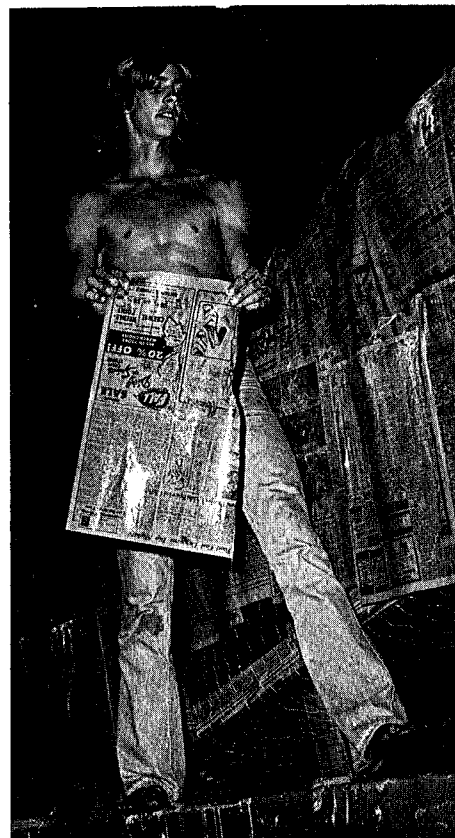


David Schofield Does It Again

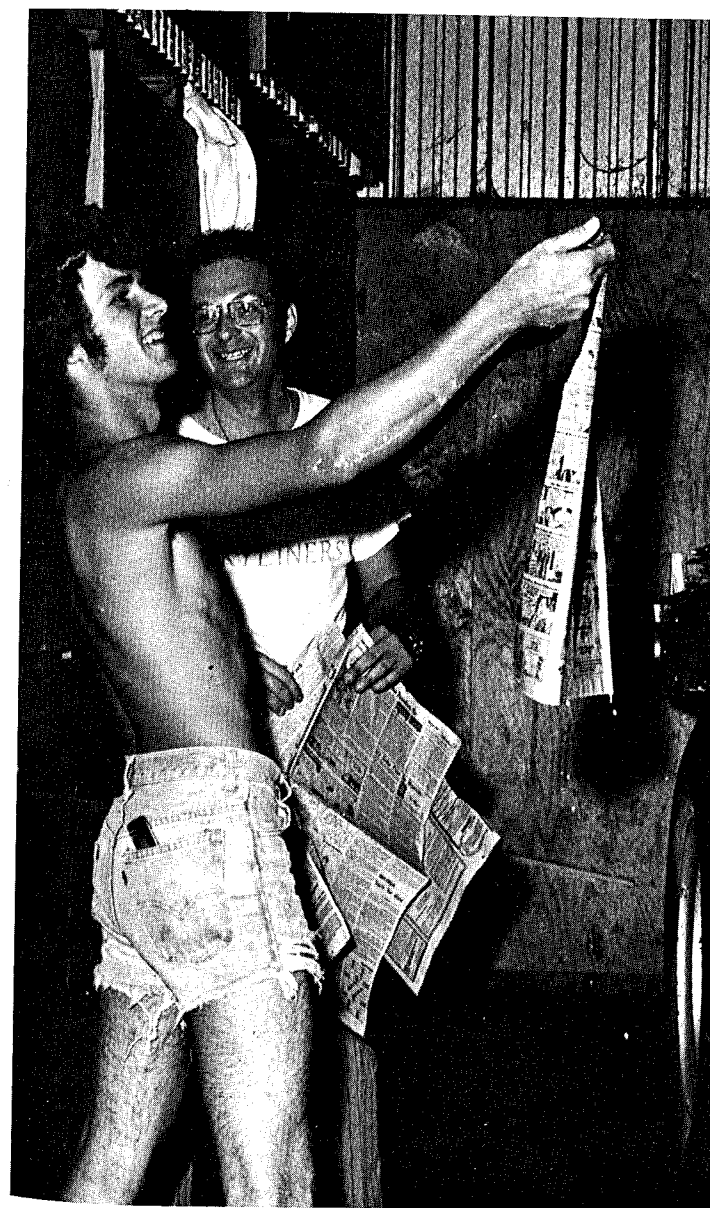
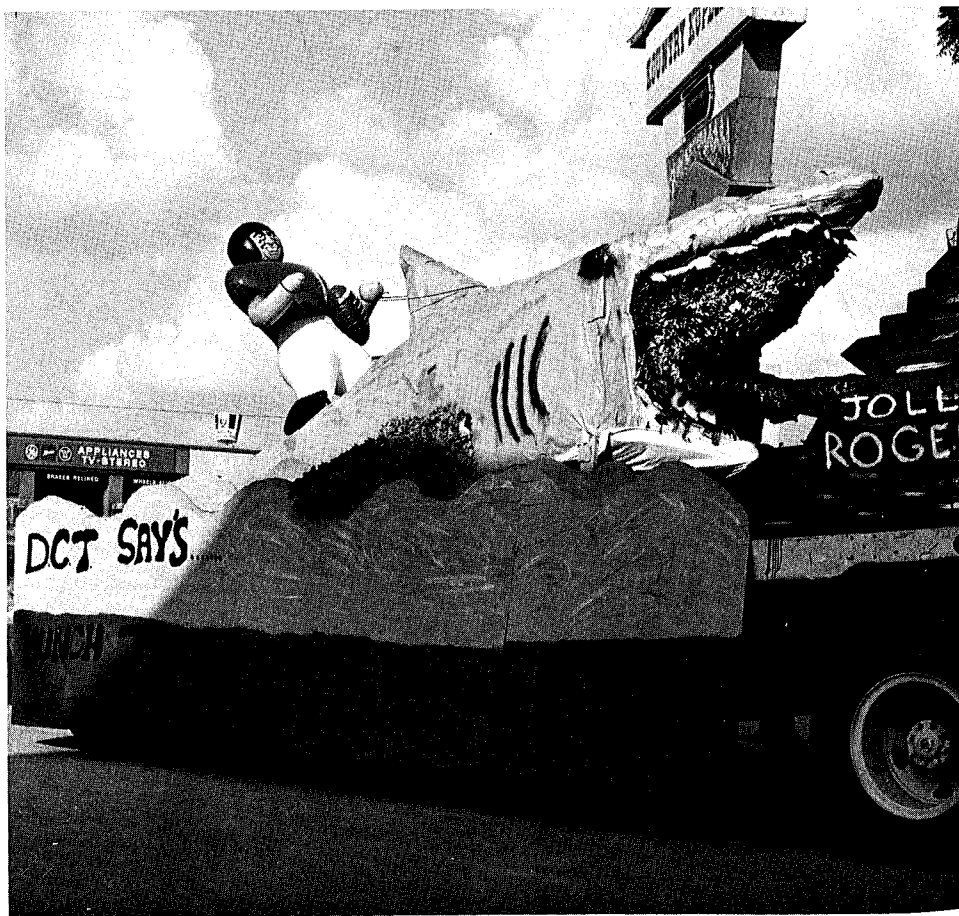

ROTC Tours Cape Kennedy

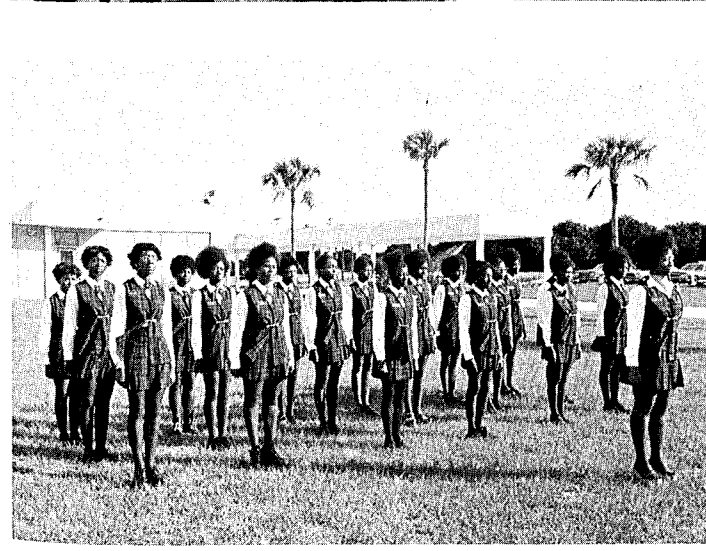
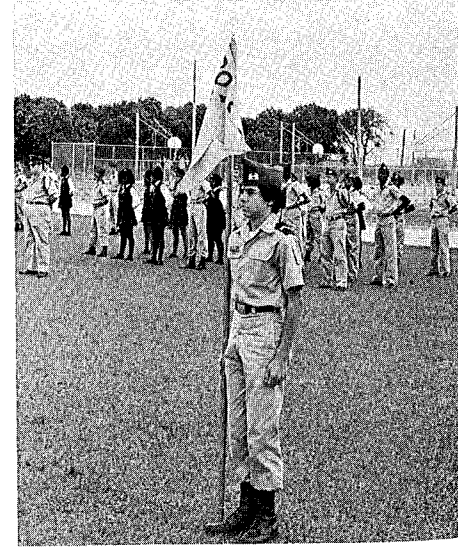

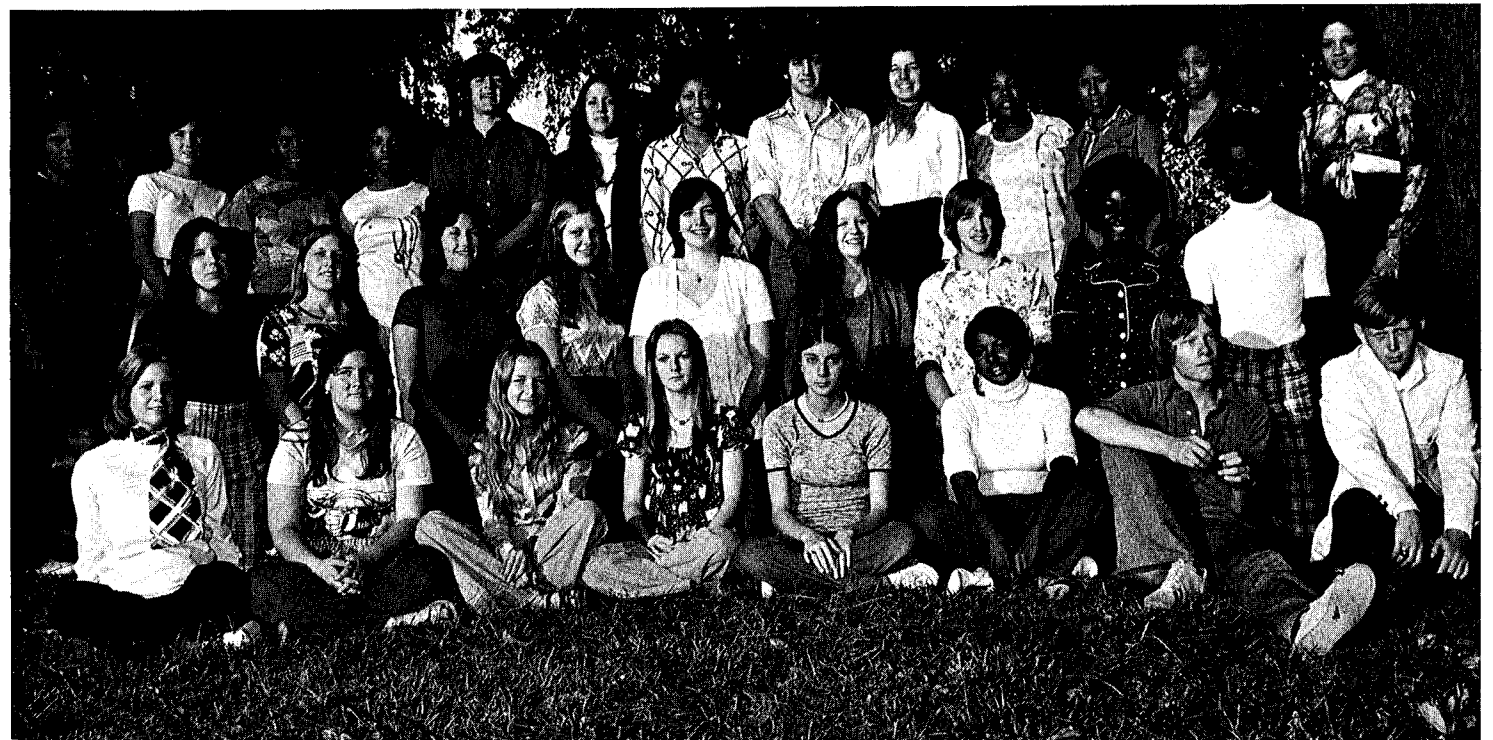
Council Sponsors Field Day

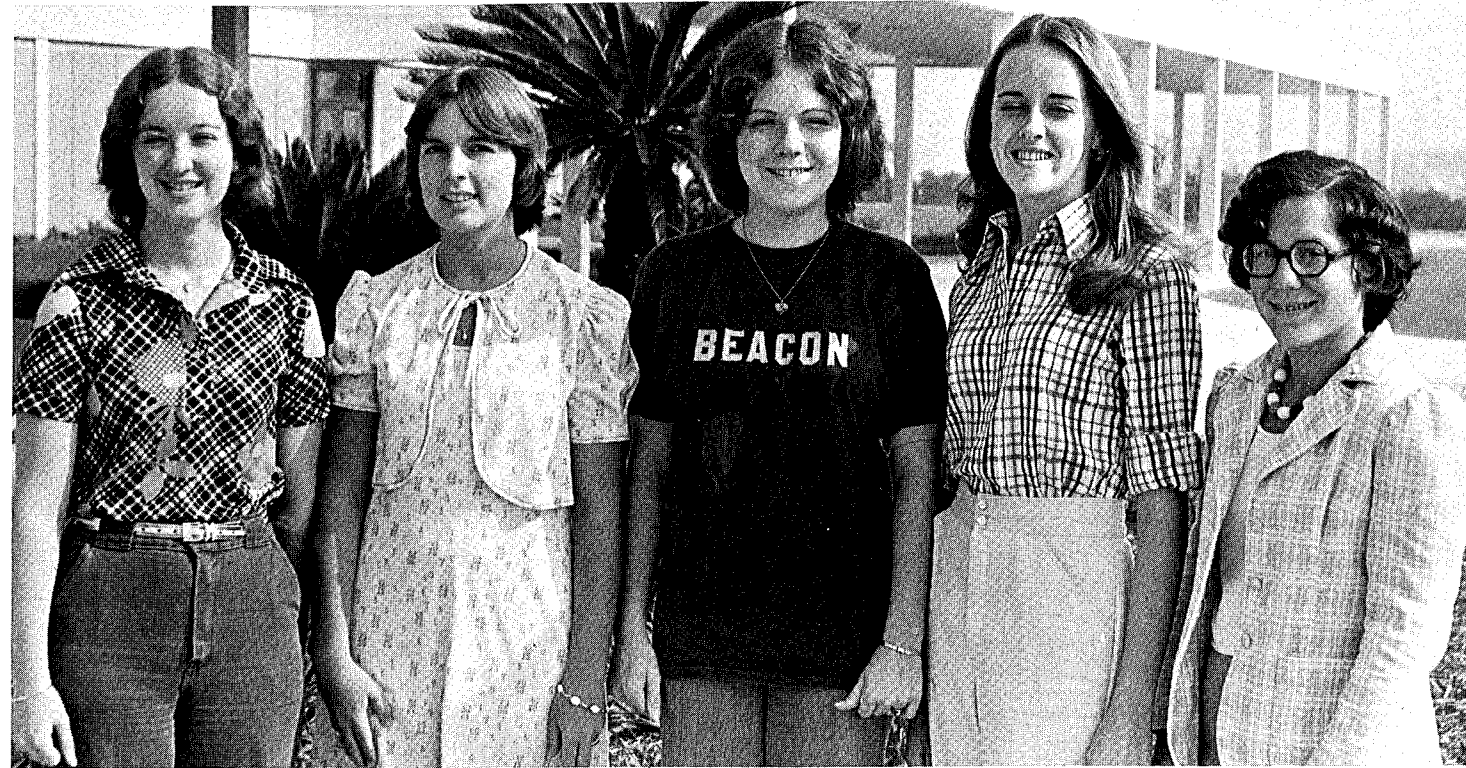

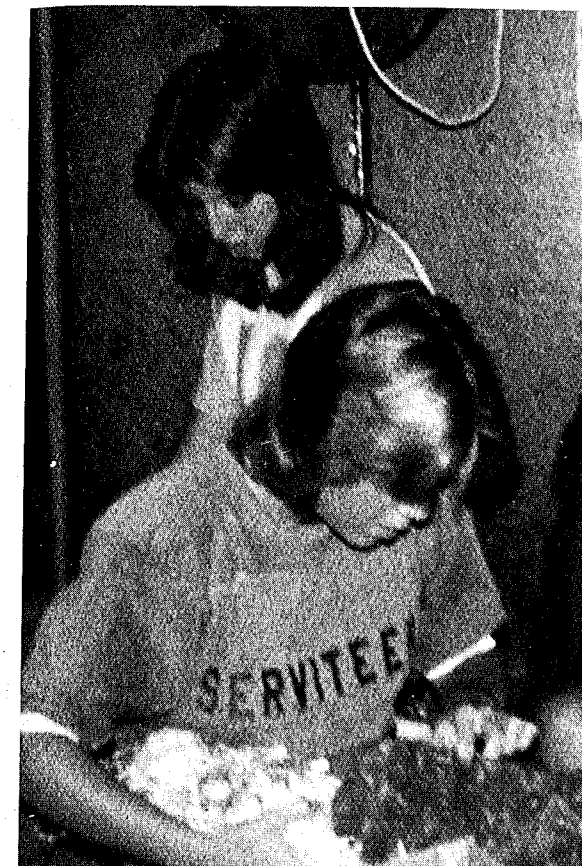
Key Club Helps March of Dimes

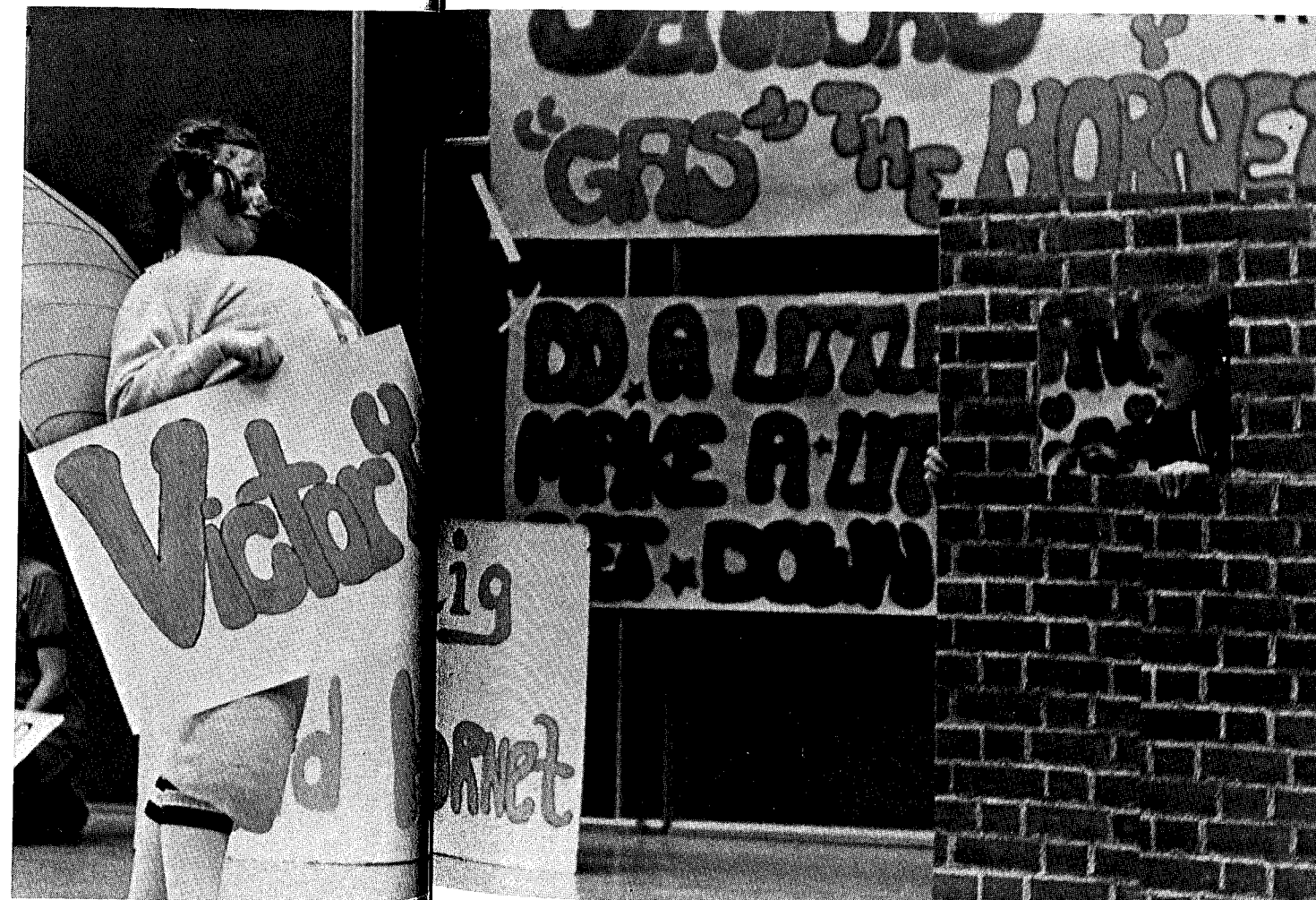


Serviteen Float Wins First

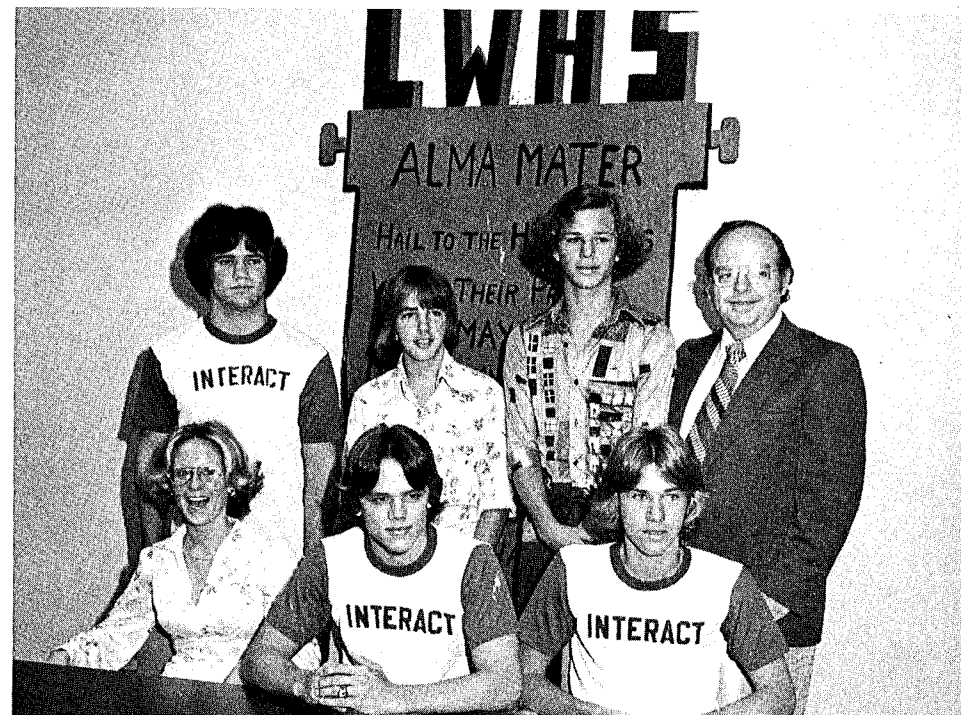

Interact Assists at Carnival

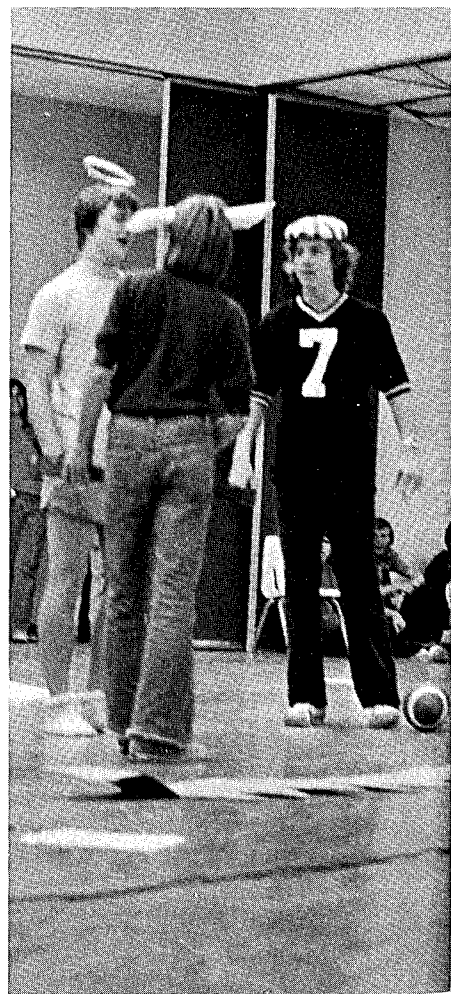

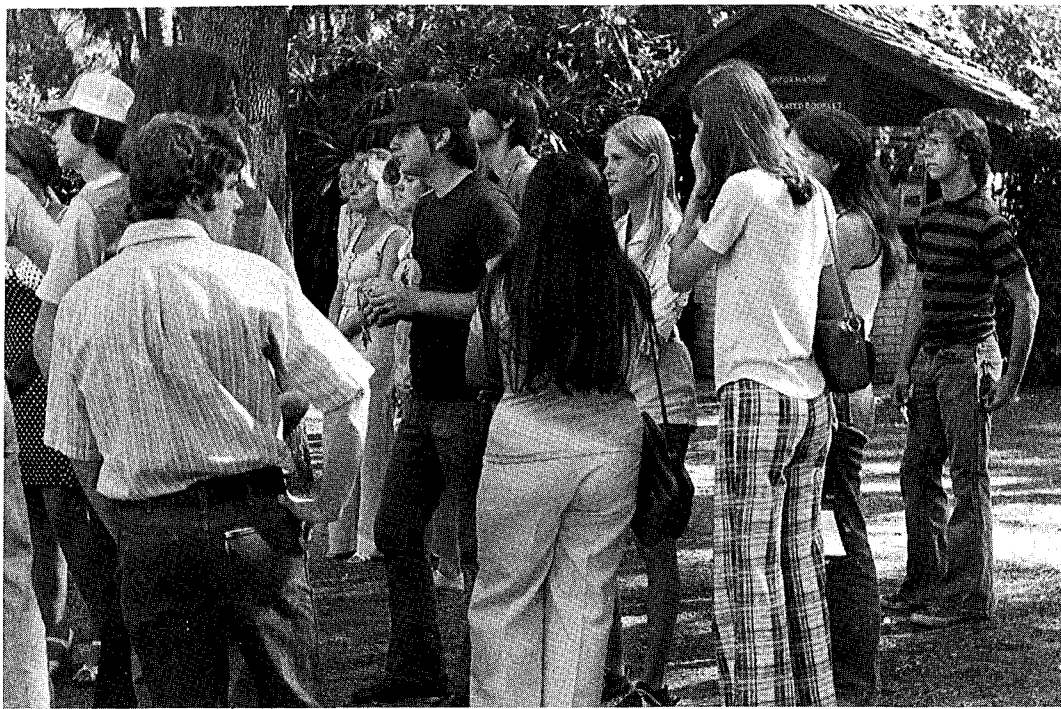
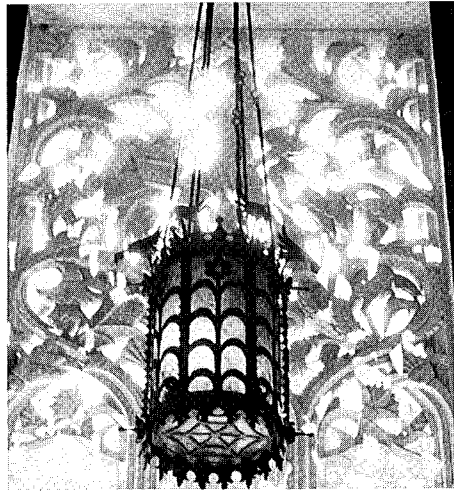
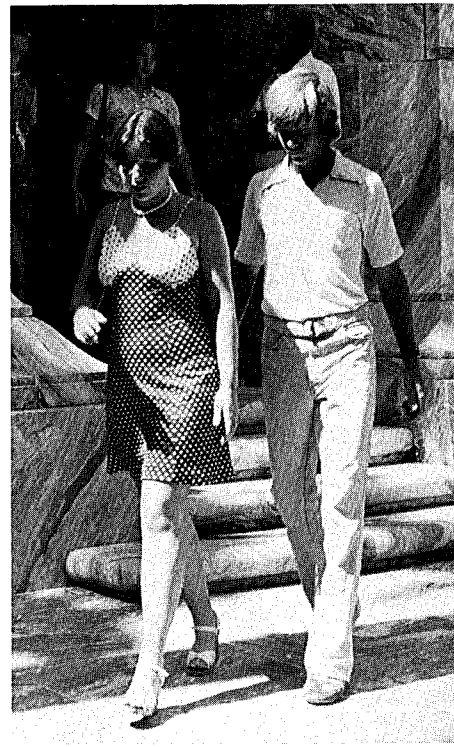
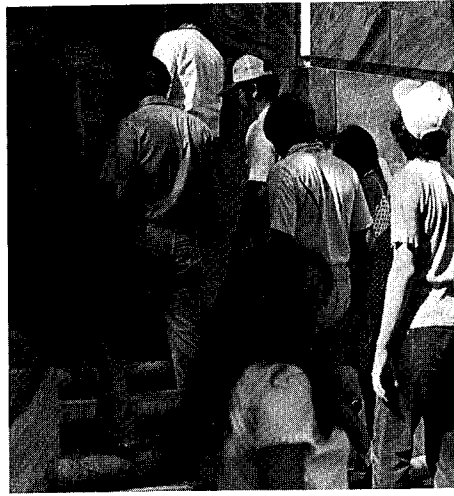


Seniors Enjoy Tower Day And Picnic

After Twelve Years . . . And Then It Rains

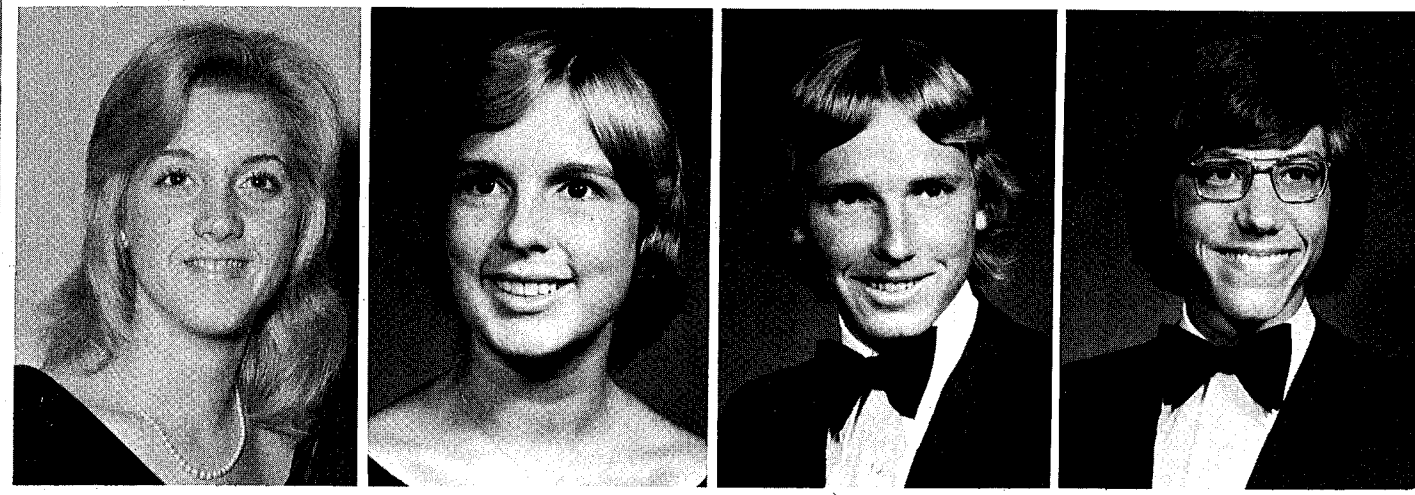

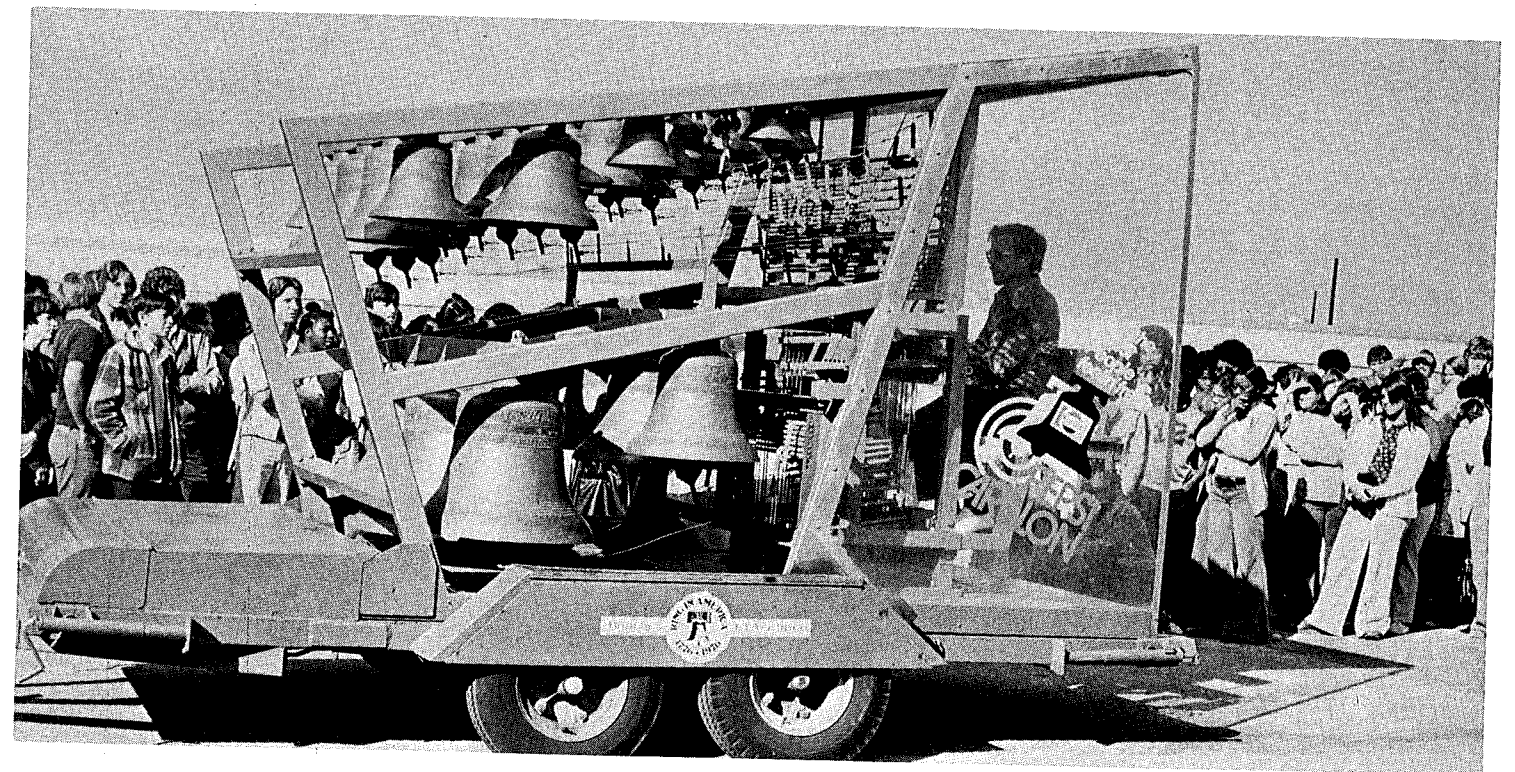


What Was A Bicentennial?

What was a Bicentennial? A Bicentennial was renewing our understanding of the ideas of freedom and unity valued by the American people for two hundred years. The same feelings of freedom and unity were revived here in Lake Wales. In this Bicentennial year, especially, we have looked back on our history and seen the glory of our nation in a different way. A musical group, "Freedom Jam," led us to observe our history through music. The Mobile Carillon also opened the doors to our history with a 1776 style bell choir.

This school has been a part of the Bicentennial along with many others in the U.S.A. Some students contributed to the Bicentennial by painting fire hydrants red, white, and blue. 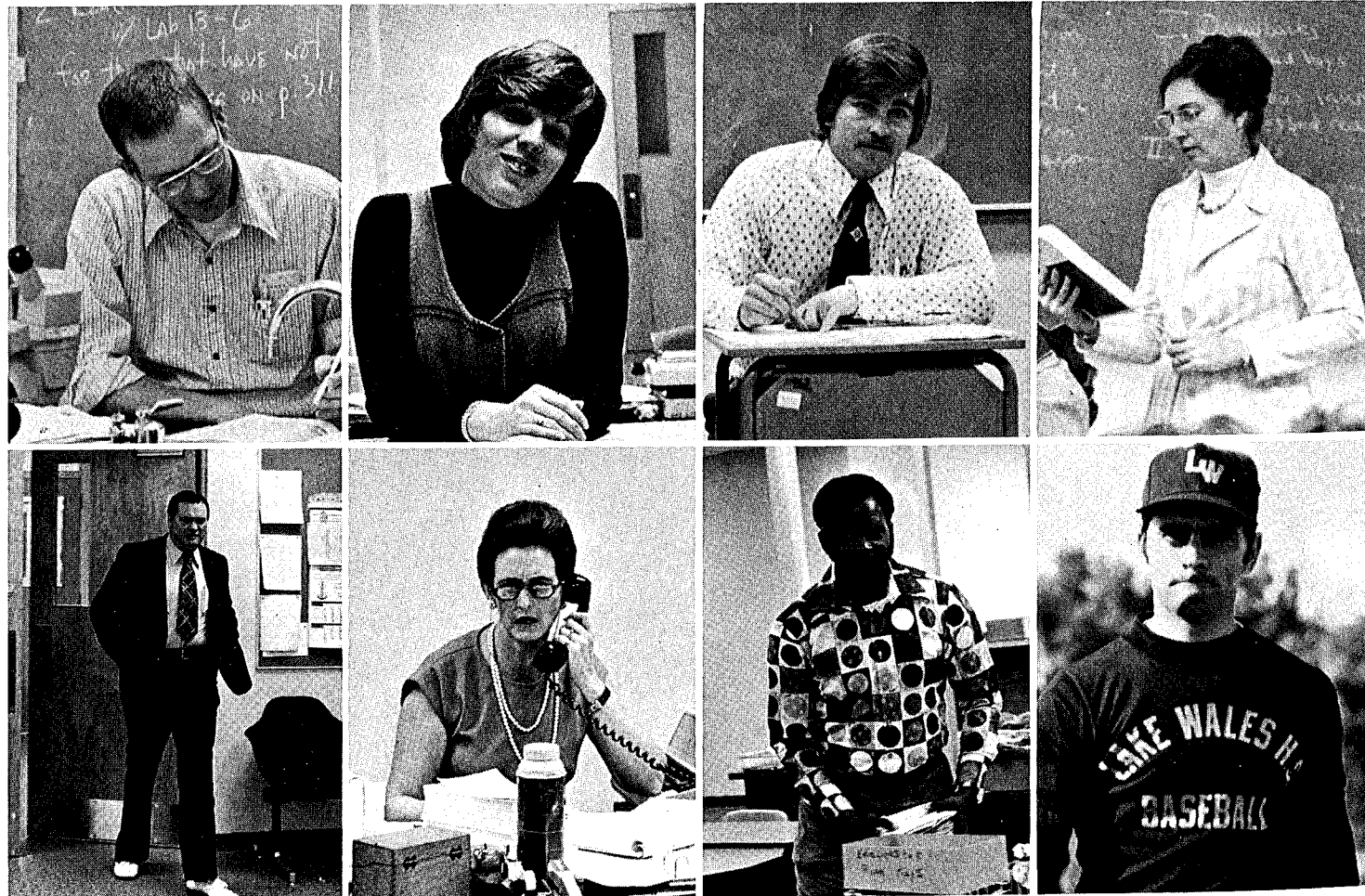

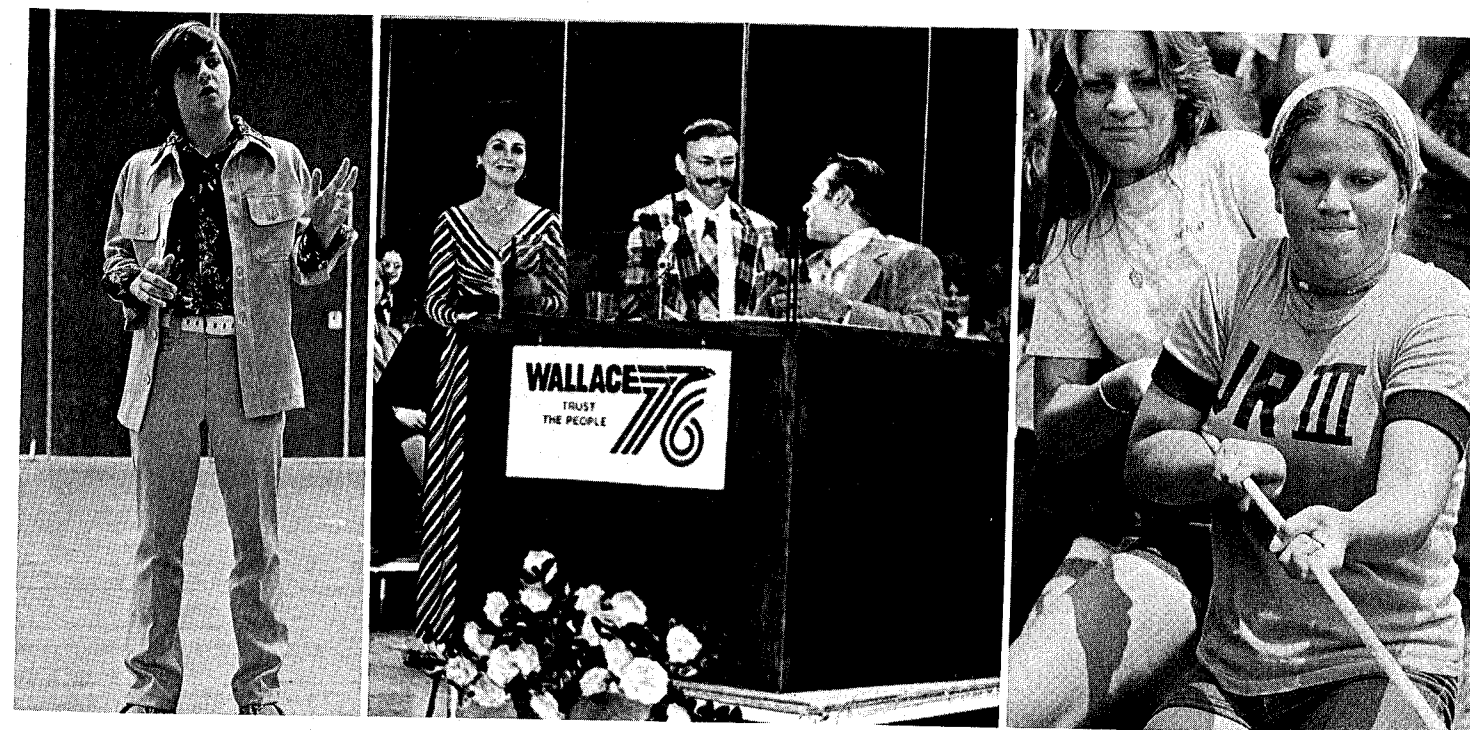

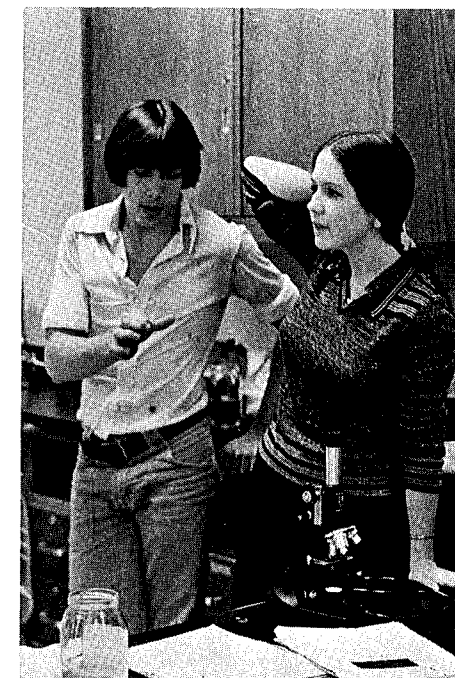
