

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TTK and Kindergarten

We're off to a great start to the read-a-thon! Reading goals are 30 minutes per day, including weekends. Please return the reading logs each day in your child's planner or yellow folder so I can count up the minutes. I am keeping track of minutes read at school on each student's reading log that is kept at school. I will keep you updated on your child's progress towards their goal of 930 minutes for the month. Our classroom goal is that everyone makes their personal goal.

Kindergarteners are learning teen numbers. They are using manipulatives and ten frames to see how numbers connect. Ten ones and two ones equals twelve and so on.

Kindergarteners are learning the tricky words of, the, all, and, a. They are also learning about farms. So far they have learned about why we need farms and what kinds of crops farmers grow.

TK is working on their Habitats unit. They learned about the woodlands and the types of animals that lived there. This week, they are learning about pond habitats.

Third and Fourth Grade Classroom Mrs. Mars

This week students read articles about both monkeys and chimpanzees. They then had the opportunity to plan, draft, and write a 3 to 5 paragraph essay where they compared the similarities and differences between the two. Students are using peer review and feedback to improve upon their writing.

This was the first full week of the Read-a-Thon. I am excited about the reading we are seeing so far. Please make sure your child turns in their reading log tomorrow. They will get a new one next week. This helps us to track their progress and also helps to prevent students from losing sheets that have tons of reading on them. Keep up that reading and let's hit those goals!

We also kicked off our Read-a-Thon last Friday. In order for students to meet their individual goals, they must read for 30 minutes every night- including on the



weekends. In order for minutes to count, the reading log must be filled in completely and signed by an adult. Old logs are collected every Friday, new logs are then sent home.

In math, second graders are doing a great job using money while first graders are mastering measurement.

Students have been working on the idiom, "March goes in like a lion and out like a lamb." They are creating a lion/lamb art project as well as diamante poems.
