42% of the class of 2022 (19 graduates) attended a 4-year college, 36% attended a 2-year or vocational college. and 11% entered the workforce. The remaining 11% joined the military.

Colebrook Academy administers the school day SAT exam. This exam was given in May to the Junior class. 35% met both the English and Math benchmarks, 52% met the English benchmark and 35% met the Math benchmark. In the fall 5 seniors participated in the SAT with 100% meeting both English and Math benchmarks. Juniors and five sophomores participated in the PSAT in October

At Colebrook Academy & Elementary School, both a weighted and unweighted GPA are calculated and recorded on students' transcripts. The weighted and unweighted GPA will also be noted on semester #1/quarter#2 and semester#2/quarter#4 report cards.

CAES follows a 4.0 GPA scale with added weighting for some courses. The un-weighted GPA is an average of grades on the 4.0 scale without any weighting added (SEE WEIGHTING OF GRADES SECTION BELOW). Courses are weighted depending on their degree of difficulty. If a student takes more challenging courses, the grades earned weigh more than the grades in less challenging ones.

Students are encouraged to select courses that stretch and challenge them. They should focus on performing well and achieving their best. They are reminded that more than "hitting a number" (having a certain GPA), they should prepare themselves academically and socially for whatever next step they pursue after graduation.

CAES uses the following algorithm to calculate the weighted GPA:
Average of GPA points, with credit value for each course considered,
divided by total number of credits attempted.

Dual Enrollment/Running Start Courses

Students can take courses for high school and college credits concurrently. Running start courses are taught by our teachers and have been credentialed by the community college system of NH. The current partnerships exist with White Mountains Community College and NHTI. For the 22-

23 year Colebrook Academy will be offering college composition, American Literature, Biology, creative writing, chemsitry, medical terminology, human biology, pc/mobile hardware, database design, programming with python, pc os security, Spanish III & IV, Intro to drawing, drawing with color, legal & ethical issues. Students can also earn college credit through NH's estart and Early College programs.

Career and Technical Education (CTE)

Students can attend the newly created North Point CTE center located in Colebrook. The center offers 5 programs: Automotive, Information Technology, Health Science, Hospitality/Culinary and Education. Juniors and Seniors also have the option to attend any of the 4 programs offered at the Canaan VT CTE center which include; Building Trades, Fire Services & EMS, Diversified Agriculture and Business. CTE is student-oriented and combines academic skills and technical knowledge necessary for success in today's workforce. Students can earn a variety of college credits as well as industry recognized credentials.
