
PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners of St. Therese,

September is the month of our novena to our beloved patroness, St. Therese. And because of this special centennial year of our Parish, we're proud to host for this Novena one of the experts on the life and spirituality of St. Therese: Fr. Donald Kinney from our Province! He will expound on "all things Therese," along with promoting the visit of her relics a year from now. This is a great opportunity for you all to get to know our beloved patroness in a deeper way!

To prepare ourselves, I'd like to introduce one of the quintessential moments and subsequent teachings in St. Therese's life: "My Vocation is Love." —Fr. Peter Mary

Introduction to the Text



St. Therese's vocation as a Carmelite was "not enough" for her; she needed a response from God: Therese searched for it in the Scriptures. She dreamed of responding to all vocations, everywhere and in all times—and in their most heroic forms. It was with the Apostle Paul that she found the reply, when he declared that Love comprises all vocations.

"My only love" (MS. B, 2v): This is what Therese was to carve like graffiti on the lintel of the door of her cell: "Jesus is my only Love."

"The courage of a Crusader, of a Papal Guard": Therese, like her sister Celine, always had the quality of a warrior and a knight. She was quick to use military vocabulary. Thus, in Poem 36, she had no hesitation in saying: "And in the field of my apostolate/ Like a warrior, I hurl myself into combat!"

"Missionary": One vocation that she carried out to the full, because she was proclaimed "Patroness of the Missions and Missionaries" by Pope Pius XI on December 14, 1927.

"Martyrdom": Among all the vocations that Therese sensed in herself, martyrdom was the dominant one. She rediscovered the martyrs during her pilgrimage to Italy, and her favorite martyr was St. Joan of Arc, around whom she wrote two plays (RP1 and RP3).

"To offer myself as a Victim for your Love": Therese returns here to her *Act of Offering to Merciful Love,* which she had made on June 9, 1895. However, here she lays more emphasis on weakness, childhood, and smallness.

"May He convert this fire into nothingness": Apart from one mention in Manuscript A, the word "nothingness" only appears with Therese in connection with the trial of faith.

this anniversary year of our Parish, the Novena to St. Therese (September 22-30) and her feast day on October 1 will be especially joyful. We have invited Fr. Donald Kinney, OCD, to offer the Mass and preach each evening. He owes

his vocation to St. Therese. He was ordained here on October 1, 1988. Fr. Donald is now assigned at the Carmelite House of Prayer in Oakville, in the Napa Valley.

Also during the Novena, Fr. Donald will be promoting the visit of the reliquary of St. Therese. It will be coming to Alhambra and our Parish from October 11 to 13, 2025. The year 2025 is also the 100th anniversary of the Canonization of St. Therese and a Jubilee Year in the entire Church.

On Saturdays and Sundays (September 22, 28, and 29), the Novena Mass will be at 5:00 p.m. On the weekdays, the Mass will be at 7:15 p.m. During this Novena, the Tuesday evening Mass will be in English. On October 1, the Feast of St. Therese, the Mass will be at 7:15 p.m.

These will be days of great grace! Plan to attend, and invite others to come with you!

Novena with Fr. Donald Kinney, OCD | The "Mystery of the Church"


Fr. Stephen Watson, OCD, invites everyone to attend a new series of classes he will conduct on the Mystery of the Church. These lectures will also serve as a catechetical mystagogy for the newly baptized. Mystagogy is a term that comes from the Greek word meaning, "to lead mysteries." through the Catechism describes mystagogy as a



"liturgical catechesis that aims to initiate people into the mystery of Christ" (CCC 1075). Mystagogy is the form of catechesis that expounds on the spiritual treasures contained in the sacraments. St. Augustine refers to the Church as the "wondrous sacrament born from Christ's side."

The Acts of the Apostles will serve as a primary reference for these classes. Fr. Stephen will also lead the class in a close reading of Lumen Gentium, which is the dogmatic constitution on the Church of the Second Vatican Council (Vatican II). The hymn, The Church's One Foundation, embodies the theme and content of these classes.

These lectures will begin with two classes—on Tuesday, September 17, and Wednesday, September 18, from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m. The first two classes are back-to-back due to the novena to St. Therese. Thereafter, they will take place twice a month on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month.



Eucharistic Adoration

"Could you not watch one hour with me?"
-Mark 14:37

"A thousand years of enjoying human glory is not worth even an hour spent sweetly communing with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament."

-St. Pio of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio) May 25, 1887 – September 23, 1968

Padre Pio was a 20th century Mystic and Stigmatic, as well as a Patron Saint of Eucharistic Adorers because of how often he would be found in Adoration. He instructed his fellow friars "When you want to find me, come near the Tabernacle." As a young man, before he entered the priesthood, he spent hours in the church, adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. After his ordination, he took a long time for the Consecration of the Mass, to the point where parishioners complained about all the time he spent in ecstasy. He had to control himself, to break out of his ecstasy, and force himself back to the Mass, at the orders of his superiors.

He told us, "When Mass ended, I remained with Jesus to render Him thanks. My thirst and hunger do not diminish after I have received Him in the Blessed Sacrament, but rather, increase steadily. Oh, how sweet was the conversation I held with Paradise this morning. The Heart of Jesus and my own, if you will

pardon my expression, fused. They were no longer two hearts beating but only one. My heart disappeared as if it were a drop in the ocean."





"LET ME INTRODUCE YOU..." By Fr. Stephen F. Watson OCD



You may have seen her on Sundays as she moves from the sacristy to the sanctuary setting up for the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Masses. She might strike you as someone you've seen working in a bank—attentive, competent, and with good posture. Her cheeks are the color of peaches and cream. That would be Mary Rose Schneider. She is the daughter of the late Robert and Mary Ann Schneider. This is her family story.

Robert Schneider, Sr., was born in Buffalo—long before the Buffalo Bills were established—and then moved with his family to Glendale, California, during the Great Depression. Their migration may have had as much to do with the cold winters in Buffalo as the economy. After high school, Bob joined the Army. Because of his "skill set" acquired in high school, he was a clerk-typist, a sort of "Radar" Schneider, if you will. He was attached to George Patton's unit at the beginning of the Battle of the Bulge. When the war ended, he served another year in Germany as a court clerk for the Judge Advocate General, i.e. JAG. Not long after returning to the States, he got a job at Bank of America.

Enter Mary Ann McDonald. She also worked at Bank of America. A Jewish customer of the Bank encouraged Bob to "court" Mary Ann. *Hello, Dolly!* The matchmaker made a good match. Bob and Mary Ann were married at Mission San Gabriel in April of 1961. They were blessed on Valentine's Day, 1963, with a boy, whom they named

Robert Joseph, Jr. Two years later, the above-mentioned Mary Rose was born. Both children were baptized at St. Therese. In the early seventies, a little before the golden jubilee of the parish, Bob and Mary Ann bought a house on West Roses Road where San Gabriel, San Marino, and Alhambra meet. This has been the Schneider home ever since, where the Schneider brother and sister still live.

From the beginning, the Schneiders became active parishioners at St. Therese, and both children went to our Parish School. Mary Rose was just starting first grade when they moved into their home on Roses Road. Mrs. Mary Ann Schneider was a stay-at-home mom, and happily so. You can be sure she was involved with her children's education—but not only her *own* children's. For many years Mrs. Schneider, a certified catechist, prepared our Parish children for their sacraments in our Religious Ed program. She also helped Sister Rita with the R.C.I.A. program. Deacon Rex Owens was one of the catechumens in the program at that time. She also was in the Carmelite Nuns' Auxiliary, and it meant so much to her.

Mary Ann and Bob were lectors and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, including bringint Holy Communion to the homebound. Bob also served on the Parish Finance Council. Meanwhile, their children, Bob Jr., and Mary Rose, went to La Salle College Preparatory and Alverno Heights Academy, respectively. In college, Bob, Jr., pursued studies in history and his sister majored in business economy at UCLA. Later, Mary Rose served on the Parish Finance Council like her father. She was also a Sunday school teacher with her mother. Even today, in addition to being a sacristan, Mary Rose helps Florence with the children's Religious Ed program and she is also a lector. You might be thinking, "All work and no play makes Jack a dull boy." No, not them! The Schneiders knew how to have fun. They went on wonderful family vacations to Europe and elsewhere.

Bob and Mary Ann must have heard the Carmelite nuns often say, "You'll get your reward in Heaven," as compensation for their volunteer work. They, indeed, have gone on to their reward. Like their parents, both Bob Jr., and Mary Rose worked for Bank of America. After forty some years, Bob, Jr., encountered some health issues and retired from the bank; however, Mary Rose is still there. But her greatest joy is serving the Lord, which she has done so faithfully and cheerfully. The Schneiders have been a big part of St. Therese Parish for the last fifty years.
