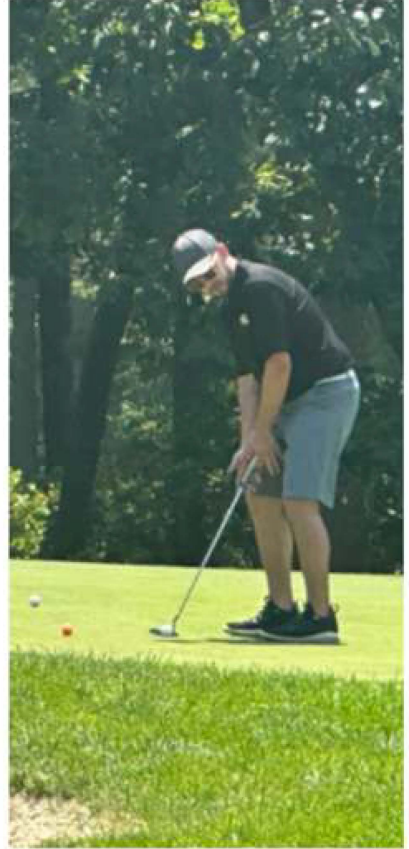

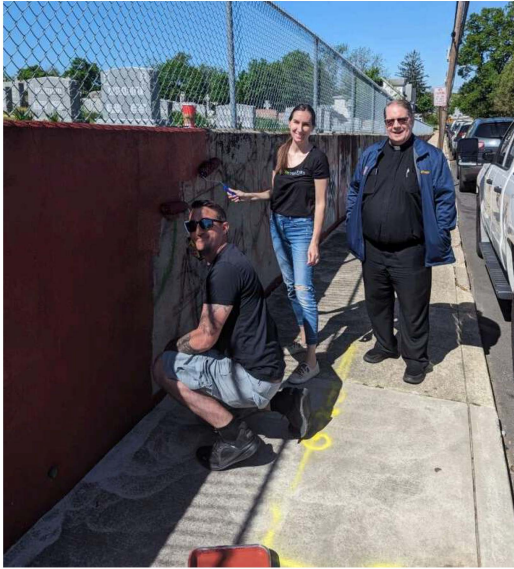


## Paulsboro Pride Neighborhood Plan Team Participates In The Paulsboro Community Cleanup

Gateway CAP's Twin Rivers Head Start hosted a variety of activities throughout May.

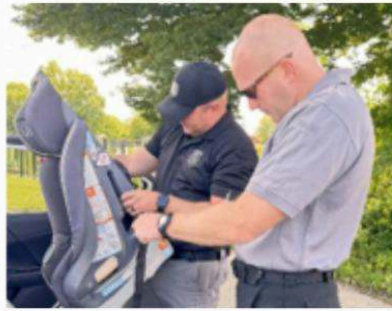
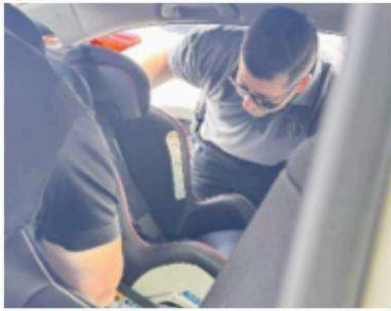
