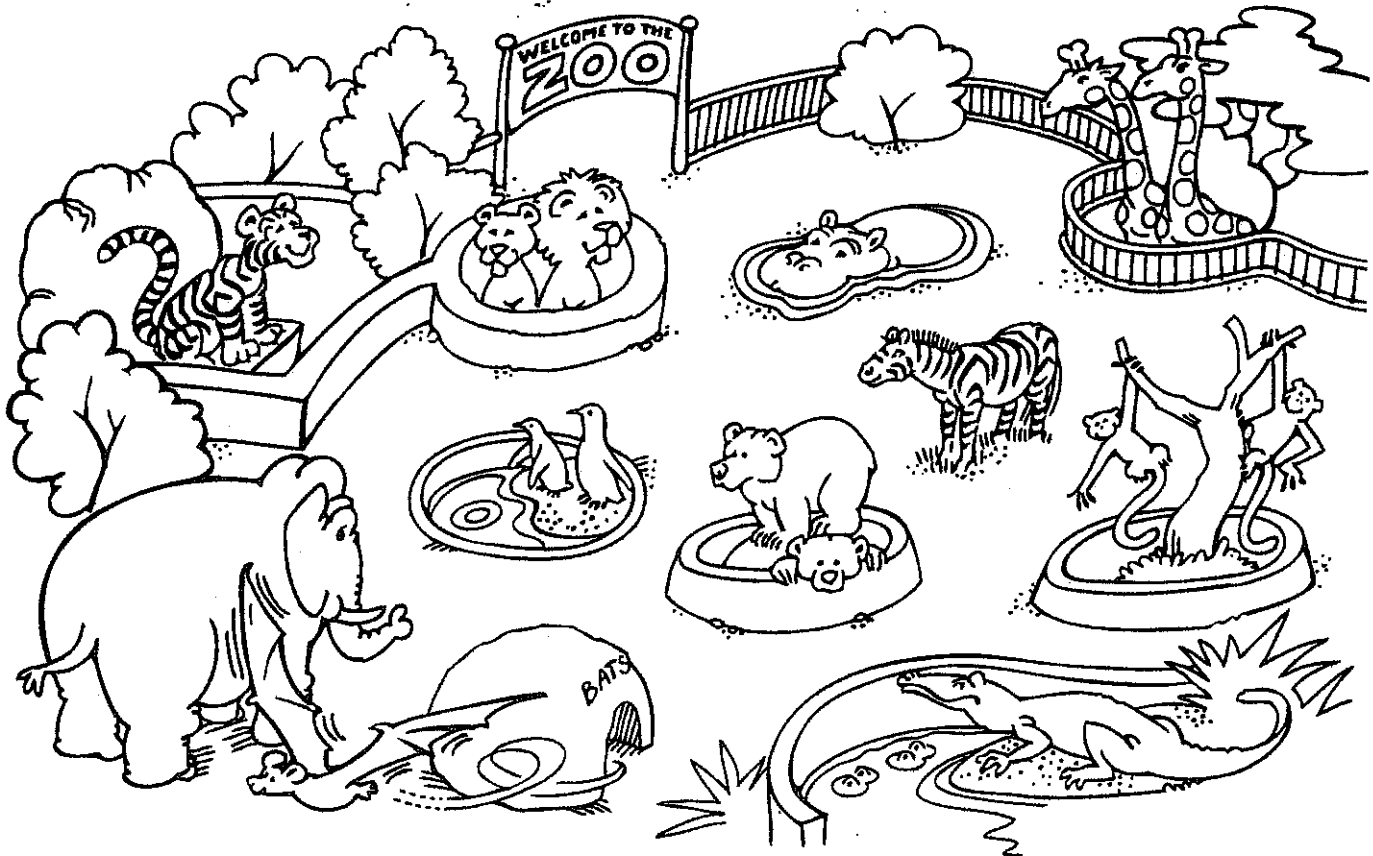




At the Zoo

- The monkeys are her favorite, so she saves them for last.

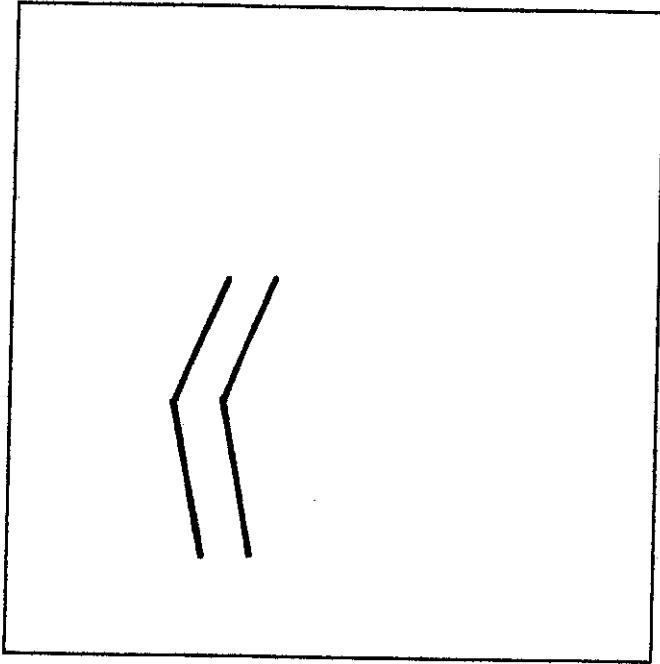
