## TK and Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

This week, kindergarten students are reviewing letter sounds. Your child should know the sounds for a, c, d, f, g, h, i, m, n, o, p, s, t, v, e, and z. Students are using these sounds to blend and read CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant) words. In writing, kindergarteners are practicing how to write complete sentences that begin with a capital letter, include finger spaces, and end with a period.

In math, we introduced the foundations of addition with numbers through 10. Students are learning about number bonds, which help them understand that two parts come together to make a whole.

TK students began their new Animals module! In this unit, they will explore animals' basic needs, how they protect themselves, and how some animals are born from eggs. In math, TK is learning to identify and describe shapes and their attributes.

Students need their lines memorized by Dec. 15th. When you reach your child's part s/he should practice reading the line(s) with expression and in an assertive tone.

# Fifth and Sixth Grade Classroom Mr. Burlingame

This week has been full of learning and excitement! In ELA, we continued reading *Bud*, *Not Buddy* and had some great discussions about the story's humor and deeper messages. Our class also enjoyed a wonderful field trip to Cowlitz Falls Dam, where students learned about local energy production and the importance of our natural resources. In math, 5th graders practiced multiplying decimals by 10, 100, and 1,000, while 6th graders explored positive and negative integers and learned how to compare them on a number line.

In social studies, students began learning about European expansion into the Americas and how those events shaped history. In science, we examined food webs and the delicate balance within ecosystems. To top it all off, students have been putting great effort into rehearsing for our upcoming play — their enthusiasm and teamwork have really brought it to life! It's been a productive and enjoyable week in our classroom.
