As we prepare for All Saints Day and All Souls Day, I think it is time to address Mass intentions and stipends. These intentions are to remember a particular intention, usually for the repose of someone's soul, sometimes for thanksgiving or healing (physical or spiritual), or sometimes for other intentions such as vocations, good weather, or for peace. The intentions formally offered by the presider are listed in the bulletin. I do not often vocally name the intentions at the Mass, nor is a priest required too. In offering an intention, it is advisable to keep the list to just a few names for space in the bulletin – it is advisable to list "for the deceased members of the Blank Family".

Every Mass has infinite grace, and by offering it for a particular intention, we pray more intensely for that intention. It is good to note, too, that as an attendant at Mass, you can offer your own separate intentions. There are only a few intentions that would not be appropriate – for the success of something sinful, for example, or if the person would be opposed to it (though "For a special intention" might be a way of offering an intention for someone who might not want their name announced).

For a particular intention, you may offer a stipend. These are separate funds from the regular offerings given to the church, and the money is given to the priest who offered the intention, but except for Christmas, a priest can only accept one stipend per day – any additional stipends offered that day are sent to the Missions (ours are sent to the Diocese who sends them to the San Lucas Mission in Guatemala). These funds are treated with special care. In the past, they were a significant part of a priest's income. Now that priests are compensated better, the stipend is a reminder to pray for specific intentions, but not as a source of income as that might become a form of spiritual abuse called simony – the attempted selling of graces.

Our Diocese has suggested an offering of \$10 per Mass intention. We typically will assume all larger sums of intention moneys to be divided into a few Mass intentions. Also, it is good to note that should we be unable to offer these intentions within a year, we may ask to send unsaid intentions on to the Missions, retired priests, or to religious priests to be offered.

This last year, my appreciation of the Mass Intention has grown. I offered a Mass within hours of my Mom's passing. Last year, I was offering Mass for my Godfather as soon as I heard he died. It brought peace to my heart knowing that I was offering the perfect prayer – the Mass – for them. At the same time, I felt their presence and the comfort of the Lord in offering the intention.

THE BOOK OF THE DEAD

Parishes have a custom of giving a place of honor to a book in which members of the parish, community members and visitors write the names of their beloved dead. This practice provides the living with an opportunity for healing and consolation in the face of grief.

The Book of the Dead will be displayed from the solemnity of All Saints until the beginning of Advent. It is left open for people to write the names of their deceased loved ones and for others to read the names, remember, and pray for the repose of their souls. Remembering these men and women who have gone before us, "marked with the sign of faith," helps us better understand and appreciate our faith in the Christ our risen Lord who conquers sin and death and brings new life to all.

At this time The Book of the Dead will be placed in the back of the church and then will be placed at the front of the church during the month of November. This book is for anyone who wishes to add the names of their deceased loved ones. During the All Souls Day Mass and the Masses in November, we will pray for those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.

BOXES OF JOY

During the month of October we will be collecting items to fill the Box of Joy. These boxes of joy will go to children around the world (mainly Central & South America) that have never received a gift before along with teaching about Jesus and the good news, some evangelizing. There are children in this world that have never heard of Jesus. In the beginning of November they will be collected, processed and shipped.

Items we are collecting to fill the boxes:

Toys: deflated balls with a pump, small cars and trucks, dolls, stuffed animals, finger puppets

School supplies: colored pencils, crayons, watercolors, colored pens, small notebooks,

Apparel: socks, shorts, T-shirts, flip-flops, hats, sunglasses, shoelaces

Hygiene: brush, sturdy cup, bottle with lid, bar soap, toothbrush, and floss

Accessories: watch, purse, wallet, necklace, headband, barrettes, bracelets, cross, rosary

Items should not be war-related (no toy weapons or soldiers) no liquids or candy, and they must fit in a shoe box. There is a box in the back of church to collect the items. Thank you for your generosity to help children around the world!
