Updated Quarantine (Exposure) Guidelines:

Fully vaccinated persons in close contact with an infected person <u>Do Not</u> have to quarantine unless they develop symptoms BUT, should test 3-5 days after exposure to rule out infection. They will continue social distancing and mask-wearing but may return to work!

Unvaccinated individuals in close contact (less than 6 feet for greater than 15 minutes regardless of mask-wearing) will quarantine from work for 7 days. They should test on day 5 and can return to work on day 8 if their test result was negative and they are symptom-free.
