Instilling a love of reading is so important for our elementary students at WMAPS. Reading is a process that involves making sense of the written word. As children increase their vocabulary, they begin to increase understanding and are better able to increase awareness by interpreting meaning from text.

This week at WMAPS, we are working in first and second grade Montessori classrooms with having students identify the author, illustrator, title, etc. of a book. Each of our classrooms have classroom libraries and we encourage students to read daily. As further support, parents can practice reading to students or have the students read to them each night. Younger students can picture walk through a book and describe the pictures they see on each page.
