Hands-On Learning with Crafts

Library story time is so much more fun when the use of crafts can be integrated with the curriculum theme. Hands-on activities make learning more memorable, and boosts cognitive skills. Following instructions is a big part of the process, and as students improve their listening skills, their efficiency also improves. Additionally, students practice and improve their skills like cutting, coloring, and pasting which further develops their fine motor skills. Students are given the freedom to make their projects unique by adding their own picture details and colors of choice.

Learning about owls was so much fun, and using the glossary at the end of the book to actually start the lesson, immediately "hooked" the students' interest. As new terms and vocabulary words were read, like "perch" and "talons", students practiced their diagramming skills which had been introduced in the previous weeks lesson.
