

If you are unable to commit to campaigning to join the school board, there are still many opportunities for you to partner with RGSD. We are seeking student, parent, staff and community participation on various committees and sub-committees, the parent ambassador program, Parent University. People can also volunteer directly with the District or through one of our many supportive and essential community partners.

Lastly, I would like to welcome Paris French and Micah Long to the Special Administrative Board as student representatives. Thank you for your commitment to represent RGSD scholars on the school board. Student voice is essential to achieving and sustaining academic success.
