

# #Elevate Our Goals for Student Achievement

## Academic District goals

- ✓ To increase the percentage of all students reading on or above grade level on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) by 3% and to close our subgroup gaps by increasing the percentage of students reading on or above grade level on GMAS for ELL, ED, and SWD by 6% for the 24/25 school year.
- ✓ To increase the percentage of all students performing at proficient or distinguished on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) by 3% and to close our subgroup gaps by increasing the percentage of students scoring at proficient and distinguished on GMAS for ELL, ED, and SWD by 6% for the 24/25 school year.

## School goals and focus areas

TMS will focus on improving GMAS Reading level scores by increasing the level of proficiency and showing .9 months of growth on the STAR Reading by the end of April. This will be accomplished by improving areas of focus in oral reading fluency in all grades, differentiated phonics in 6th grade, and reading comprehension in all grades.

## TMS will focus on improving reading levels and math proficiency on GMAS by:

- Focusing on oral reading fluency daily in ELA classes and increased non-fiction texts in science and social studies
- Focusing on differentiated phonics for 6<sup>th</sup> grade specifically
- Focusing on silent sustained reading during PAWS time weekly
- Teachers will offer tutoring during their planning periods and after school to work with students for remediation and/or acceleration in the areas of, but not limited to:
  - o Reading fluency and comprehension
  - Algebraic Patterning
  - Numeric reasoning
