
At the ceremony, Tanya Patton, Ed.D., assistant superintendent of Students, Schools and Community Support, welcomed stakeholders and community partners.

Riverview Gardens School District held two staff appreciation events for the RGSD faculty & staff leading into Winter Break.



# A NEW VIEW ON THE HORIZON

Greetings RGSD Stakeholders,

Thank you to all the parents, scholars, staff and community members who joined us at the January 23 SAB Meeting and Town Hall at Westview Middle School. Riverview Gardens School District continues to solicit feedback and engagement from the entire RGSD community.

At the Town Hall, the District continued to display complete transparency when it comes to the RGSD's Annual Performance Review (APR), the Comprehensive School Improvement Program (CSIP), attendance, climate and culture, accreditation status, finance and more. We are grateful for everyone who put aside a few hours on a Tuesday night to stay engaged with the amazing scholars and educators in Riverview Gardens. We appreciate your feedback via the open comments and the group activity. Thank you for sharing your questions, concerns and celebrations. Your input will be used to continue to improve learning in Riverview Gardens.

If you were unable to attend the event, you can watch the replay of the live stream on the RGSD YouTube page. We hope that you will consider attending a future Town Hall, SAB Meeting, PAC Meeting or other activity in the future. To address the needs of all stakeholders, we must maintain constant twoway communication. Let's continue to grow together, improve together and make Riverview Gardens School District the best school district in Missouri!

At the Town Hall Meeting, we introduced Proposition S to the community. Prop S is a no-tax-rateincrease bond issue that will appear on the April 2 ballot. Prop S seeks to raise funding to improve safety and security, as well as school structures and other capital improvements.

RGSD's last ballot measure was Prop E, an operating tax levy increase that overwhelmingly passed in 2021. Prop E promises included:

- **Expand Early Childhood Education** Early childhood services have been extended to Lewis & Clark Elementary School, increasing capacity.
- **Expand Transportation** Riverview Gardens School District provides bus transportation to scholars who live within a mile radius when requested.
- **Expand Health Services for Families** RGSD recently opened the R.A.M.S. Clinic at Riverview Gardens High School. The School-Based Health Center is open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and provides health services to RGSD scholars. Services will be expanded to family members and community members in the future.
- Enhance the Salary Schedule Since Prop E passed, all RGSD staff members have received significant wage increases to help make pay across the District competitive with other school districts in the area. Teacher salary steps were increased, the District's minimum wage was increased to \$15 per hour and a compensation study was done to help bring wages of all employees up to fair and competitive levels.

While Prop E was a tax rate increase, Prop S will not increase your taxes. Voter approval would allow RGSD to borrow funds to address pressing security and facility needs at all RGSD schools. We look forward to sharing more information with you in the near future regarding Prop S. State of the District January 23, 2024
