Dear Parishioners,

Monday of this week we have celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, normally celebrated December 8. This year, because December 8 falls on a Sunday, the feast is transferred, but unlike the last times the feast was transferred to Monday, the obligation is not lifted.

This is perhaps a little confusing, but the US bishops recently received instructions that our National Feast Day is to be celebrated with Mass attendance due to its significance. Again, in a change from the regular: The feast of the Immaculate Conception is to be celebrated with Obligation every year, even when it is transferred to Monday. Mass attendance is obligatory, and we will have two Masses – 10:30 am at St. Edward, and 5:30 pm St. Eloi.

Our Blessed Mother, the immaculately conceived one, is our patroness. She is a model of the Church in its perfection, conceived in Christ as a sinless entity. The Blessed Virgin has all grace and spiritual blessings poured upon her, as does the Church, which has been given every spiritual blessing in the heavens (in fact, the word usually translated as "highly favored" is used in Ephesians 1:3 for the blessings that the Church has received). Contemplating the Blessed Mother's first moments, chosen by God and redeemed from that first moment of conception from the stain of original sin, shows us the dignity of the Church.

As we continue to enter into Advent, I again encourage us to try to resist the temptation to begin our Christmas celebration. I am deeply convinced that the more we enter into the deeper meaning of Advent, the better we will celebrate Christmas. Certainly, we have certain things that perhaps we need to do—cards and gifts, and some other things, but to let these days be more on prayer and preparation for the Lord's coming.
