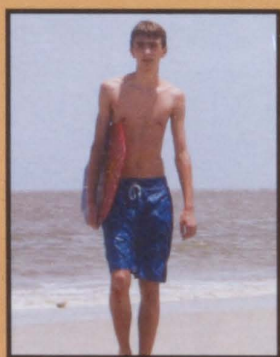
1. **Senior Kayla Williams** says, "Who ever said visiting Civil War battlegrounds aren't fun?"

Senior Melissa Robertson says, "Going to Alaska was crazy. It would be around 70 degrees and then out of no where there would be an ice cave you had to crawl through."



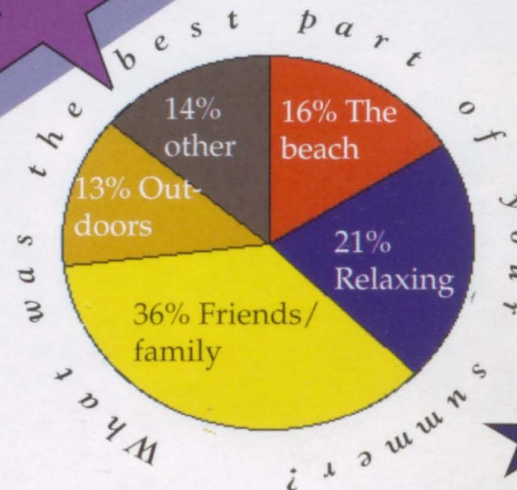

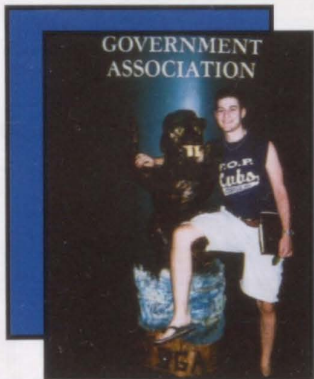
Crossvegas

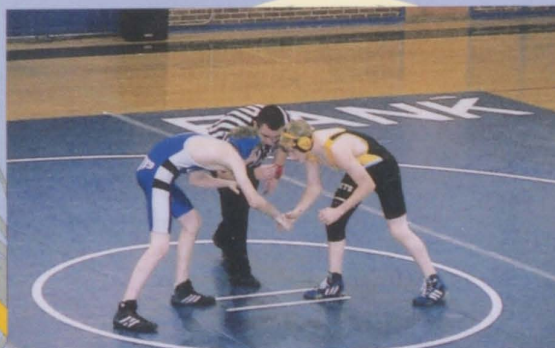
Seniors Munch and Jackson also hope to cap off their senior year with berths to the state tournament. Way to go JETS!

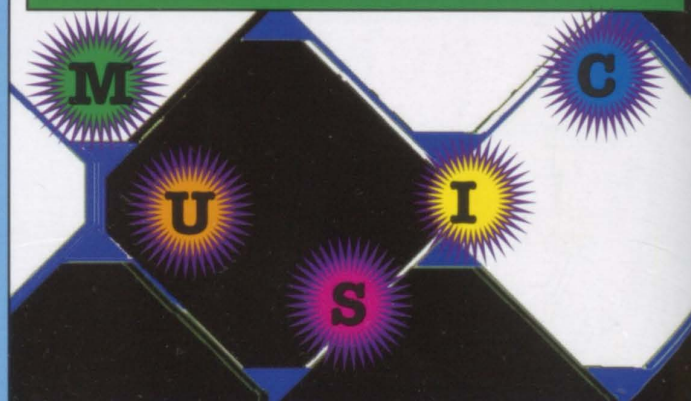
fellow classmates.

"Playing guitar gives me something to do when I'm really bored, and it also calms me down a lot," responded Junior Dalton Bell.

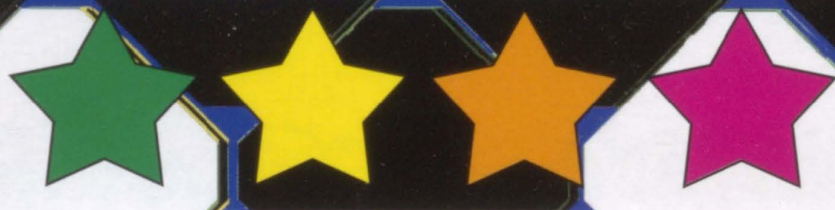

"Journalism is not that easy. We have to brainstorm and gather information before we actually write and produce the paper," comments Senior **Melissa Robertson**.

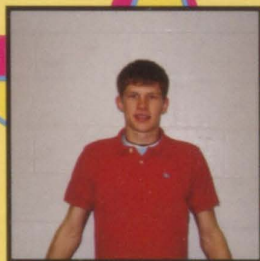


"As the Features Editor, I make sure everyone in my department has done their article on time, and I collect the articles to be edited," comments Senior **Grace Walker**.

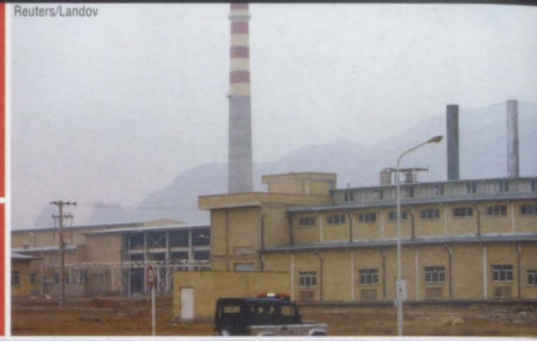
