This month, Pre-K scholars will be engaged in The Creative Curriculum's Ball Study. The Creative Curriculum allows scholars to act on their natural curiosity through developmentally appropriate investigations. They will be engaged in essential content that will allow them to think critically and as independent capable learners. Throughout this "Ball Study", it will show how scholars can use their natural interest in balls to help them explore Social Studies and Science concepts. They will also practice skills in Literacy, Math, Technology, and The Arts. Aligning with the New York State Learning Standards, scholars will explore different kinds of balls, share their experiences with balls, and use their prior knowledge of balls to drive investigations. They will be introduced to a variety of activities that will pique their interest in balls and identify what they want to find out. We will also use thinking skills to investigate, ask questions, solve problems, make predictions and test our ideas. This is definitely a study that scholars will be fully immersed in learning through play!

- When you are self-aware, you gain self-confidence in your abilities by recognizing your strengths.








2ND GRADE



WRITING SKILLS WILL BE HONED THROUGH THE CREATION OF PERSUASIVE ESSAYS, INFORMATIVE REPORTS, AND CREATIVE NARRATIVES. ADDITIONALLY, SCHOLARS WILL EXPAND THEIR VOCABULARY AND IMPROVE GRAMMAR AND SYNTAX. OVERALL, 6TH-GRADE ELA WILL EMPOWER STUDENTS TO BECOME MORE CONFIDENT, CRITICAL READERS AND EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATORS."


