Courselor's Corner

The more we practice our Toolbox tools the better we will



Here are the first four tools in our toolbox to practice at home and at school:

Breathing Tool = I calm myself and check in. Breathe in slow through your nose and then slowly blow the air out through your mouth. The breathing tools works in all kinds of situations and you can use it when you are feeling sad, angry, scared or nervous and can give us time to calm ourselves and keep us from saying or doing something that might make a situation worse. It helps you to be more in control.

Quiet Safe Place Tool = I remember my quiet safe place. Your quiet safe place lives inside of you and you can think of it anytime to help you relax and calm down and goes nicely with the breathing tool.

Listening Tool = I listen with my ears, eyes and hear. When your heart listens to what you hear with your ears and what you see with your eyes you can almost feel what someone might be going through. Show someone how important they are to you by listening to him or her with your ears, eyes and heart.

Empathy Tool = I care for others. I care for myself. The Empathy tool and the Listening tool work together. Listening with our heart helps us to treat others and ourselves with kindness and caring, that is to have Empathy.
