



Questioned about the upcoming game, Senior Roy Stone states, "I'm really excited and ready to go ahead and get the game started."






While singing the national anthem, Brandon Lohota says, "I helped with the softball throw, and it felt good to help."




GONE IN SIX MINUTES


on the backdrop to make this graduation unique for these graduates.

The Conferring of Diplomas to the graduates was performed by Mr. Paul Hodge, Principal.






































- The Ohio State Buckeyes beat the heavily favored Miami Hurricanes in double overtime to win the BCS National Championship.


