Transportation Department Director Matthew Bryant

The Gadsden County School District's Transportation Department will be doing a no-cost 90-day Motive Trial to begin after April 1st. The trial will include 4 buses and 3 white fleet vehicles. This system will instantly detect risky behaviors, such as cell phone use and close following. It will deliver immediate feedback through audio and visual alerts. The system will only send true safety events for manager review.

Ensure drivers:

- Avoid being penalized for mistakes they didn't make.
- Focus on true safety concerns deserving your attention.
- Detect more risks through ongoing AI enhancements.

Motive touts the following Return on Investment (ROI) Safety: 57% Fewer accidents within four months Productivity: 34% Less time spent on manual processes Cost Savings: \$3.4 million annual accident, insurance and fuel costs saved in a fleet of 1000 vehicles (The district has approximately 100 buses and white fleet vehicles; therefore, this translates to approximately \$300,000 saving for the district.)

<u>Driver Training for All Exceptional Student</u> <u>Education Drivers/Bus Attendants</u>

Wheelchair Securement and Safety

This course will cover the differences among various types of wheelchairs and the correct ways to secure them to your vehicle and the importance of using the four-point tie-down securement system to ensure the safety of wheelchair users during transportation. After completing this course participants will have a comprehensive understanding of wheelchair securement and safety on school buses and be equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to provide safe and accessible transportation for all passengers.

Evacuation Planning for Students with Special Needs

This course will give the basic knowledge needed to create a unique plan for the bus and the children being transported. Student Restraint Safety Systems

The goal of this course is to provide school bus drivers with basic techniques for safe securement during transportation of students with special needs.

Talented Twenty Program

The Talented Twenty program supports efforts to better prepare students for life and work in the 21st century. The purpose of the Talented Twenty program is to guarantee admission to one of the 12 state universities for students who succeed in their respective K-12 public schools and to encourage students to strive for better grades and pursue rigorous academic courses. The program resources below provide information regarding the guidelines to determine students in the top 20 percent of their graduating class and the specifications they must meet to be eligible for the Talented Twenty program. A district has the responsibility of identifying the top 20 percent from each eligible high school's graduating class and must submit data for those meeting the required specifications.

To qualify for the Talented Twenty program, a student must:

- Be enrolled in a Florida public high school and graduate with a standard diploma.
- Be ranked in the top 20% of the class after the posting of seventh semester grades.
- Submit SAT scores from the College Board, or ACT scores from ACT, Inc., or CLT (Classic Learning Test) scores from Classic Learning Initiatives, LLC prior to enrollment to a university in the State University System (SUS).
- Meet the minimum SUS admissions eligibility requirements outlined in the Board of Gavernors Regulation 6.002 (PDF).

Volunteer Services & Families in Transition Services

- In collaboration with the Title I office, the department will be hosting our next Parent & Community Meeting
 on Thursday, April 10, 2025, at Havana Magnet School. There will be resources available from various
 departments, as well as multiple community partners & vendors to ensure our students and families are aware
 of the community services being readily available.
- Our Parent Liaisons' & Volunteer Coordinators' meeting was held on Monday, March 17, 2025. This afforded the department an opportunity to offer support to our schools' representatives, as well as brief them on the initiatives that are being implemented such as the Resiliency Coach training. We have (2) trusted individuals who have completed online training and are looking for at least (5) more to complete over the next month.
- The department is currently awaiting approval for a \$20,000 uniform order to ensure that we are adequately stocked to support our students and families. The department has been actively supporting the schools with the McKinney-Vento required presentation and ensuring staff are aware of the requirements needed to adequately support our students and families.

Truancy & Attendance Compliance Services

- Over the past month, there have been (2) attendance intervention meetings held throughout the district to support
 our students with attending school regularly, as well as assisting families with ensuring students have the
 resources to be successful.
- As we move into the last quarter of the school year, we will be collecting data to survey the interventions
 implemented throughout the year so that we have a path forward to support students, families and schools with
 attendance issues. This will include end-of-the-year notices, student attendance contracts, as well as enhanced
 relationship with local agencies to help prepare detailed reports that show the need for continued resources and
 interventions.

Home Education & Virtual Instruction Office

- We are continuing to enroll home education database, to include K12 and PAEC FLVS Franchise, whereas since 2/24/2025 there have been (7) letters of intent, (2) notice of terminations and (4) new enrollments in the PAEC FLVS Franchise.
- We are constantly providing insight and information to parents and schools on the process of home education & virtual instruction programs.

Action Steps:

- Working to develop climate surveys for students, parents, school/district staff, as well as community members
 to gather pertinent information to improve the services offered by the district to begin facilitating in May 2025.
- Plans for the end of the year recognition event is underway to ensure that we recognize those teachers and support staff who have exemplified outstanding achievement over the past year to be held in May 2025.
- Working with United Way of the Big Bend to kick-off our donation campaign, with the campaign period to be
 determined and implemented no later than the end of April 2025.
