

LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).






This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Happy Valley Elementary School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Happy Valley Elementary School District is \$1,593,828.94, of which \$1,201,686 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$129,704.24 is other state funds, \$208,245.70 is local funds, and \$54,193 is federal funds. Of the \$1,201,686 in LCFF Funds, \$17,195 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

This chart provides a quick summary of how much Happy Valley Elementary School District plans to spend for 2021-22. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

Happy Valley Elementary School District plans to spend \$1,614,000.68 for the 2021-22 school year. Of that amount, \$67,118.29 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$1,494,358.71 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following:



Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2021-22 School Year

In 2021-22, Happy Valley Elementary School District is projecting it will receive \$17,195 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students.
