EARN COLLEGE CREDIT

Each language track ends in the senior year with classes that earn credits through the University of Connecticut's Early College Experience program, which are transferrable to most universities. Students in French 4 and 5, in Latin 3 and 4 both earn 3 UConn credits in their junior and senior year for a total of 6 credits. Students in UConn Spanish V earn 6 credits and students in Perspectives on Latin America (available in addition to Spanish V) earn 3 credits.

The department also encourages students to take more than one World Language if they are interested.
