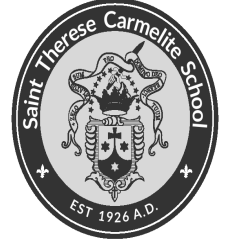

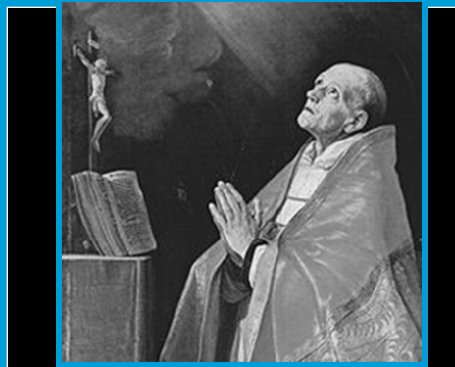

## VIRTUS: PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

### “What the Movie ‘Spotlight’ Leaves Out”

I recently watched the movie, “Spotlight.” Overall, it was a good movie about journalism, the reporters’ tenacity in telling a story that needed to be exposed, and a reminder of what happened in the Church and to many children entrusted to the care of clergy members. For me, especially as a VIRTUS facilitator for the Los Angeles Archdiocese, I feel compelled to make a few statements. I have been involved with VIRTUS in this Archdiocese since it began in 2002 and have been a facilitator for seven years now. First, the movie made it seem like the Catholic Church was/is the only one with the problem of child sexual abuse. We know how much the media loves to attack the Catholic Church, while leaving out the Protestant Churches, the Los Angeles Unified School District, the Boy

Scouts, teachers, coaches, day-care centers, convalescent homes, family members, and so on. Why did the story not include that this is a large problem in every place in society? I am in NO WAY minimizing the abuses that happened in the Church, but it is important to state that the Church has, and is, learning from the mistakes made by some Bishops and clergy.

The Catholic Church has made giant steps to healing and recovery. The VIRTUS slogan on posters hung around the Church state: “Promise to Protect, Pledge to Heal.” With that said, it is important to not let our guard down EVER and to remain vigilant. That is why we ask all members of our Parish, especially those who work with or around children, to be fingerprinted and to attend a VIRTUS class and be re-certified every four years. We are doing more than any other institution to learn from our mistakes and to offer healing for the victims; but most importantly, we are striving to never let this happen again. We want our parishioners to be the “eyes, ears and voices” of our churches, homes, and communities so that children can live in a safe environment. Second, because the Catholic Church has set the bar so high, this program implemented by the USCCB is not only for Churches now, but has also been applied to many organizations out in the community as well. The movie is a strong reminder of why we are doing the VIRTUS program, “Protecting God’s Children,” all across the United States and asking everyone to attend: In order to learn the patterns and behaviors of sexual predators and how to take the steps of action when we know or feel that something is not right. Here are just a few other comments from voices within our Church on the movie:

*“While the film ‘Spotlight’ focuses on events of the past, viewers may think that the film is portraying the present situation in the Church, concluding that nothing has changed in the Church’s response to the sexual abuse of minors,”* said an op-ed essay by Francesco C. Cesareo, Chairman of the U.S. Bishops’ National Review Board. *“However,”* Cesareo added, **“It is important to realize that the Church has implemented numerous successful steps in the years since the revelations of abuse.”** In one of his first public comments on the issue of clergy sex abuse, Pope Francis defended the Catholic Church’s response to the crisis, telling an Italian newspaper, *“...no one else has done more.”* The pope’s statements marked one of his boldest replies yet to criticism of the Church’s handling of abuse cases. *“The cases of abuse are awful because they leave profound wounds,”* Francis said. *“But,”* he added: *“The Catholic Church is maybe the only institution to have moved with transparency and responsibility. Yet the Church is the only one to be attacked.”* One year into his Papacy, Pope Francis has taken several steps to address the abuse scandal. He has overhauled Vatican law to specify sexual violence against children as a crime. He has also established a Commission to advise him on how to further implement programs to protect children and on how to counsel victims.

**“No institution in the United States has done more in recent years than the Catholic Church to take proactive steps to protect children from the evil of sexual abuse,”** wrote Cardinal Donald W. Wuerl of Washington in a November 2, 2015, letter emailed to Catholics in his archdiocese. The letter was reprinted in the November 5th issue of the Catholic Standard, Washington’s Archdiocesan newspaper.

**What is VIRTUS®?** VIRTUS is the brand name that identifies best-practices programs designed to help prevent wrongdoing and promote “right-doing” within religious organizations. The VIRTUS programs empower organizations and people to better control risk and improve the lives of all those who interact with the Church. (More next week!)

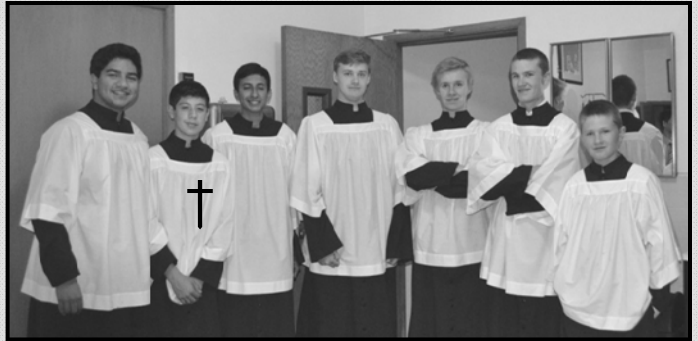

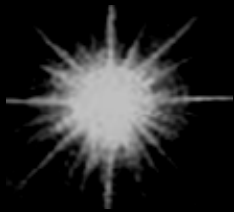

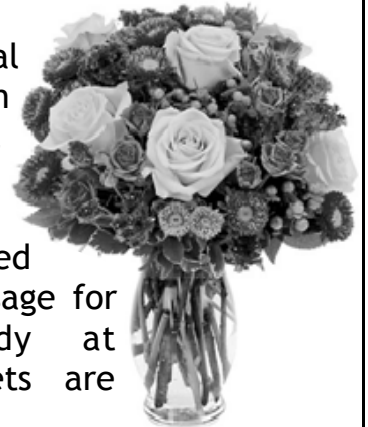
