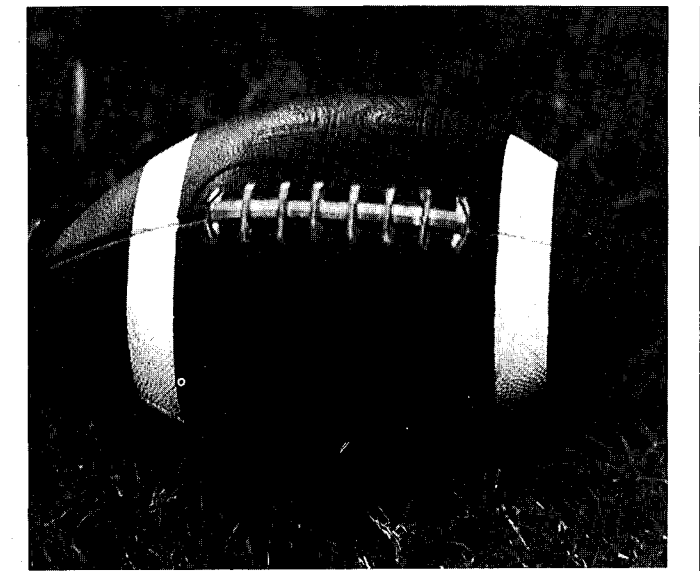
Highlanders Begin With Victory

Victory Follows Defeat

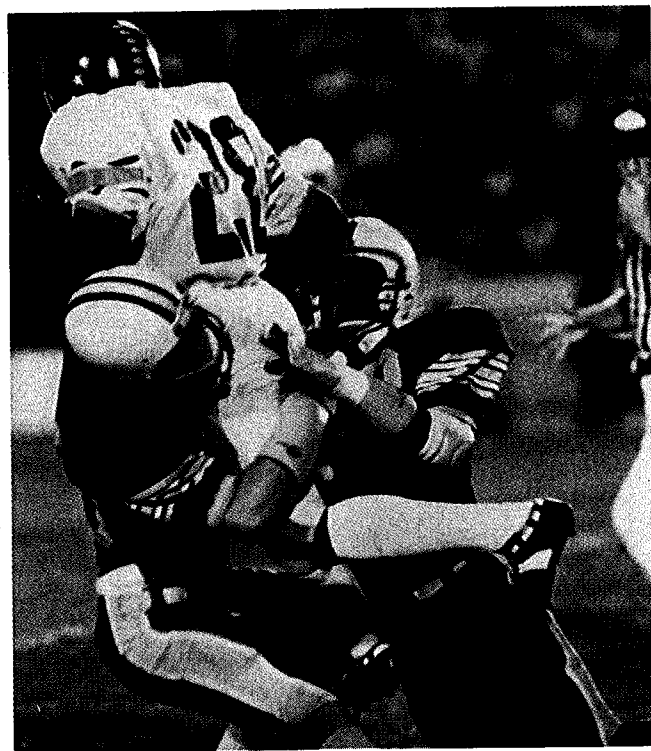

Fired-Up Freshmen

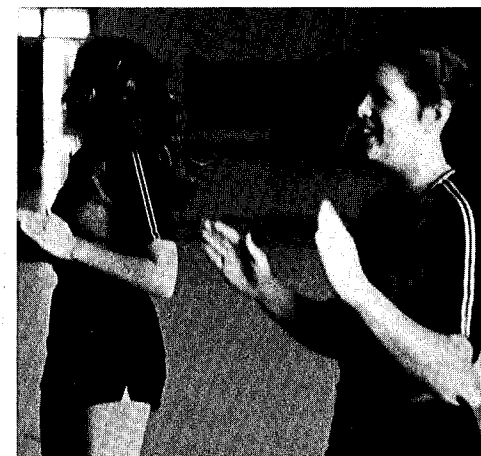

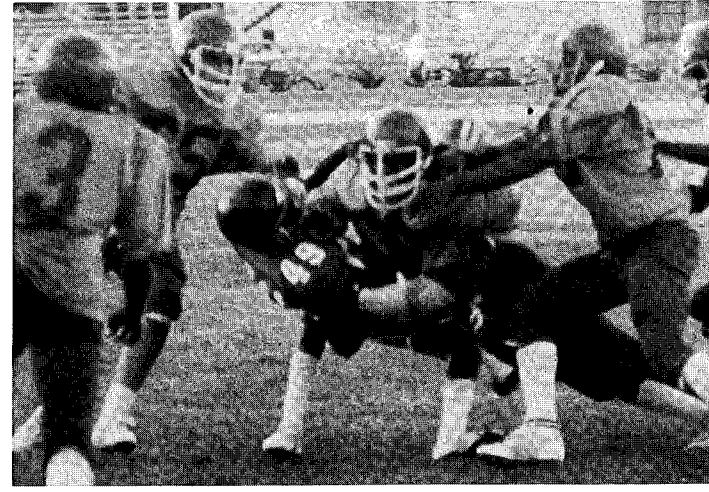
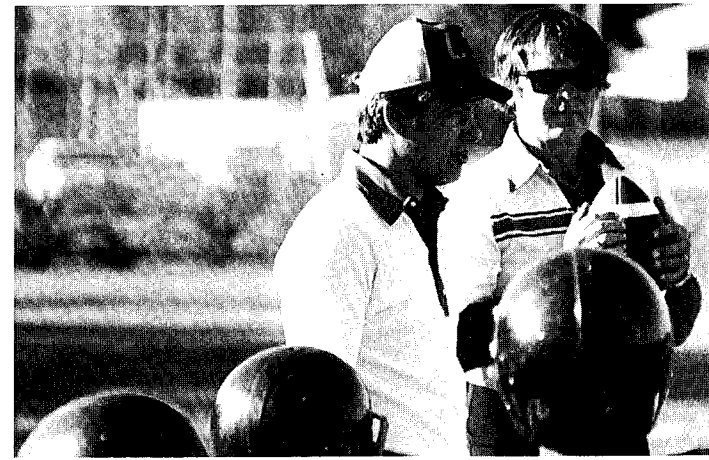

Freshman Highlanders Hold Heads Up High

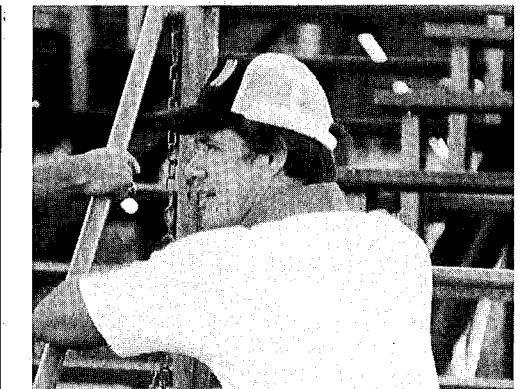
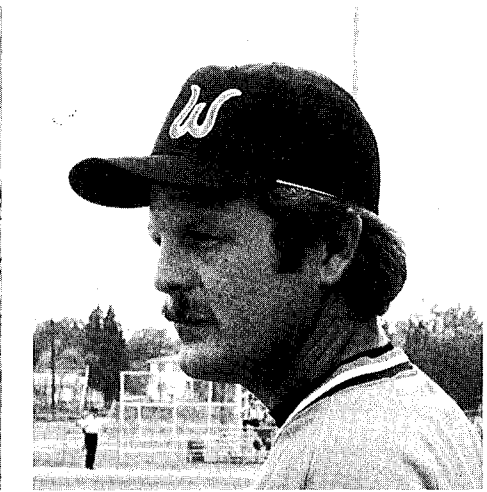
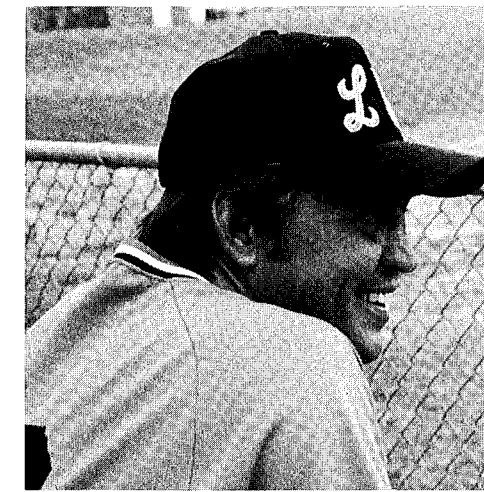

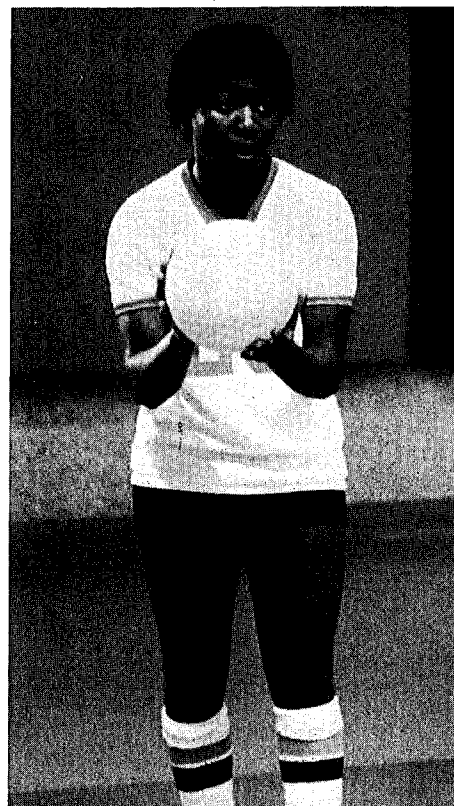
Lake Wales Sets to Spike Bartow

Although their hustling overpowered Bartow, inexperience left them with a 3-10 record. Each girl's hard work made a spirit filled season.

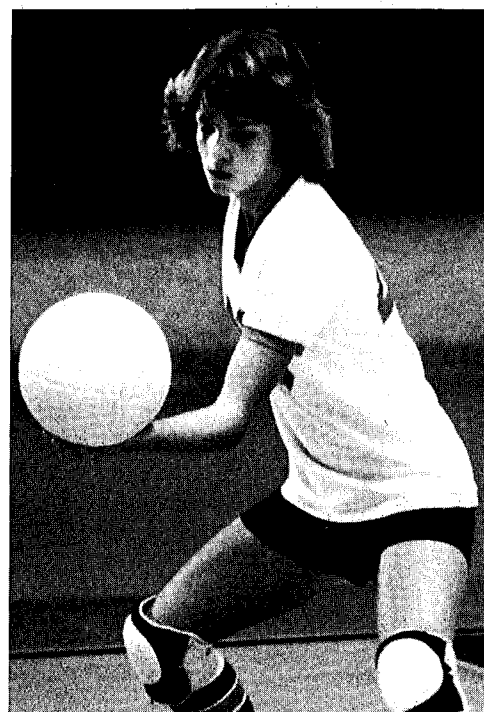

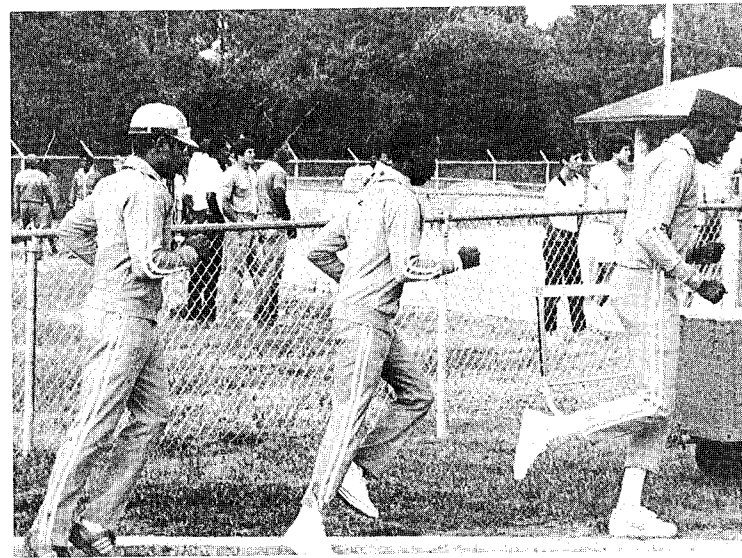
Williams Running Wild

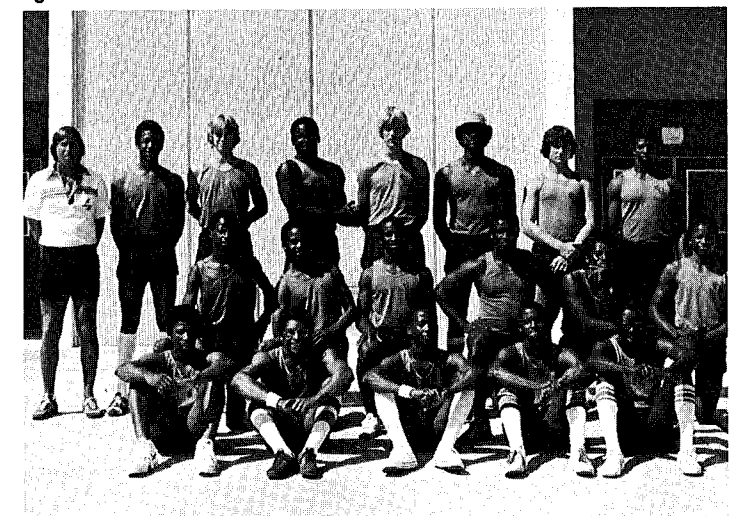
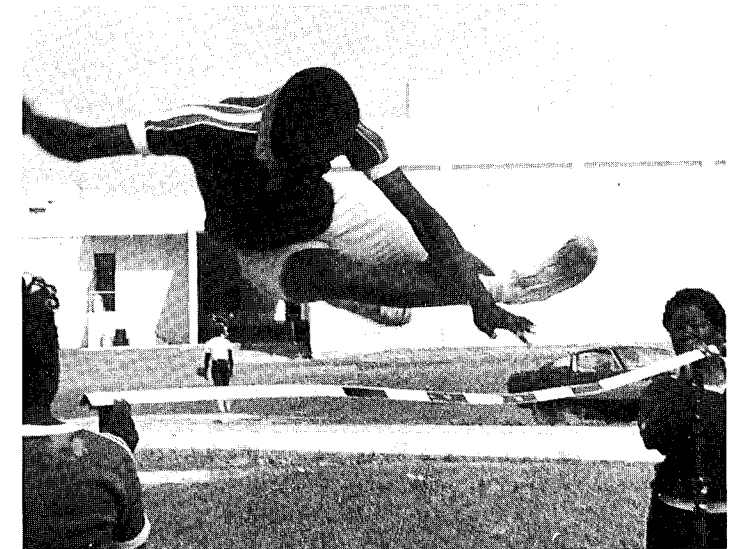
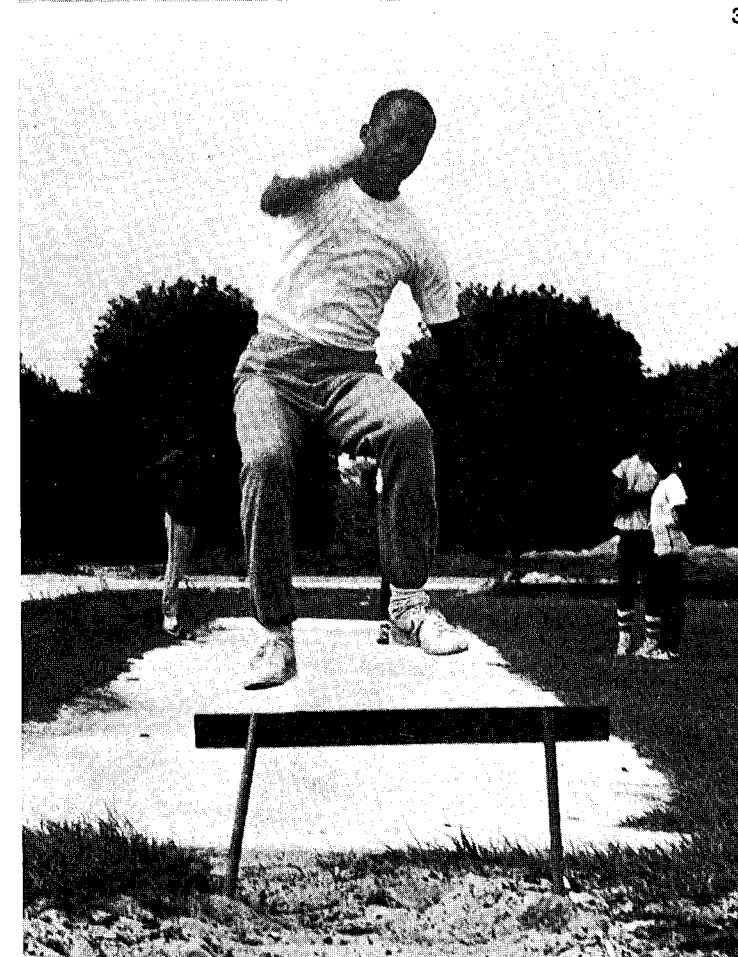
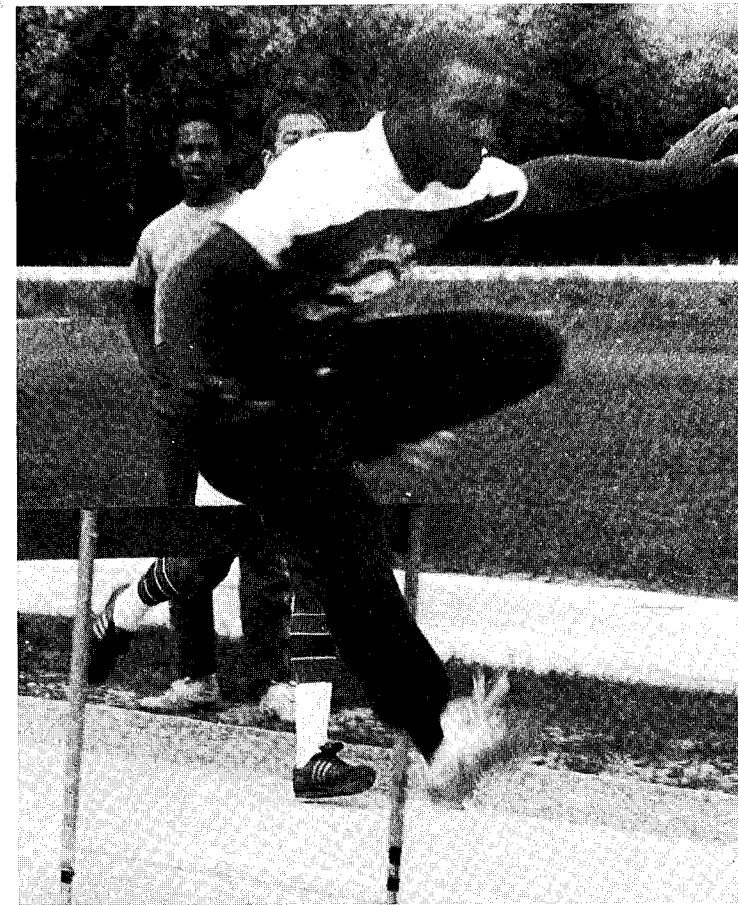
The relay team had won District therefore qualified for Regional which was scheduled for the same date as Natural High's state choral contest which George also belonged to. Without George the team would be severely handicapped. At 5:00 P.M. just thirty minutes before they were scheduled to run, George flew into Ft. Myers' airport and just made the race, helping the team to a Regional victory. The Track team as a whole placed 2nd in the District, 5th in the Region and 8th in the state.

It was also a successful season for the Lady Highlanders. Although not winning big they improved immensely from last year. The team's 440 relay and track star Gwendelyn Feagin went to Regionals after qualifying at District. Gwen qualified in the broad jump, the 220 and the 100 yard dash.

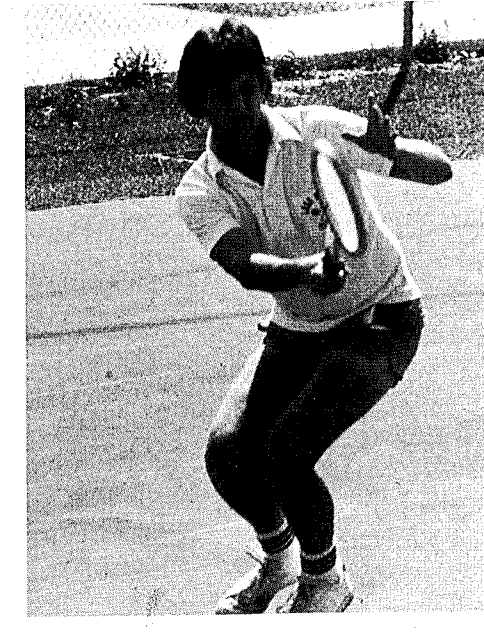
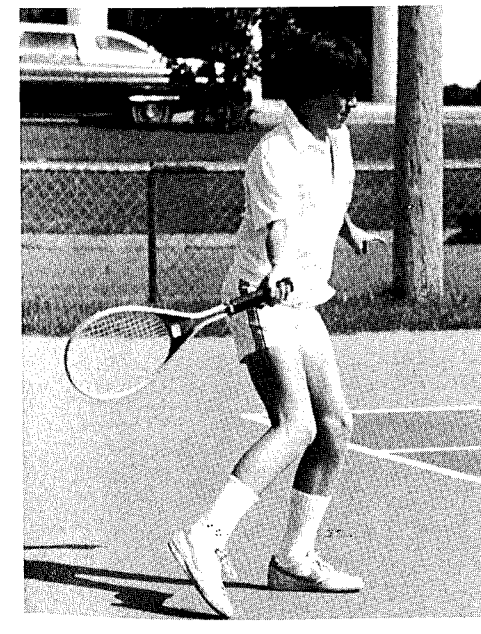
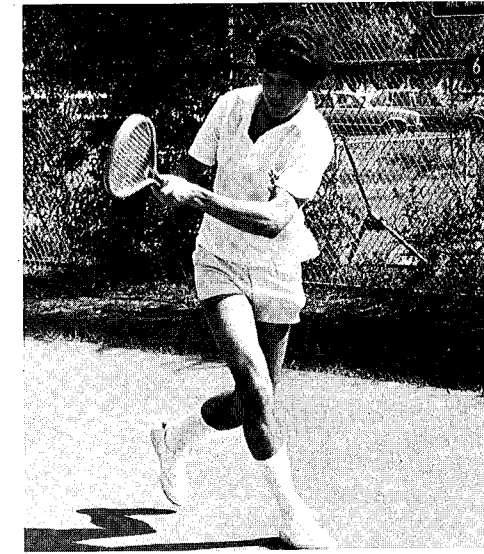
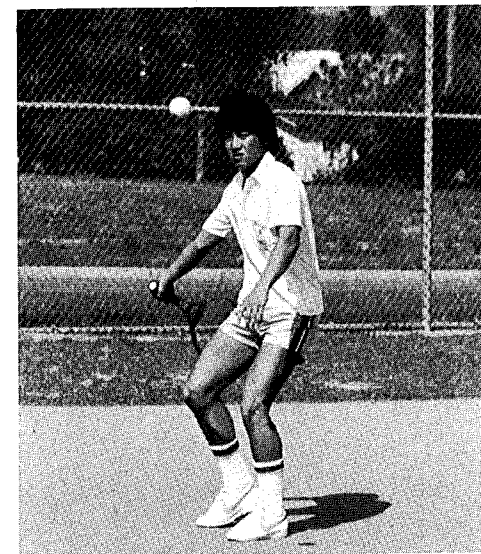
Boys Rack-Up Victories

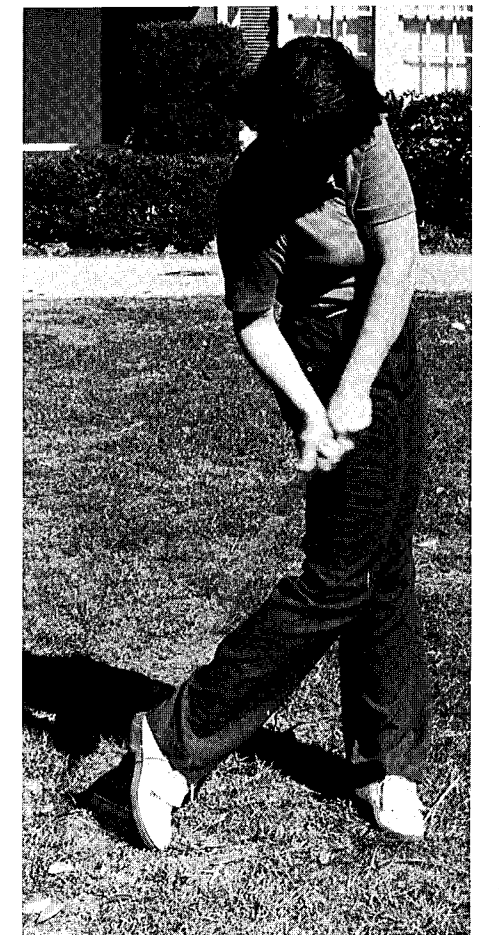

Swim Team Strokes Up a Storm

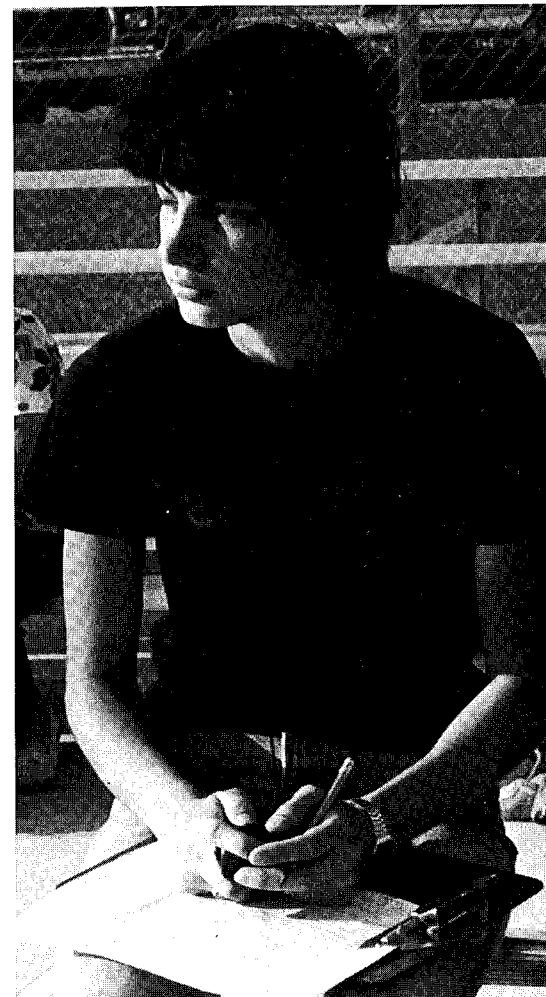

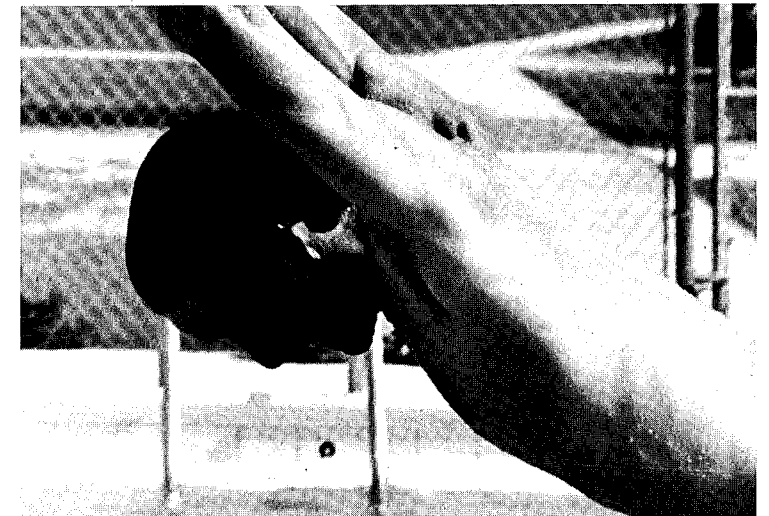

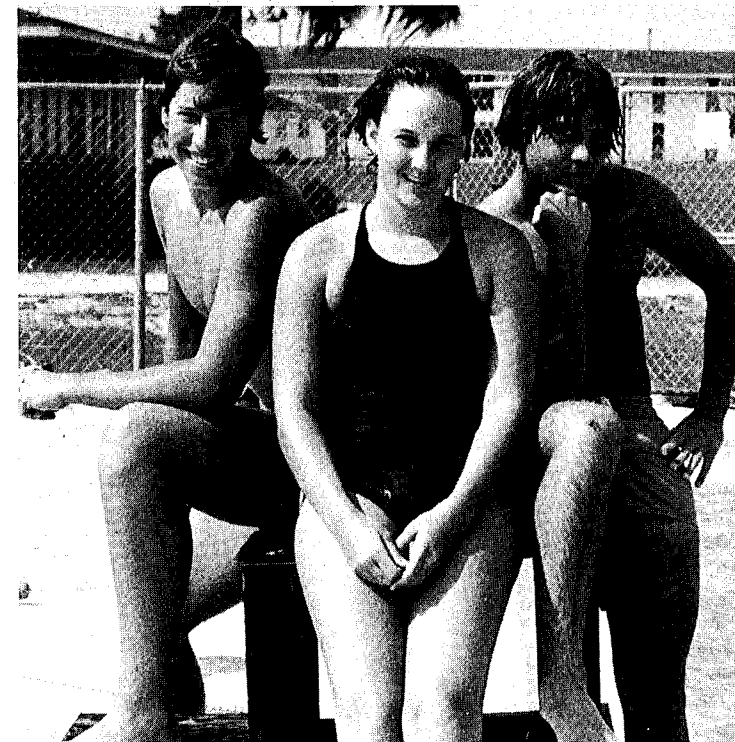

Baseball Team Second in State

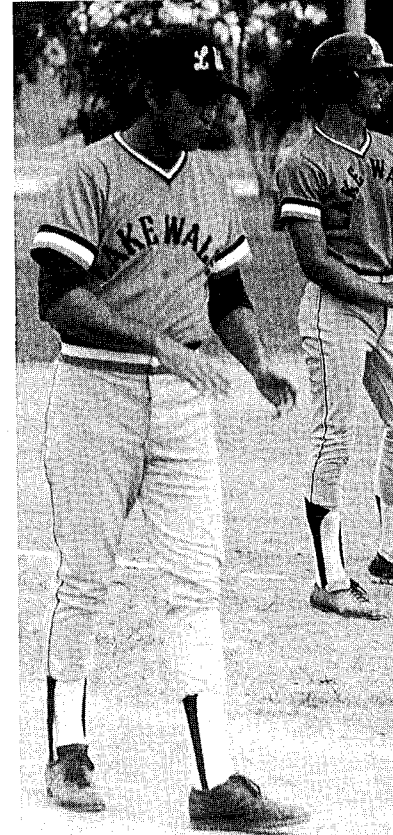

The girls started the season late because too few girls tried out for the team. Overall, the girls gained experience. The experience will help them become better players and become more competitive.

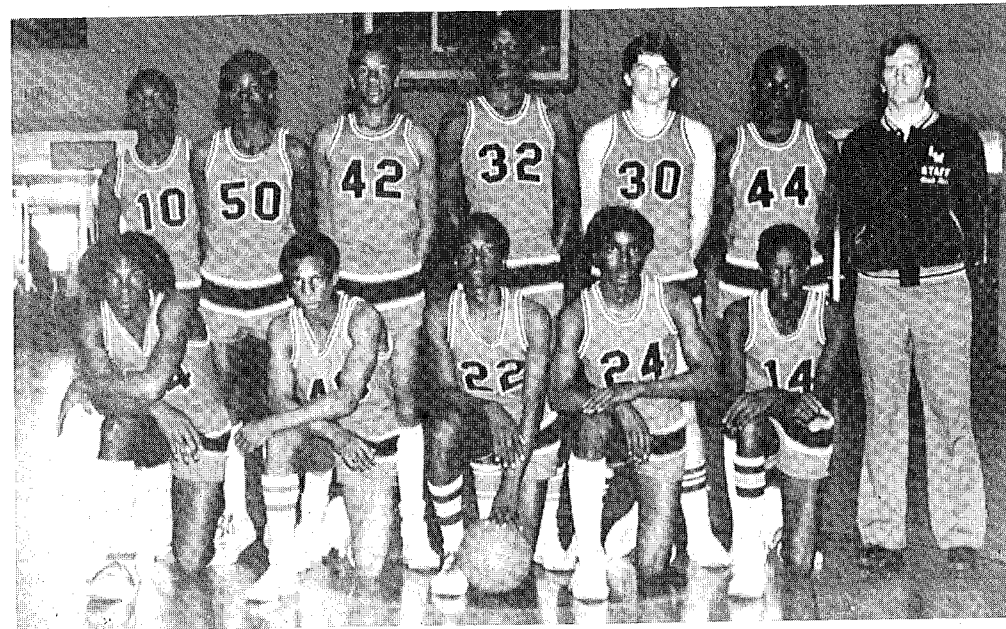
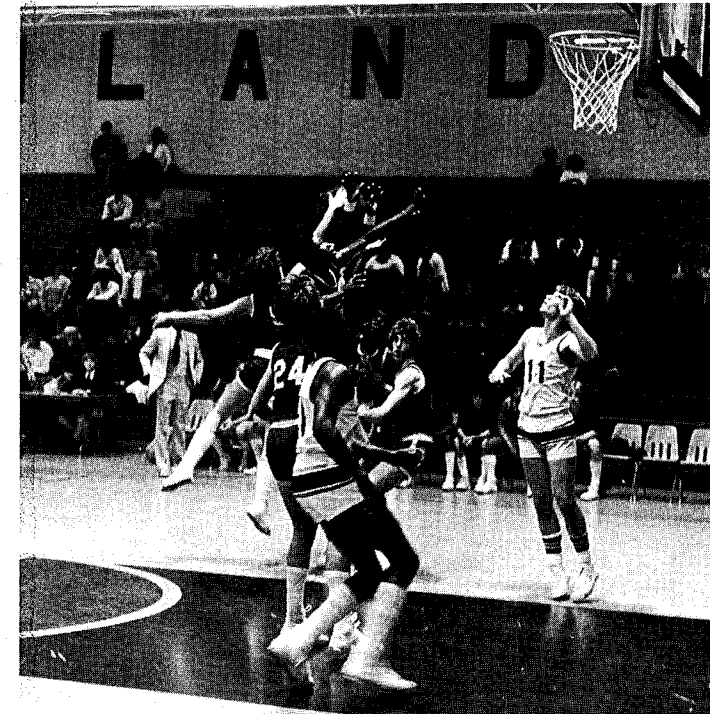
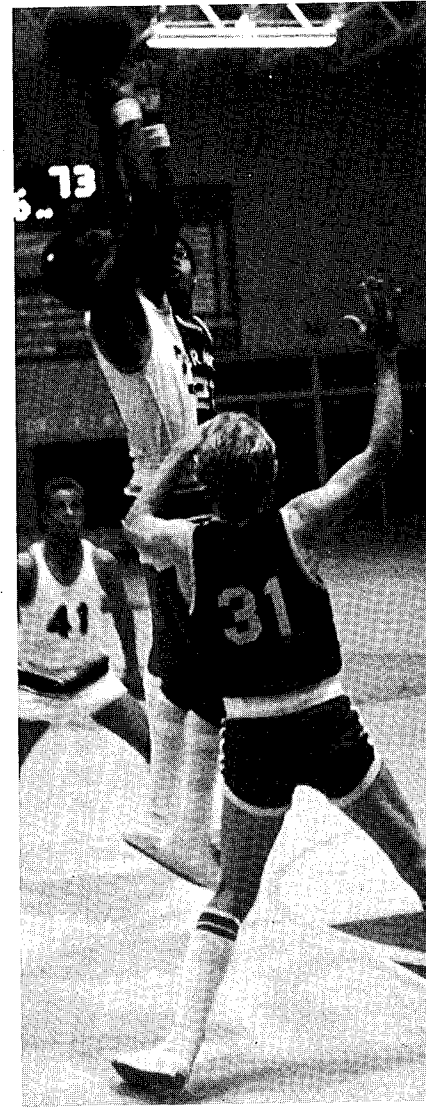
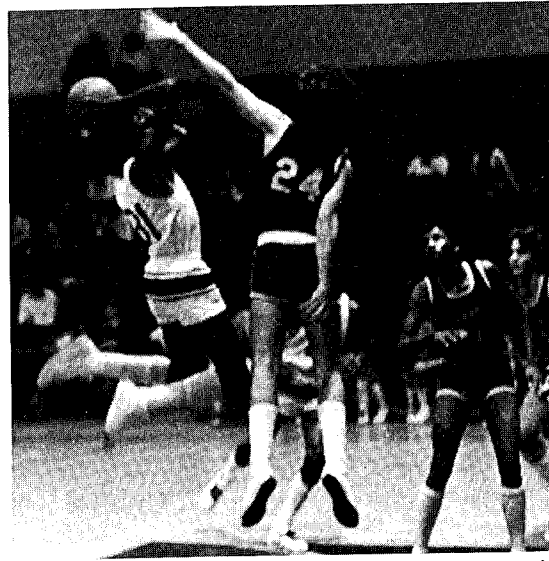

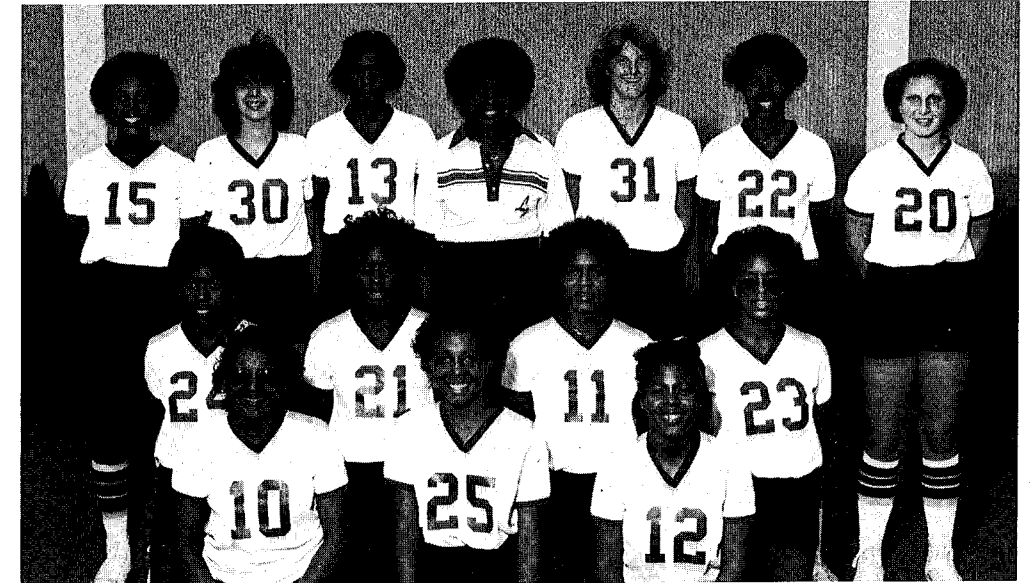
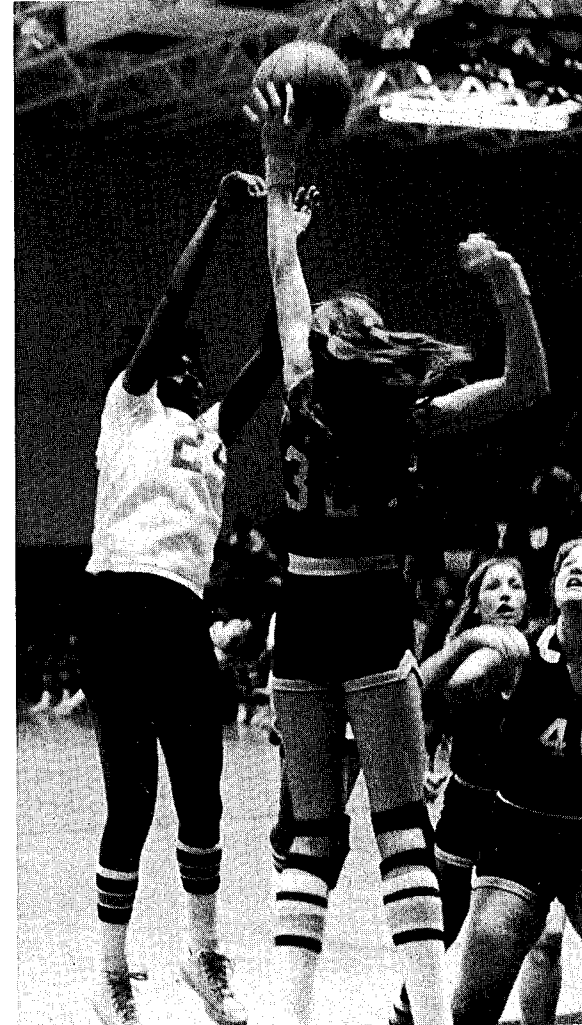
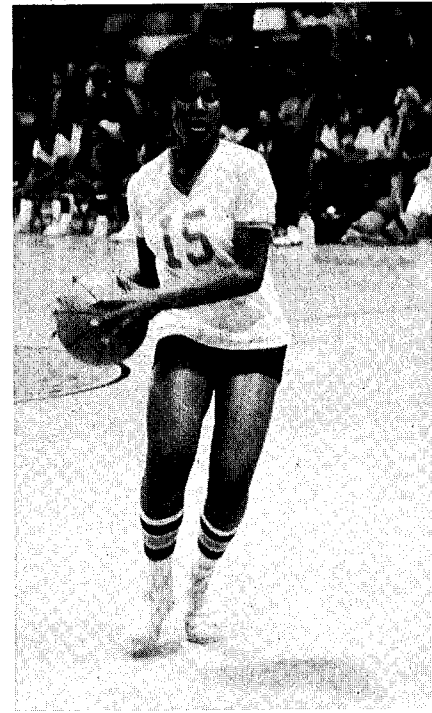
Lady Highlanders Rebound After Slow Start

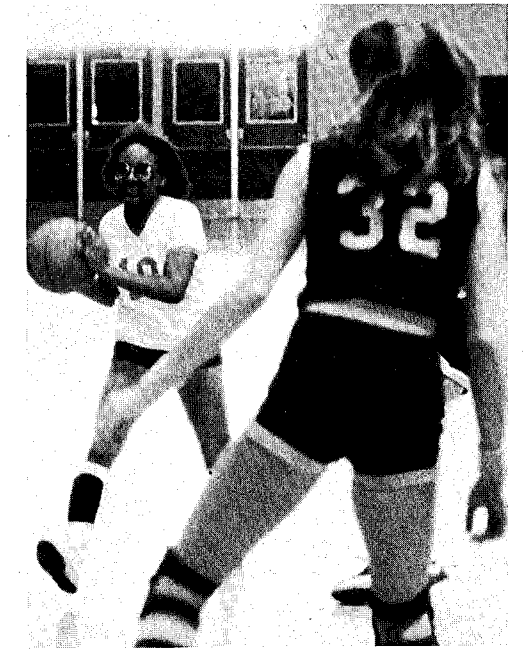
The girls went into the District play-off games as defending champs, but ended up losing in the second round. That game was heartbreaking, as they lost by one point.

Mrs. Ferguson stated in closing, "This is not the end for our senior players, only the beginning of bigger and better things."

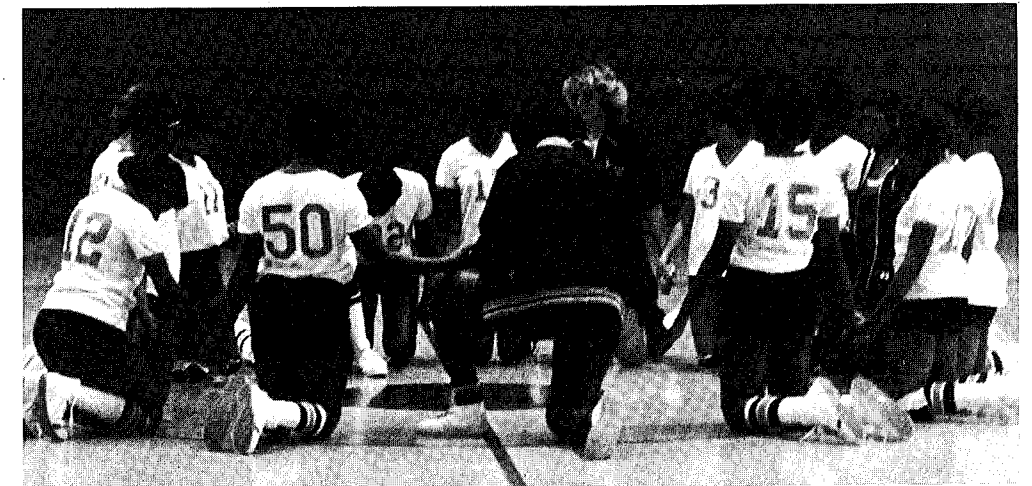

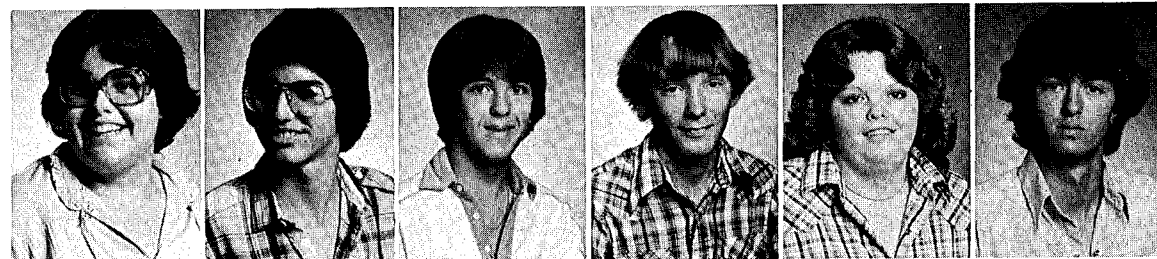
Sophomores Show Super Spirit

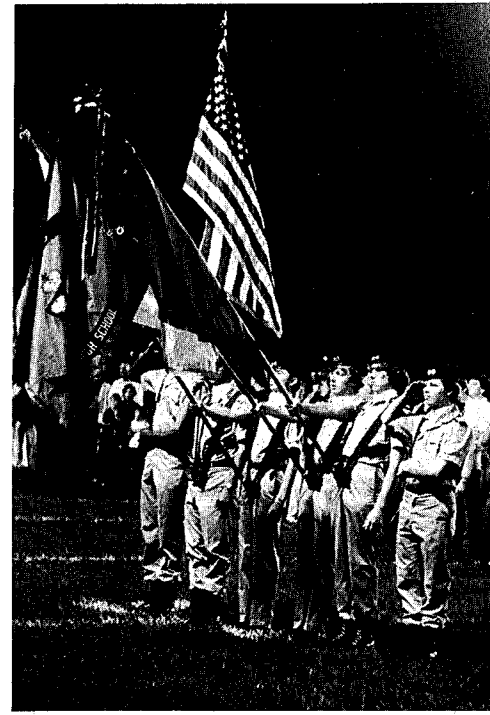
JROTC Shines

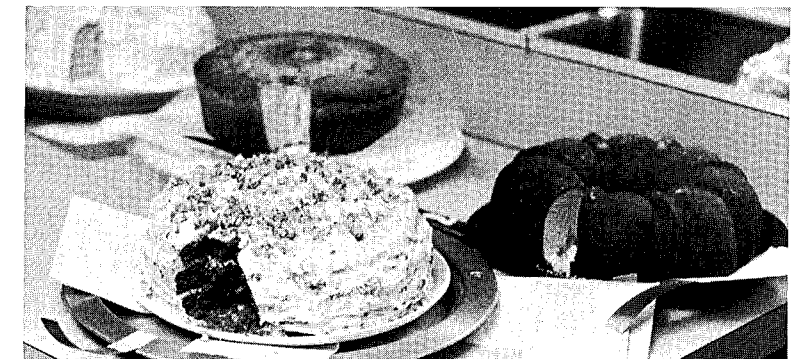
FHA Hero Holds Youth Fair

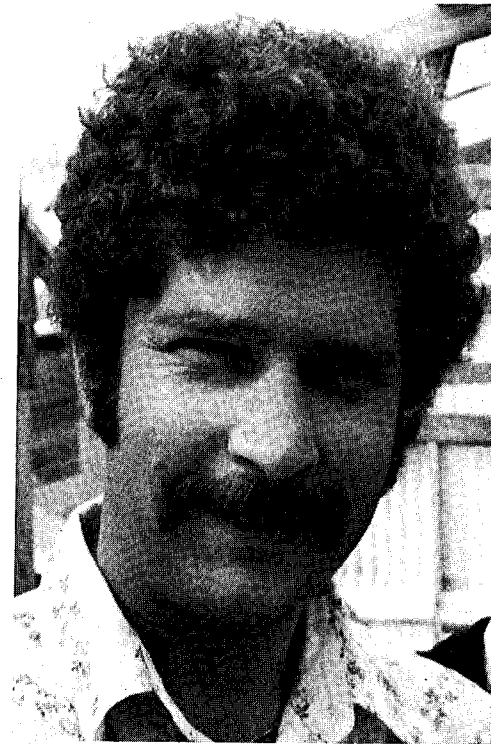

Judging School Helps at State

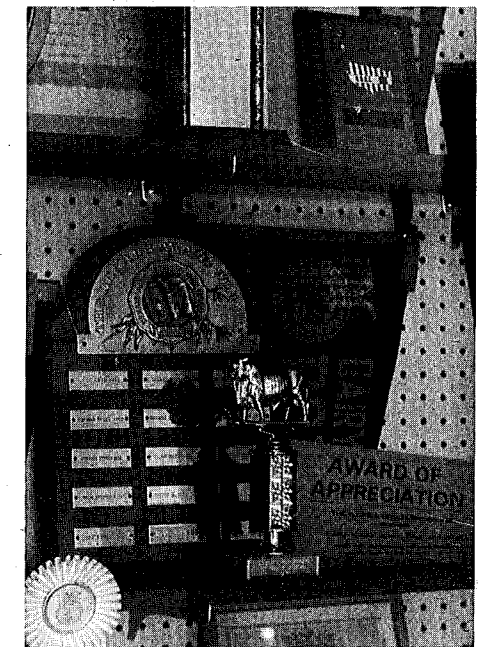

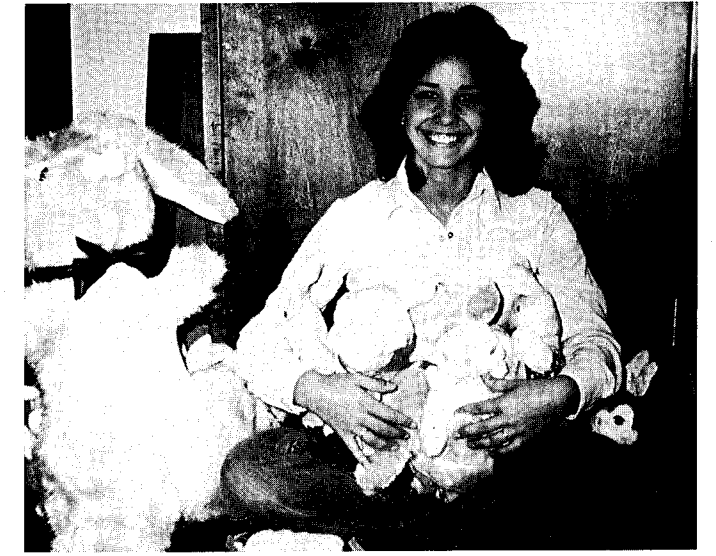
Kim Sims Runs for State Office

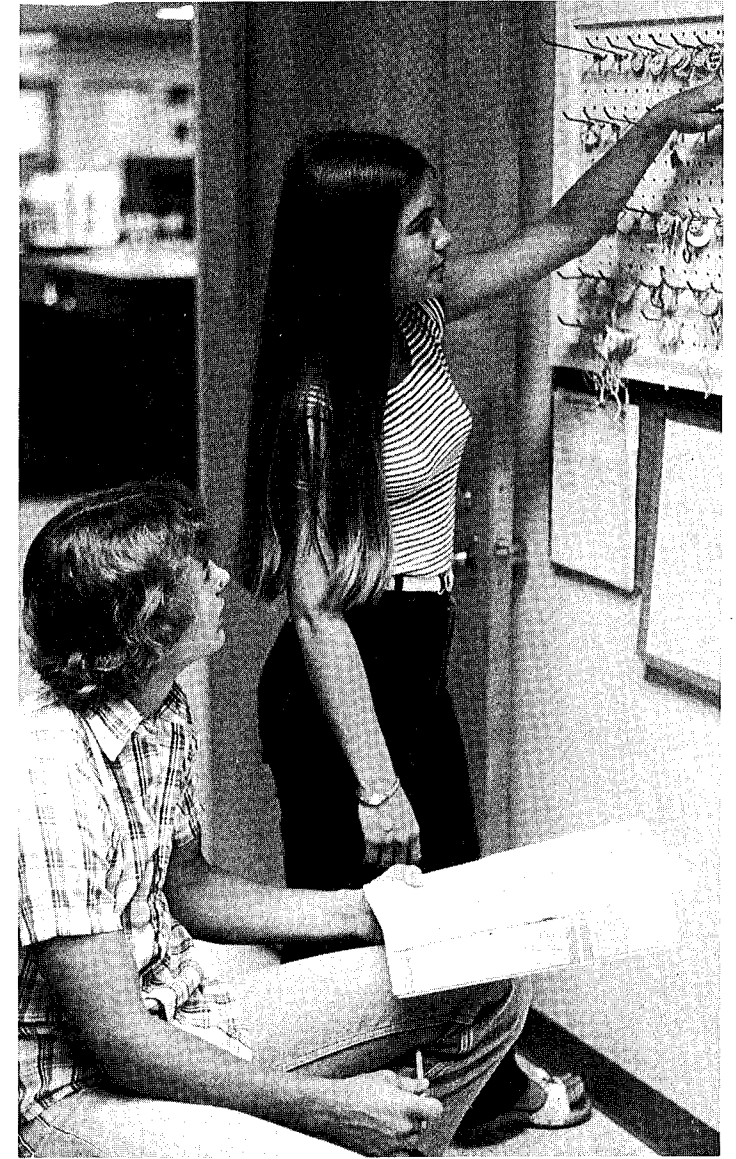
