Dear parishioners,

Last week, I received word that I can discontinue wearing the LifeVest defibrillator and that I would not need a pace maker or ICD at this time. I am able to discontinue taking warfarin, meaning that I can resume eating green vegetables (which counteract the thinning effect of warfarin). I am to monitor symptoms, but otherwise continue other meds and regular visits with the cardiology team (next one is in February) for retesting the heart function.

After almost 22 weeks of being connected to a monitor, it is interesting. As I had to wear it at night, I had to remember to take it along when getting up – and these last days, I have had to remind myself that I do not have to remember it anymore. How quickly habits are formed.

Next Monday is the feast of All Saints Day, normally a day of obligation but because it falls on a Monday, the obligation is lifted. I will still offer a number of Masses including one for the school. Tuesday is All Souls Day, and I will also offer a number of Masses.

Because of these last months, I have found myself a little more aware of the reality of death and the need for repentance that is not always from bad to good, but good to better, too. Praying for the souls in purgatory and strengthening our relationship with the Saints help us tremendously. If you cannot take part in the Masses on either day, I remind you of the beautiful custom of an indulgence attached to visiting a cemetery on All Souls Day, praying for those buried there and all souls in purgatory, and praying for the intention of the Pope (along with the Sacrament of Confession within a week before or after, and detachment from sins. There is a beautiful prayer

from St. Gertrude, a true teacher on the value of praying for

the souls in purgatory, that would be appropriate:

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.

There are also two others:

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord; And let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen

O Lord, who art ever merciful and bounteous with Thy gifts, look down upon the suffering souls in purgatory. Remember not their offenses and negligences, but be mindful of Thy loving mercy, which is from all eternity. Cleanse them of their sins and fulfill their ardent desires that they may be made worthy to behold Thee face to face in Thy glory. May they soon be united with Thee and hear those blessed words which will call them to their heavenly home: "Come, blessed of My Father, take possession of the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the

THE BOOK OF THE DEAD

Parishes have a custom of giving a place of honor to a book in which members of the parish, community members and visitors write the names of their beloved dead. This practice provides the living with an opportunity for healing and consolation in the face of grief. The Book of the Dead will be displayed from the solemnity of All Saints until the beginning of Advent. It is left open for people to write the names of their deceased loved ones and for others to read the names, remember, and pray for the repose of their souls. Remembering all of these men and women who have gone before us, "marked with the sign of faith," helps us better understand and appreciate our faith in the Christ our risen Lord who conquers sin and death and brings new life to all.

At this time The Book of the Dead will be placed in the back of the church and then will be placed at the front of the church during the month of November. This book is for anyone who wishes to add the names of their deceased loved ones. During the All Souls Day Mass and the Masses in November, we will pray for those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.


