With approximately 75 million dollars available for Idaho LAUNCH funding, it is possible for this program to offer between 9,000 and 10,000 awards per year</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Graduate from an Idaho High School or equivalent, starting in Spring 2024</li> <li>• Be an Idaho resident</li> <li>• Be enrolled in or have applied to an in-demand career program at an eligible Idaho institution</li> <li>• Begin enrollment by Fall Semester after graduation</li> <li>• Complete a Career Pathway Plan</li> <li>• Review the approved <a href="#">list of eligible in-demand careers</a></li> </ul>	<p>80% of tuition and fees up to \$8,000</p> <p>(receive up to ½ of funds in year 1 (\$4000), unless enrolled in a program that is less than 12 months.</p>
