of pre-K. They will have to dismiss at their scheduled times and locations.

Elementary Students will be picked up from the Elementary Gym located on the access road behind the school. We will begin loading cars at 2:35pm. Stay in the left lane so that students can enter on the driver's side of the car. Someone will give you the okay when it is safe to proceed to the main road.

High School students will be picked up from the main parking lot when the final bell rings at 2:43pm. Please stay to the right, and pull all the way up to the end of the sidewalk (past the awning). Students will enter from the passenger side. Someone will give you the okay when it is safe to proceed to the main road.

If you are picking up both High School and Elementary Students, follow the High School student pick up instructions every day (even if your high school student is absent or participating in a school activity).

Only LCTC students who drive to school are allowed to leave the school when they arrive back to campus. All other students will have a designated, supervised area to wait for the dismissal bell.

***There will be no checkouts allowed after 2:15 pm each day to allow for an orderly and safe dismissal of all our students.**

BUS NOTES

Any bus rider who will be riding a different bus OR students riding a bus home with someone who is not typically a bus rider MUST bring a signed note from home that is turned in to the office by 9:00am. The note will be verified and the student will receive an official permission slip from the office that is to be given to the bus driver by the student when loading the bus. All bus drivers have been told by the Transportation Supervisor that a student will NOT be allowed to ride the bus without this official form from the school office stating permission was verified.

DRIVING ON CAMPUS

The speed limit within the MHS parking lot is 5 MPH. Please keep everyone safe!

Student drivers must have a parking permit purchased from the MHS office. The cost of the permit is \$25. Student driving and parking on campus is a privilege and this privilege can be revoked if deemed necessary by MHS Administration. Some examples of situations in which this may be considered are excessive student tardies to school and leaving campus without permission.

The access road behind the school is a one-way road during school hours and school events.

BREAKFAST and LUNCH

All breakfast and lunch for the 2024-2025 school year will be FREE.

Most water fountains have bottle refill availability. No glass bottles or containers are allowed at school. All beverages on campus must have a closable top. No cans are allowed.

DELIVERIES

To minimize disruptions of classes, teachers, and the education of your student, please be sure they have everything they need upon arrival at school.

The office does not always have aides to assist in delivering. Items will remain in the office until the students' lunch time or until aides are available. If something needs to get to the student immediately we may call the student to the office. We encourage you not to send your student a message as cell usage is not allowed during class times.

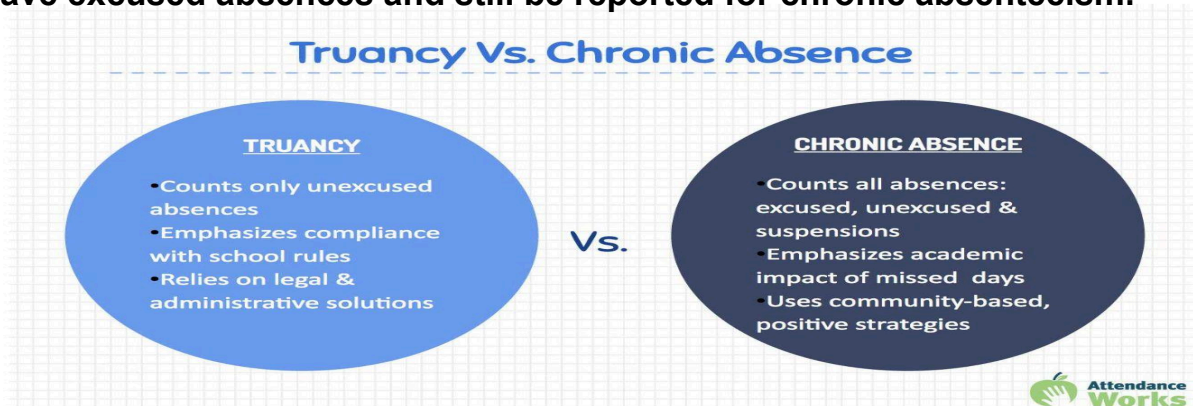
The office will NOT take money for a student, teacher, event, organization, or items being sold. All money MUST be sent with the student to be receipted during homeroom.

NO FOOD OR DRINKS will be allowed to be delivered, **no exceptions**. If a student forgets to bring lunch, they will need to get a school cafeteria lunch. All food brought during the day that has been ordered from a restaurant will be denied.

Any floral arrangements or boxes will not be delivered until after 2:00. No glass containers are allowed.

ATTENDANCE

Truancy and Chronic Absenteeism are not the same thing. Truancy deals with unexcused absences from school or unexcused tardies. A student can have excused absences and still be reported for chronic absenteeism.



Power School - Last year parents needed a separate login from students for Power School. If you need the parents login information for your student please send a request to the office to nespencer@chiltonboe.com. This is not only a great way to monitor grades and assignments, but you may also view attendance. Anytime an excuse is entered it will update in power school. This will help parents or guardians monitor excuses being turned in. If you have any issues with Power School login please let the office know so they can assist you. Nurse send homes are considered to be an excused absence. However, please note the school nurses have guidelines that are given to them whether a child should be sent home or not. It is at the discretion of the parent or guardian if you choose to check them out, but it will not be excused unless proper documentation is received in the office (parent note or doctor excuse).

After the maximum amount of parent excuses are used for your student, you will be notified. Any Parent excuses received after notification will result in an unexcused absence.

For the Number of absences, excused, or unexcused - see Chilton County Handbook.

CHECK-OUT POLICY

Students can only be checked out by someone on their checkout list or with signed, written, and verified permission to be checked out by another adult. (ID IS REQUIRED)

Students with a parking permit can bring a checkout note to check themselves out. They are also the only ones who can check out siblings or relatives who ride with them. However, the siblings/relatives will need to bring a signed permission note EACH time unless it is a part of the student's usual dismissal plan.

All written permission forms MUST be signed by a parent or guardian of the student and state when the student has permission to check out. All permission forms need to be turned in to the office no later than 9:00 AM to be considered. ALL slips will be verified with the parent or guardian of the student.

Even if a student turns in a checkout note, the students must report to the office at the time indicated on their note and officially be checked out by the office. Students who leave campus without permission will face disciplinary action. Drivers who leave campus without permission and proper checkout could lose their driving privileges on campus.

You are not allowed to check out your students and leave them on campus. Once you have checked them out through the office they are your responsibility and must leave the campus with you. If it is for a sporting event, you can drop them directly off at the event at your own risk.

ATTENDANCE AND SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

All students that are participating in a school sponsored activity during school hours, on or off campus, will be Excused, and it will not count toward absences. If the student will be checking out after the activity the check-out policy will apply.

Any student that will be attending a school sponsored activity during school hours must follow checkout procedures. In order for the absence to be School Excused the student MUST check in with an appointed faculty member. These School Sponsored Activities must be approved by the administration of Maplesville High School prior to the activity. Not all school related activities will qualify for this School Excuse.

A student must have written permission from an administrator or must be participating in a school activity to stay on campus after school has been dismissed. No student is allowed to stay on campus to wait for a school activity to begin without permission from an administrator.

After proper documentation is provided, any student taking the placement test for Dual Enrollment will be School Excused one (1) time for half the day that the test is taken.

Please note: If you have a student participating in a school activity and another student that is attending unless it is an approved school activity for the attendee, it will NOT be school excused.

DISCIPLINE

Any and all disciplinary actions will occur according to the Chilton County Schools Student handbook. This can be found on the official district website: www.chiltonboe.com

The following are other basic principles that govern the rules at Maplesville High School.

- Classroom Tardy Discipline Procedures
- Classroom Behavior Plans/Procedures

- Classroom/School Restroom Policies

Please review the following disciplinary forms that are used at Maplesville High School to be aware of what is expected.

In accordance with the new law, all classroom teachers will have an approved behavior management plan within the 10th day of instruction.

HALL Procedures/Behavior

In order to keep the flow of traffic moving smoothly and efficiently, please walk on the RIGHT side.

Before school and during breaks, please do not block the middle of the hallway and be considerate of those trying to get down the hall by moving out of the way if you are just standing.

High School students will need a hall pass from a teacher/staff member anytime they are in the hall during instructional blocks, including acceleration and lunch.

RESTROOMS

High School students will use ONLY the restrooms on the main high school hall during the day **with the exception of** break and class changes. During these additional times, High School students may utilize both the restrooms on the main hall and the restrooms on the 3rd - 8th grade hall. NO high school student should be in the restroom on the 3rd - 8th grade hallway during any other time. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO USE RESTROOMS IN THE PRE-K/K OR 1ST/2ND GRADE BUILDINGS.

DRESS CODE

The dress code in the Chilton County Student/Parent Guide reflects minimum expectations. Additional dress code guidelines for MHS students are as follows:

Leggings can be worn to school as long as they are not see-through. Students must have a shirt that covers their bottom but do not necessarily have to be mid thigh. Biker shorts can be worn as long as they are at mid-thigh or longer and have a shirt that covers their bottoms.

There can be no holes in pants above mid-thigh exposing bare skin.

NO body sprays are allowed on MHS campus or buses. These pose a risk to students with severe allergies and asthma.

Students are not allowed to bring blankets to school to substitute for a jacket/coat. Blankets may be allowed for special occasions with permission.

CELL PHONES/ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Cell phones are not allowed in classrooms at any time during the school day. They are only allowed during class changes. They are NOT allowed in the cafeteria or restrooms at any time. They are only allowed during official class changes. They are not allowed in the hallway while you are walking to the bathroom, office, etc. during designated class times. They are not allowed if you are sitting in the library, working as an office assistant, teacher assistant, etc. They are not allowed in the gym at PE. Smart Watches are considered an electronic device and students are not to be using them in class.

SECURITY

Anyone planning to enter the secured door will be required to present proper identification. Upon clearing the system, you will be given a badge to wear until departure. Please understand that this policy applies to everyone, and that this will help ensure the safety of the students, visitors, and staff at MHS.

The secured door is to remain closed at all times, and it should only be opened by the office or school staff member, and only after a visitor check in has been conducted. No student should open the door for anyone, at any time, or for any reason.

TITLE I SERVICES

According to the U.S. Department of Education the purpose of Title 1 funding, “ is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.” The basic principles of Title 1 state that schools with low income students will receive supplemental funds to assist in meeting student’s educational goals.

Low-income students are determined by the number of students enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program. For an entire school to qualify for Title I funds, at least 40% of students must enroll in the free and reduced lunch program.
