Roundtable Discussion With Senator Cory Booker Held At Marino Center

















On Wednesday, August 17, U.S. Senator Cory Booker made an appearance at the Marino Center in Bridgeton on his tour of New Jersey for a roundtable discussion with Cumberland County Prosecutor Jennifer Webb-McRae. The focus of the discussion was the reduction of violence through efforts carried out by the agencies funded under the CC THRIVE Innovation Fund Grant through the Prosecutor's Office. Gateway is among the agencies receiving CC Thrive funding. Participating in the discussion on behalf of Gateway were Executive Vice President and COO Edward Bethea and Gateway Wellness Center's Mental Health Director, Ashlee Todd.

In response to the roundtable discussion, Booker commended the efficacy of programs such as CC THRIVE and the efforts of the agencies working together to actively diminish gun violence and other violent crimes. "Research has shown that these programs work," Booker Said. "It's vital that we start investing more federal dollars into these initiatives to save lives and keep our communities safe."



A Gateway Scholars Student's Passion For Helping Others

The Forman Acton Foundation featured one of Gateway Scholars students, Jerome Crews, in an article this month. Jerome serves as a prime example of the leadership and success that programs like Gateway Scholars cultivate in high school students.

According to the article, Jerome maintains a strong presence in the Salem area, especially as a member of the Gateway Scholars program. He and fellow members of the program attended regular meetings to study current events and discuss how to improve their hometown through fundraising and civic engagement efforts. While Jerome is still exploring career options for his future, the one thing he knows for certain is that he has a passion for helping others. Jerome is quoted in the Forman Acton Foundation article as saying, "Salem can sometimes feel like a 'ghost town,' and students don't often have access to all of the tools they'd need to be most successful. I want to be that person who offers guidance and advice to young people as they advance into higher education."

Part of his vision, as inspired by Gateway Scholars, is to establish a nonprofit organization of his own in his hometown that would help emphasize the importance of equal opportunity education. The Gateway Scholars program serves students and families throughout Cumberland, Gloucester, and Salem Counties in southern New Jersey. It is designed to help students in 10th and 11th grade prepare for their future, although high school students of any grade are eligible if GPA requirements are met. Gateway Scholars focuses on a few core areas to prime students for success including SAT/ACT preparation, career development, life skills, and financial literacy. New Jersey State Troopers Volunteer At Gateway's Food Pantry















Gateway End-Of-Summer Employee Event To Celebrate 35 years










