  - What is learned in high school

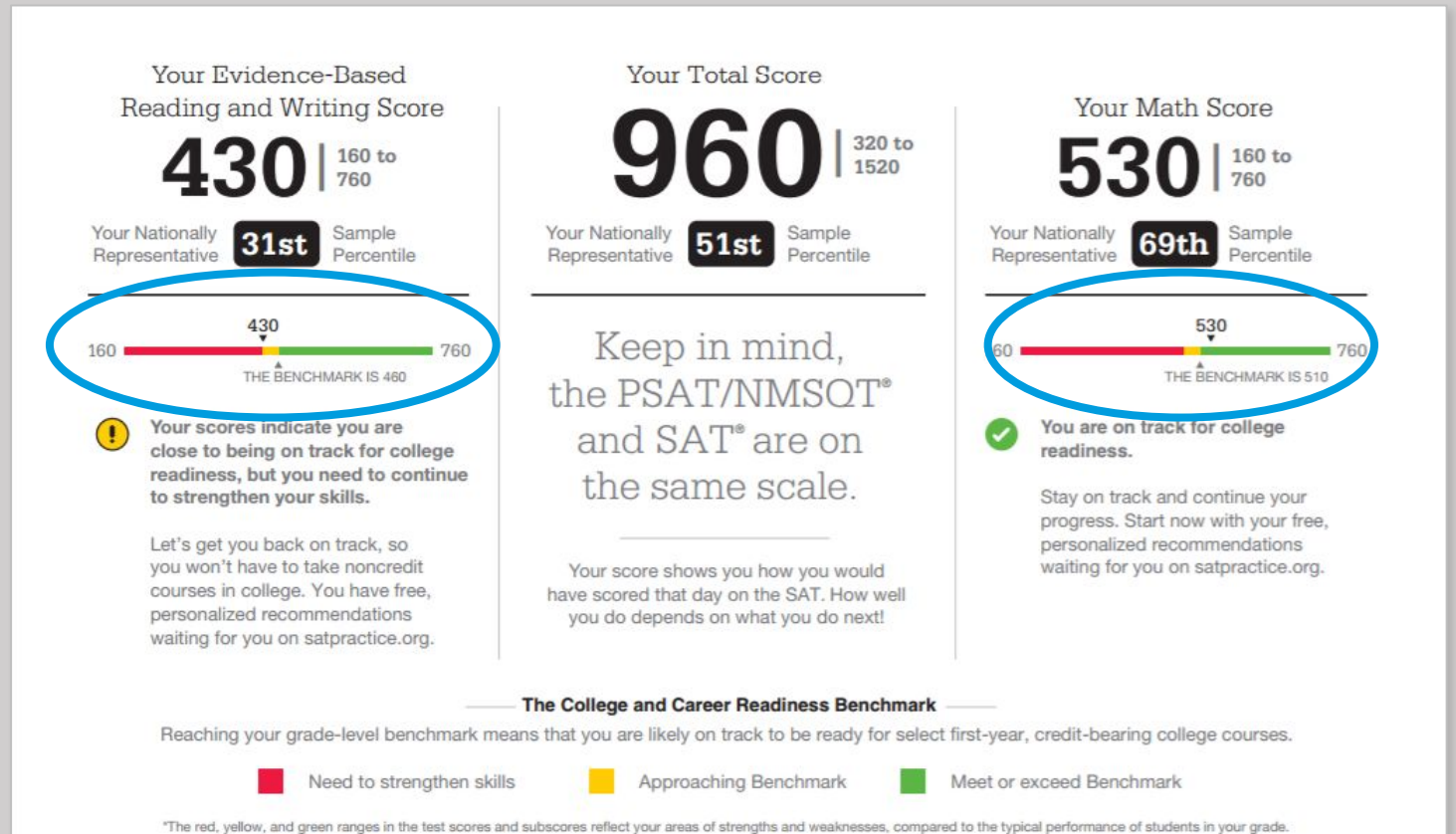

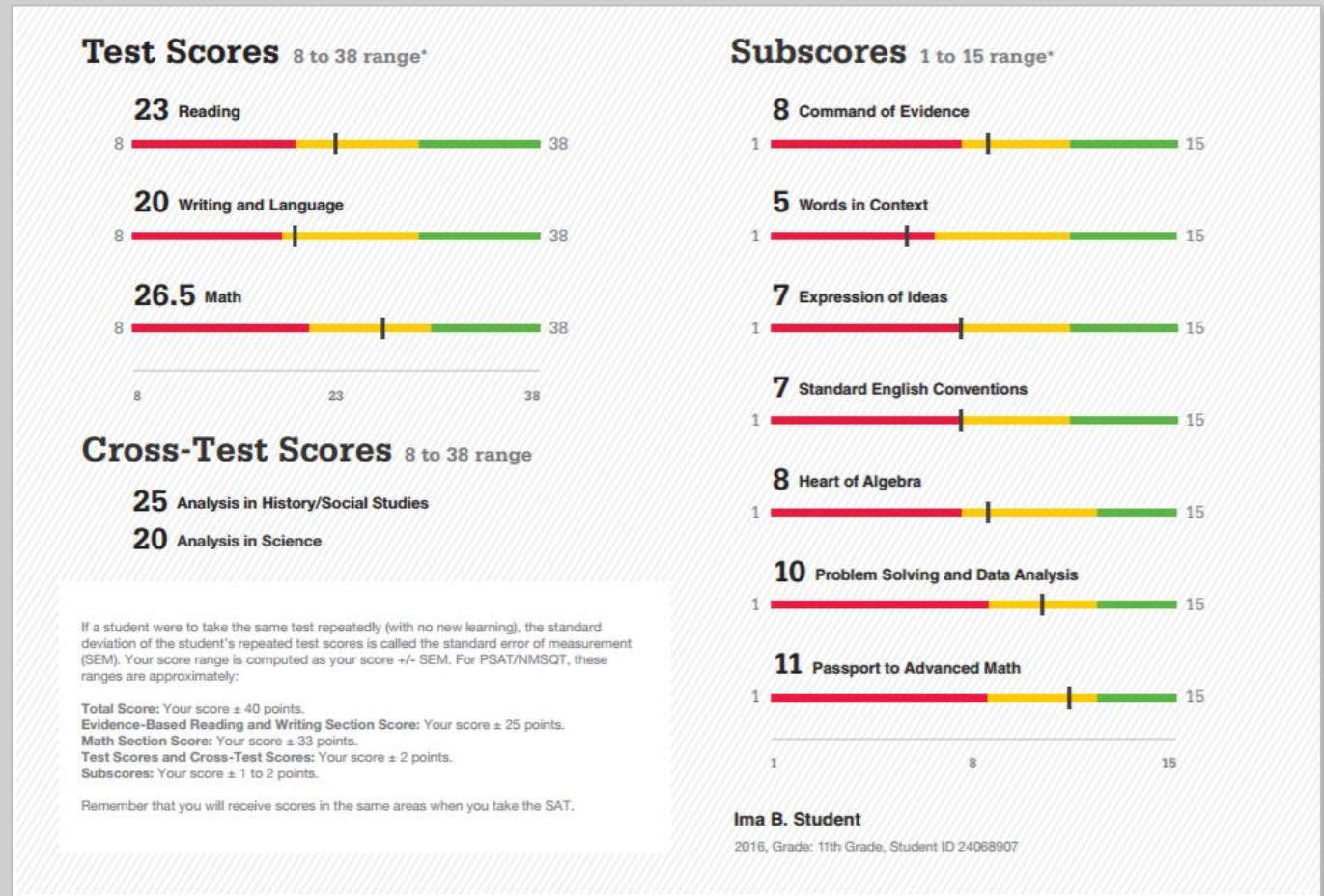

- Create or sign-in to your College Board or ACT account.
  - Student's full, legal name and other identifying information. Make sure it's the exact same name and information shown on the student's photo ID.
  - Decide if the student wants to answer other questions about themselves. This takes time, but it's worth it if the student wants colleges and scholarship organizations to find them.
  - Decide whether to sign up for the ACT with Essay. See which colleges recommend or require it.
  - Upload a photo that meets very specific photo requirements.
  - Check out, and print an Admission Ticket.
  - Make sure to have an admission ticket and photo id the day of the test.

# AP Potential

- Research shows a strong relationship between PSAT/NMSQT and AP.
- PSAT/NMSQT scores are a significant predictor of students' AP Exam grades.

For students to be considered for JPII AP Classes, they must have the following requirements:

- Teacher recommendations
- Student interest in the subject matter
- History of courses completed
- Student grades 87 or higher
- Contributes to class discussion
- Have a higher level than average comprehension and understanding ability
- Have excellent writing skills
- Have excellent student skills
- Does not create distractions in class

# Benefits of Taking AP Classes

Advanced Placement (AP) classes are a fantastic way to show academic rigor in your schedule and impress college admissions officers. AP classes offer more of a challenge than a general or core class, and often are considered difficult but rewarding by students who take them.

## Benefits of Taking AP Classes

- Challenging for students eager to learn more
- Shows academic rigor to selective colleges
- Prepares students for college courses
- Earn potential college credit and save parents thousands of money
- Could lead to possible scholarships

## Other AP Considerations:

- Additional charges for AP course than regular course (exam fee)
- With a challenge may come struggle
- Colleges will vary in acceptance of AP credit
- AP courses in the intended major, may have to be repeated in college
- AP classes are college-level courses, but not all college-level courses are taught the same. Sometimes skipping a level may not be the right choice for everyone.
